Masquerade

The **Lunacon 2003** Masquerade will be held on Saturday night. It will start with a division for young fans (12 & under). These costumes can be made by the children themselves or by adults (Praise to Mommy!). A panel of experts using a system based on skill levels will judge adult costumers.

These divisions are Novice, Journeyman, Craftsman and Master levels. Photographs will be taken and made available for order on Sunday. Fan photographers are welcome as well.

Any costumes that include weapons of any kind have to receive prior approval of the Masquerade Director. Check the **Lunacon Weapons Policy** on this page. We openly encourage hall costumes with the following proviso: nudity is

NOT a costume and if your costume is a bit revealing, we ask that you cover yourself in the public areas of the hotel including the lobby, the hallways, the restaurants, the bar and even the assembly areas in front of the ballrooms. Panels on costuming and related topics will be included in the programming. Masquerade registration will be done on-site ONLY commencing sometime Friday and ending Saturday at 3 PM. Rules and entry

forms should be picked up as early as possible at the Masquerade Registration table. Weapons Policy

NO WEAPONS OF ANY KIND ARE PERMITTED
We reserve the right to refuse registration to anyone with a weapon in his or her possession. Anyone caught carrying a weapon during the convention will have his/her registration revoked immediately without a refund. A weapon is considered to be anything that is classified as a weapon under New York State law, anything designed to cause bodily injury or any replica of such an object, and anything deemed by the Committee to be dangerous. This includes any type of toy weapon. The Committee reserves the right to amend this definition of a weapon and to impound weapons for the duration of the convention. If your actions or behavior interferes with the other attendees' enjoyment of the Convention, this will result in revoking of your membership without refund as well. If you have any questions, feel free to ask us. Costumers take note of the above and remember as stated earlier, permission from the Masquerade Director is required to use a weapon in your presentation. Also, if you receive permission, transportation of the weapon to and from the Masquerade requires that it be carried in an opaque container such as a paper bag or black trash sack.

Child Care

When Mommy or Daddy wants to go off to Convention activities or events without the kids, we can help. **Lunacon** has once again arranged with a professional babysitting service to provide Child Care. The rate is \$7.50 an hour, up to a maximum of \$90 per child.

Children left in Child Care will be under adult supervision at all times. We will provide your child(ren) with juice and healthy snacks, but not meals. Parents are asked to provide us with toys, diapers, and anything else your child needs.

Tickets for Child Care will be sold in the Convention Office. Depending upon demand, tickets may also be available for purchase in the Child Care Room.

Pre-registering your child for Child Care as soon as possible would be a great help to us. Letting us know in advance helps us to plan adequately for service.

Reminder: During the Convention, **ALL** children must be registered with the Convention, and be in the **Lunacon** Child Care area or under the supervision of an adult at all times.

Staff

Lunacon is entirely run by volunteers. We depend on people like you to help make the Convention successful and your assistance can be used in all areas.

There is a particular need for help Thursday afternoon/evening for Convention move-in and Art Show set-up, and Sunday late afternoon/evening for Art Show tear-down and Convention move-out. Extra time credit will be given to anyone who helps out on either day. Work both days and we will love you.

Those of you who work a sufficient number of hours will receive a special t-shirt reserved for qualified staff only. Those who put in an exceptional number of hours will get our deep and heartfelt thanks and their membership refunded.

Our volunteers are provided throughout the course of the Convention with a Staff Den. It's the place to go for some relaxation and the occasional good, substantial, nutritious meal. You can sit, relax and eat real food.

All children must be accompanied by a responsible adult. A limited amount of babysitting service will be available during Convention hours. Please check the section on Child Care for more information.

Children over the age of 12 and under 18 are considered full Convention members, but must provide a parental release form waiving any liability of **Lunacon 2003** if they are attending unaccompanied.

Please fill out the enclosed Registration Form or download a copy from our website, and mail it with a check, money order or completed credit card information (including your signature) to the Convention address and mark it Attn: Registration. All checks or money orders must be drawn on a US bank and payable in US dollars to **Lunacon 2003**. DO NOT SEND CASH THROUGH THE MAIL. Please be advised that we will collect a \$20 service fee for each bounced check.

A receipt will be mailed to you. Please bring it or other form of identification that includes your address to **Lunacon** to help speed your way through the registration process. If you are buying your membership at the door, please have proper ID with you that includes your address. For your convenience, we also accept Visa and MasterCard.

Refunds will not be given, however a membership may be transferred upon receipt of a written request from the current holder of the membership.

Registration will be open during the following hours:

Friday 3 PM to 10 PM

Saturday 9 AM to 6 PM+

Sunday 9 AM to mid-day

Signs posted in the hotel lobby will direct you to **Lunacon** Registration.

Hotel Information

Lunacon 2003 will be held at the Rye Town Hilton, 699 Westchester Ave., in scenic Rye Brook, NY, in Westchester County, just north of New York City. The closest train station is the Rye stop on Metro-North's New Haven Line.

