

EDITORIAL

First there is the planning. Then there is the running around in circles. And then, after the last party is over and the guests have all left, there is the evaluation. The Committee worked nine months to prepare for the Funcon. The question in our minds, of course, is "Was it worth it?"

But how does one rate the success of a science fiction convention? Attendance is one simple yardstick. The Funcon had 396 members, all told, with about 342 of them actually attending. That is about the size of a regular Westercon. We had more fans joining for one day only, though, and more members for whom this was the first convention. Another objective test is profit and loss. The Funcon made enough to provide a generous pass-on for next year's Westercon, and to make a substantial donation to the LASFS Building Fund.

But there are other, more subjective, signs that the Funcon was successful. Little things. There was always an elevator when you wanted one. The parties in the convention suite lasted until daylight every night, with never a complaint from the management. A clutch of neofans drawn by the convention's unaccustomed publicity have remained to join the LASFS. Our full program was, by and large, well attended. Further: its speakers, panels, and other scheduled events came off almost without change from our advance publicity.

The most important yardstick of a good convention though, is whether the attendees enjoyed themselves and came away with pleasant memories. From what we saw, there were few publishing fans there, but all the con reports we have seen so far have been favorable.

All of this indicates that the 1968 Funcon was a success. But was it enough of a success to be worth all the work that went into it? We can only conclude that many conventions are not, judging by the number of con committees that sink into gafia as soon as the con is over. Only the Baycon committee has survived the ordeal of putting on a Worldcon sufficiently well to undertake the task a second time.

Here then is our own moment of truth. The Funcon Committee has decided that the results did justify the efforts and has decided to remain together as the Westercon XXII bidding committee. We feel that the Funcon was a success in its own right. It was also an invaluable learning experience. With this background we expect to be able to put on the best Westercon ever. And we hope that we will see all of you in Los Angeles in 1969.
