#### CONVENTION FEE

The Convention Fee is a flat charge of \$6 per person, payable before the 15th of March. Members joining after that date, or at the door, may have to pay a higher Convention Fee if the Committee finds that there are some costs we have not budgeted for.

The amount of \$6 for four days of entertainment over Easter in such good surroundings is remarkably cheap. Those people who assist the Committee by paying early will be assured of their membership at this low price.

Non-attending memberships may be had for \$2.

N.B. The Committee has limited the number of attending memberships to 150, and if this number is reached before the Convention, you may miss out.

## FILMS

Apart from the serial and the preview, films will include ASTERIX AND CLEOPATRA, FUTTOCKS END, NAVY VS NIGHT MONSTERS (based on Murray Leinster's Monster From World's End). It is also hoped to have YELLOW SUBMARINE, DRACULA and several TV episodes of current series.

#### CONVENTION PROGRAMME

Several changes will be made to the traditional structure of programming for science fiction conventions. For instance there will be latenight movies, on both Saturday and Sunday nights, for those who can do without sleep.

On Friday night there will be an introductory masquerade party. Lee Harding will be auctioned off to the highest bidder and as an added attraction the serial Flash Gordon's Trip To Mars will be screened on the Friday and Saturday nights.

The Original 1915 Kaiser Wilhelm Victory Band will be in attendance also.

There will be a formal banquet on the Saturday night after which the MSFC will announce its Achievement Awards and the winner of the movie award will also be announced. Following this will be the ever popular Paul Stevens Show.

On Sunday night there will be a special film programme where attendees will see a special PREVIEW FILM by courtesy of ROADSHOW DISTRIBUTORS & VILLAGE DRIVE-INS.


Also as an added incentive to 'live-in' members the committee has arranged for a cash bar to be available for the purchase of liquor on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights.
