Hotel Check-out time: 11 A.M. on Sunday




Level 1 - Gaming (also the pool, whirlpool, sauna and fitness room)

Schedule: Friday at 6 pm until Sunday at 2 pm



Jack McDevitt is a Philadelphia native. He has been, among other things, a naval officer, an English teacher, a customs officer, a taxi driver, and a management trainer for the US Customs Service.

He started writing novels in 1985 when Terry Carr invited him to participate in the celebrated Ace Specials series. His contribution was *The Hercules Text*, which won the Philip K. Dick Special Award. McDevitt has produced seventeen additional novels since then, ten of

which have qualified for the final Nebula ballot. Seeker won the award in 2007. In 2004, Omega received the John W. Campbell Memorial Award for best SF novel.

His most recent books are *Firebird* and *Echo*, both from Ace, and *Going Interstellar*, a Baen anthology on which he served, with NASA manager Les Johnson, as co-editor. *The Cassandra Project*, a collaboration with Mike Resnick, came out in November. McDevitt claims it will reveal the truth behind the Watergate break-in.

His other interests include chess, classical history, the sciences, and baseball.

He is married to the former Maureen McAdams, and resides in Brunswick, Georgia, where, assisted by the requisite German Shepherd and four cats, he keeps a weather eye on hurricanes.


Honor

Carl Frederick - Theoretically, I am a theoretical physicist. Even though I left the comforts of academia years ago, and haven't published in my field of Quantum Relativity for some time, I still think of myself as a physicist. Physics is not so much a field of employ as a way of life and perhaps even a religion.

Until recently, I worked as 'Chief Scientist' of a small high-tech company which operated from the little academic city of Ithaca, NY. I also worked as an astro-physicist at NASA's Goddard Institute. There, I was actually an experimentalist. I designed and built balloon-borne telescopes for making far-infra-red astronomical observations.

My training as an experimentalist was useful as it enabled me to design the world's first digital (1200 baud) modem, but I found I was unhappy in my role of captain of industry, or even of lance-corporal of industry, so I left my company, Wolfdata, and returned to Ithaca.

About a decade ago, I decided that I'd like to write Science Fiction. I've written a few novels and a respectable corpus of short stories. I'm a year 2000 graduate of the Odyssey Writers Workshop and a first place winner in the Writers of the Future contest. I've even put an interactive novel on the Web. It is interactive in that you can click to change the point of view and to expose sub-plots -



www.darkzoo.net, if you are interested.


I play Scottish bagpipes, I'm an epee fencer, and language is a hobby. I was a low-ranked Candidate Master in chess, and until my two sons outgrew it, I was a scoutmaster for a troop of high-ability, lunatic kids. I am a nut on animals and now, for the first time since grad school, again have a cat (who adopted me during one of my weekly volunteering sessions at our local SPCA).

I've given up on print publishing for my novels and have put just about everything (novels and shorter works) up for e-sale on Amazon/Kindle. But anyone reading this here can have any of my works for free. Just go the Amazon Kindle book store, search on 'Frithrik' (my old college nickname). Choose whatever works you'd like and e-mail me with your choices at carl@frithrik.com (Put WELF in the subject line to avoid my spam trap) and I'll e-mail you the works in Kindle/Mobi format.

Arie Bodek, University of Rochester George E. Pake Professor of Physics, received his BS and PhD in Physics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He was a postdoctoral associate at MIT and a Robert E. Millikan Fellow at Caltech. He served as chair of the University of Rochester Department of Physics and Astronomy from 1998-2007. Prof. Bodek was awarded the 2004 APS Panofsky Prize in Experimental Particle Physics "for his broad, sustained, and insightful contributions to elucidating the structure of the nucleon, using a wide variety of probes, tools, and methods at many laboratories". His doctorial thesis provided some of the evidence of the quark's existence that was the basis for the 1990 Nobel Prize in Physics. Prof. Bodek's research group is currently involved in experiments at both CERN/LHC and Fermilab — the CDF, CMS, andMINERVA experiments — and he is also the co-spokesperson of the Jefferson Lab JUPITER program.

Carolyn Clink's first SF convention was Fanfair 3 in 1973. She started writing poetry 10 years later. Her speculative poetry has appeared in Analog, ChiZine.com, Imaginarium, On-Spec, Star*Line, Tesseracts, and Weird Tales. She is one of two poetry editors at ChiZine.com and a member of the Science Fiction Poetry Association and the Algonquin Square Table poetry workshop. In 2011, she won the first Aurora Award for Best Poem/Song. She's been poetry Guest-of-Honor at seven science-fiction conventions, including EerieCon 3.

David Clink is the Board President of the Rowers Pub Reading Series. He has two poetry collections, Eating Fruit Out of Season (Tightrope Books, 2008), and Monster (Tightrope Books, 2010). David was the Artistic Director of the Art Bar Poetry Series (Canada's largest and longest running poetry-only reading series) for three years, and was the Artistic Director of the Rowers Pub Reading



Series its first three seasons. David edited *A Verdant Green* (The Battered Silicon Dispatch Box, 2010), a collection of environmental poetry. David most recently had 8 poems appear in <u>Tesseracts 14</u>: Strange Canadian Stories (Edge, 2010).


David was the 2002 Poetry Guest of Honor at EcrieCon. His website is located at www.poetrymachine.com

Dr. David DeGraff teaches Physics and Astronomy at Alfred University, where he uses science fiction short stories in most of his classes as a means of making the abstractions more concrete and to bring the distant locations closer to home. In addition to the usual physics and astronomy classes, he also teaches classes on science in science fiction, living in space, visions of the future, and the theory and practice of time travel.

