## Vinge Wins Asimov

The recipient of this year's Isaac Asimov Memorial Award is Dr. Vernor Vinge. The Asimov Award is presented by the New York Science Fiction Society, the Lunarians, to some person who, in the opinion of the Lunarians, has contributed significantly to increasing the public's knowledge and understanding of science through his/her writings in the field of science fiction and science fact and who exemplifes the personal qualities, which made the late Dr. Asimov well-loved by those who knew him.

Dr. Vernor Vinge is the author of the Hugo-winning A Fire Upon the Deep, A Darkness in the Sky, and Rainbow's End. His Nebulanominated True Names is one of the few stories to get computers right. He is also Professor of Mathematics and Computer Sciences at San Diego State University. Recent articles have focused on the concept of technology reaching the points of creating superhuman intelligence, which he calls "The Singularity."
