The hotel pool and health club is open Friday and Saturday until 11:00 pm.

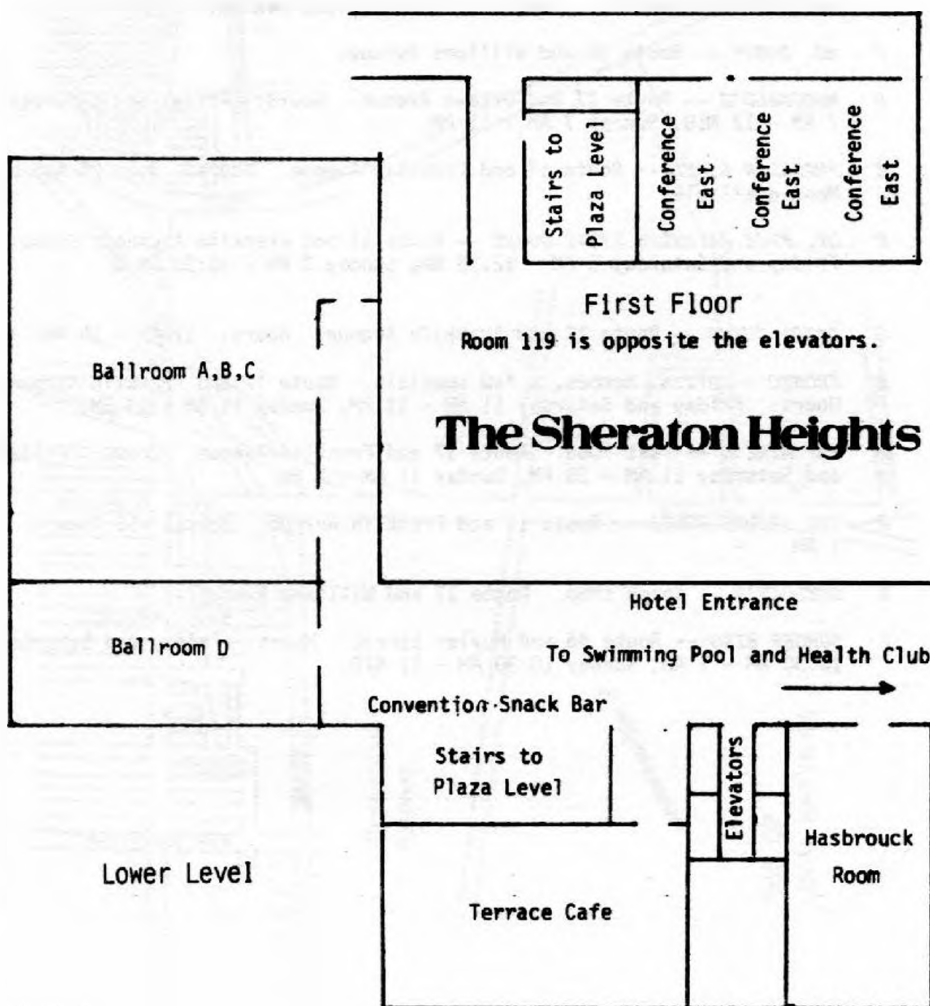
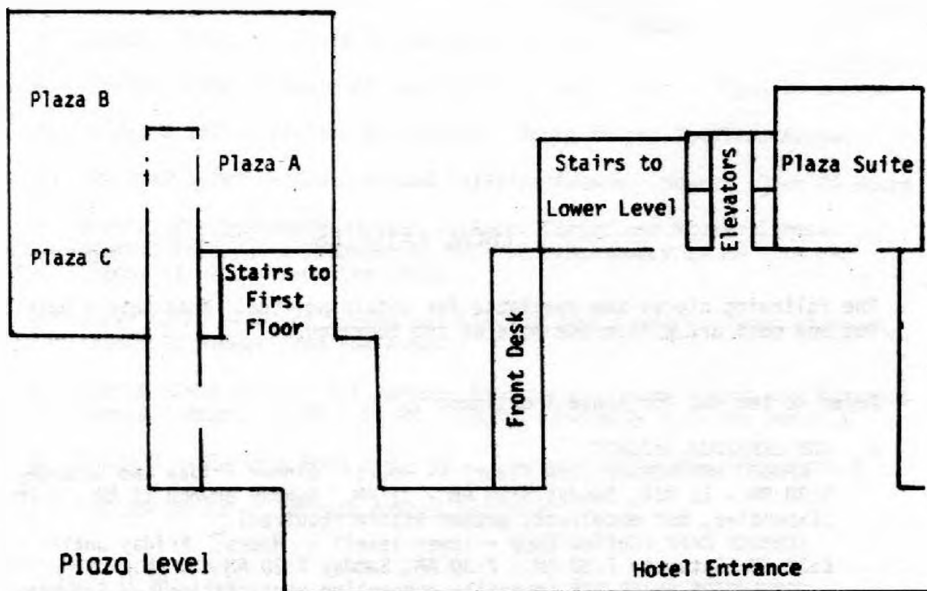

CONVENTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 — Smoking is permitted only in the designated section of the program rooms. Smoking is not permitted in the Art Show Room or the Dealer's Room