James Alan Gardner writes science fiction and fantasy, novels and short stories. He has won the Theodore Sturgeon Memorial award for short stories and has twice been a finalist for the Hugo and Nebula awards.



Mark Garland read a copy of Arthur C. Clark's <u>The Sands of Mars</u> when he was twelve, and proceeded to exhaust the local library's supply of SF. Bookstores and magazines like *F&SF* and *Galaxy* came next, and he tried writing some stories of his own. Then he got interested in things like writing songs and playing in rock bands, building and driving race cars, and a long and convoluted career in service management, until finally he came full circle, back to science fiction and fantasy (and playing in rock bands!). He's spent the past two decades reading, going back to school, attending conventions, and writing. Published works include <u>Demon Blade</u>, <u>Sword of the Prophets</u> and two more Baen fantasy novels, two *Star Trek* novels (*Voyager* and *DS9*), a <u>Dinotopia</u> novel and more than sixty short stories, poems and articles.

Mark is also the Managing Editor of a regional specialty newspaper (cir. 50,000) and Executive Editor of specialty book publisher, Beerly Legible Press.

Mark lives in Upstate New York with his wife, a couple of kids and (of course) a couple of cats.

Lois H. Gresh is the New York Best-Selling Author times). Publishers Weekly Best-Selling Paperback Author, and Publishers Weekly Best-Selling Paperback Children's Author of 27 books and 50 short stories. Her books have been published in approximately 20 languages. Current books arc Eldritch Evolutions. Dark Fusions. 

Guest Biographies

Mark Leslie (born 1969) is a Canadian author of horror and spedulative fiction. He is author of the short story collection One Hand Screaming (2006), the editor of the anthology North of Infinity II (2006), Campus Chills (2009), and Tesseracts Sixteen, Parnassus Unbound (2012). His first novel, I, Death is coming in mid 2013 as is a second story collection called Nocturnal Visions. Marks first non-fiction book, Haunted Hamilton: The Ghosts of Dundurn Castle and Other Steeltown Shivers, came out in late 2012 and he is working on another true ghost-story collection called Spooky Sudbury. Mark lives in Hamilton, Ontario with wife Francine and their son Alexander.

Lynna Merrill is a writer, game developer and, 2D and 3D digital artist. She is the author of the young adult dystopian novel <u>Unnaturals</u> and the fantasy series *The Masters That Be* (<u>The Seekers of Fire, The Makers of Light</u>, and <u>The Weavers of Paths</u>). Together with her husband she is also the author of an Android game as yet unnamed as of the writing of this bio, but hopefully named and published as of Eeriecon. In the real world Lynna is a senior software developer and technichal lead, which means she tells other people how to write computer programs in additional to writing some herself. She lives by the southern end of Lake Ontario with her husband and soulmate, Alex

Dr. Alex Pantaleev is an Assistant Professor of Computer Science at SUNY Oswego. He wasted his youth on computer games and other computer-related activities. This turned out to be an excellent career choice, to the astonishment of well-meaning relatives. In addition to his participation in various open-source projects, such as the Google Web Toolkit, he is the proud creator of the first Bulgarian Massively Multiplayer Online Game-Imperia, a browser-based strategy game. Alex recently created a concentration in Game Development at SUNY Oswego, ushering unsuspecting students to a life of hard work that pays well. He is also a regular presenter at science fiction, fantasy, and gaming conventions.



John-Allen Price was born on August 19th, 1954 in Washington, D.C. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences from Bradley University in Peoria, Illinois, where he won the Pendell journalism award for his work on the school newspaper in 1977. His books include Doomsday Ship, Operation Night Hawk, Extinction Cruise A Mission For Eagles, The Pursuit Of The Phoenix, The Siege Of Ocean Valkyrie, and Phoenix Caged. His first SF novel, Mutant Chronicles II: Frenzy, was published in 1994. He has since completed work on a hard SF military adventure, Sail a Distant Sea, as well as his first non-fiction book The War that Changed the World, about the Franco-Prussian war.

Darrell Schweitzer - The author of The White Isle, The Shattered Goddess, and The Mask of the Sorcerer, and about 300 published stories. His 2008 novella, LIVING WITH THE DEAD as a book by PS Publishing and was nominated for a Shirley Jackson Award. He is a former editor of Weird Tales (19 years) and currently an anthologist, having edited, Cthulhu's Reign, The Secret History of Vampires, Full Moon City (with Martin Greenberg) and the upcoming That Is Not Dead. He has published books about H. P. Lovecraft and Lord Dunsany, interviewed dozens of writers over the past 39 years, and is a regular contributor to The New York Review of Science Fiction.

David Stephenson is a space physicist who came to Canada in 1970 and studied the aurora and winds in the high atmosphere at the University of Saskatchewan. In 1979 he moved to Germany to build systems for

a deep space probe. When the project was canceled he spent a year as a consultant to Lloyd's space insurance in London before returning to join the Geological Survey of Canada. When the government sent his file to the "downsized drawer" in 1996 he moved to the village of Merrickville near Ottawa. He also occasionally does some contract work for a hi-tech company in Ottawa.

His publications include twenty reviewed papers, commentaries in the Interdisciplinary Science Reviews, various articles and reports and the "Ulysses Speaks" satirical column in *Canadian Research*. 