The hotel offers two on-site restaurants, an indoor pool, a health club, plenty of free parking and, of course, comfortable rooms. Special room rates (per night) for **Lunacon 2003** are:

\$104 for a Single

\$110 for a Double (one or two beds, subject to availability) or Twin (two double beds),

\$122 for a Triple (two double beds)

\$129 for a Quad (two double beds)

These rates do not include taxes, currently 9.75% which will be added to these rates.

The hotel accepts the following credit cards: American Express, Carte Blanche, Diners Club, Visa, MasterCard, JCB and Discover. Remember when registering, you should request smoking or non-smoking floors, and hosting a party, near the party, or away from the party areas. (Once again, please remember, all parties must be held in designated party areas only. Parties in other areas will be closed down.)

You may register by phoning the hotel at 914/939-6300 (try to avoid using the Hilton 800 number - it should work, but...).

Be sure to mention **Lunacon 2003** when registering.

If you wish to book your room on the web, do so by clicking on the special link on our website, or go directly to www.hilton.co/groups/lunacon2003/index.html. Please remember, when making your reservation, to indicate your room location preference (host-

ing a party, near the party, or away from the party areas) in the Special Comments section. No direct link to this web page exists from either the Hilton or Rye Town Hilton web pages. Should you make your reservation through either of these other sites, you will not be able to avail yourself of the special **Lunacon** rates.

The number of suites available are limited. If you are interested in obtaining a suite, please write or e-mail us (NOT the hotel). All suites **MUST** be booked through us. All suites in the hotel are assigned to and by the Convention. So please get your requests to us as early as possible.

Under the laws of the State of New York, no one under the age of 18 may be allowed to rent a room. An exception may be made if the minor's parent, guardian or another responsible adult accepts responsibility for all costs associated with the room. This is done by providing a signed and dated letter that includes a photocopy of both sides of a major credit card.

If you should have any problems making your reservations, please contact us immediately so that we can resolve the issue as quickly as possible.

There are a number of restaurants and other places to eat in the area, as well as several supermarkets and other stores to supply all your needs.

Directions

By Car

From the South: Take I-95 (New Jersey Turnpike/New England Thruway) north to Exit 21, Rye. Go west on I-287 (Cross Westchester Expressway) to Exit 10 (Bowman Avenue/Webb Avenue). Make a right at the second traffic light, then go three more traffic lights and turn left into the hotel entrance; or take I-87 (New York Thruway), or the Hutchinson River Parkway, or the Saw Mill River Parkway north to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expressway) to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester

Avenue. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance.

From the North: Take I-95 (New England Thruway) south to Exit 21 (Rye, Cross Westchester Expressway). Go west on I-287 (Cross Westchester Expressway) to Exit 10 (Bowman Avenue/Webb Avenue). Make a right at the second traffic light, then go three more traffic lights and turn left into the hotel entrance; or take I-87 (New York Thruway), or the Merritt Parkway, or the Saw Mill River Parkway, or I-684, or I-84 south to I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expressway) to Exit 10 (Routes 120, 120A, Port Chester). Stay to the left, following the signs to Port Chester. Go under the highway and you are on Westchester Avenue. At the fourth traffic light, turn left into the hotel entrance.

From the North and West of the Hudson River: All major highways intersect with I-87 (New York Thruway). Go east on I-87/I-287 over the Tappan Zee Bridge and stay on I-287 east (Cross Westchester Expressway) and continue as above under "From the South."

By Rail

Take the Metro-North New Haven Line Local from Grand Central Terminal to the Rye Station. The hotel will be running a complimentary shuttle service to and from the station, coordinated with the train schedule. A taxi from the train station to the hotel is currently about \$12.

As an alternative, take Metro-North to the Port Chester station, where a taxi will cost less than \$12. The Port Chester station is not handicap accessible on the East Bound (from New York) side. The #13 Westchester bus, exact fare only, runs from the Port Chester station past the hotel on Westchester Avenue.

By Bus

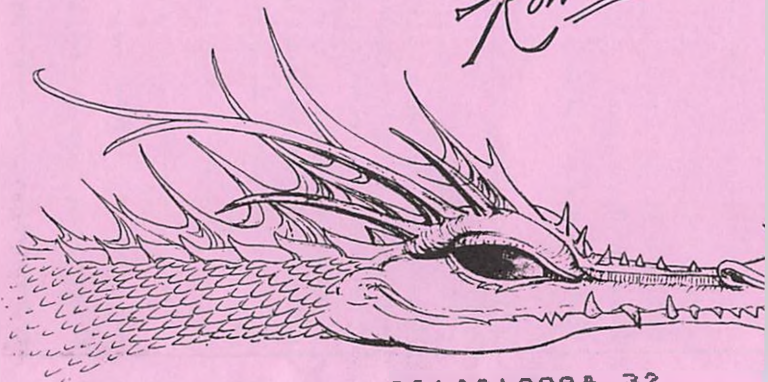
