CHILD CARE



THE OFFICIAL MINICON ART SHOW RULES!

Hanging Fees are the same as last year:

\$. 50 per individual piece of art work hung or displayed. This includes prints. Only one copy of each print is to be allowed into the Art Show this year, and they must be limited edition prints, individually signed and numbered by the artist.

Sketch table art is displayed free. This art will be sold by direct sale only and must have a maximum price of \$15.

Commissions to Minicon are also the same as last year:

15% on all auctioned work or any sold for Quick Sale Price.

10% on all work sold from the sketch table.

- There will be two auctions: One on Saturday night and one early Sunday afternoon.

 The first bidder will select the auction in which the piece is to be sold.
- All art with two or more bids will be auctioned. Items with only one written bid will be sold to the sole bidder after the auction that bidder has chosen.
- There will be a Quick Sale Price on the bid sheet. This is the price the art can be sold for only if no written bids have yet been made. No art will be sold for the Quick Sale Price before noon Saturday. The artist is not required to put down a Quick Sale Price, nor does this price have to be the same as the Minimum Bid.
- There will be no selling of art work for Minimum Bid after the last auction. At this time, pieces will be available for Quick Sale Price only. Pieces with no Quick Sale Price written on the bid sheet will not be available for sale at this time.
- The hanging fees cover cash prizes which will be presented to the winners of several categories. These will be announced at the convention. There will also be a most popular and a grand prize awarded.
- Hanging space will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Art not hung will have table space. There is also a display case for small sculpture and jewelry. Art may be rearranged by the Art Show staff at their discretion.

- Security will be provided by the Minicon staff while the Art Show is open, and by hired guards at night. There will be a badger with a check table and orders to allow no cameras or large bags/packs into the Art Show room. There will also be a member of the Art Show staff in the room while it is operational.
- Unless arrangements are made prior to the convention (at least a week in advance), for payment to the artist at the convention, checks will be made out and mailed during the week following the convention. The same also pertains to cash payments—we need at least a week's warning, if at all possible.
- Art not picked up at the convention will be returned to the artist during the following week. If hanging fees and postage/insurance money have not been sent by the artist and final sales have not covered these costs the artist will be notified during this week

Please insure it, and enclose a note saying whether it should be returned to you by mail or if it will be picked up at the convention. No art will be given to anyone without authorization by the artist. All art picked up at the convention must be picked up by 4:00 pm Sunday.

- Art check in is after 12:00 noon Friday. The Art Show will be open to Minicon attendees 5pm to 8pm Friday, 10am to 7pm Saturday, and 10am to 12 noon on Sunday. Art may be checked in during open hours Friday and Saturday.
- Art bid on may be picked up any time after the auction (for pieces that do not go to auction) or during/after the auction (for pieces auctioned).
- The committee reserves the right to be arbitrary as to hanging space, auction category, or anything else. If you have problems, questions, or desires, please let us know and we will try to solve them for you. Nothing can be done if you don't.
- Control sheets, bid sheets, and further copies of this flyer are available from the Art Show chairperson at the above address. I will also answer any queries you have, or at least try to.

MAP, or How to Get Here from There

From 94 going west: exit onto 6th St., west to Wacouta, Wacouta south to Kellogg Blvd., Kellogg west to Wabasha.

From 94 going east: exit onto 10th St., east to St. Peter St., St. Peter south to Kellogg Blvd., Kellogg east to Wabasha.

From 494 going east: 494 turns into Hwy. 5, exit to Shepard Road, east to Chestnut, Chestnut north to Hill, Hill east to Kellogg (runs into Kellogg), Kellogg east to Wabasha. You may also stay on Hwy. 5, which becomes 7th St., and take that to St. Peter St. There are lots of stop lights along this route, however.

From 35E: exit onto Wacouta, south to Kellogg, west to Wabasha.

PARKING

- A. Radisson Ramp: Wabasha St. between Kellogg Blvd. and 4th St. \$1.00 first hour, 35¢ each 2nd-5th hours, \$5.50/day.
- B. Victory Ramp: 344 Wabasha St. 75¢ first hour, 50¢ each additional hour, \$2.00 maximum after 6 PM and leave by 7 AM, \$5.50/24 hours.
- C. Garrick Ramp: 6th St. and St. Peter St. Rate information not available at this time.
- D. Dayton's Ramp: 6th St. and Cedar. 50¢ first hour, 25¢ each additional half hour, \$4.50 daily maximum.
- E. 1st Bank Ramp: 5th St. between Robert and Minnesota. 50¢ first half hour, \$1.00 each additional hour or fraction thereof, \$8.00 daily maximum.
- F. Jackson Ramp: 345 Jackson St. \$8.00 maximum for 24 hours.

There are also a few outdoor parking lots, the largest one located next to Daytons between Wabasha and Cedar.

All rates subject to change.

The Amtrak railway depot is in the Midway District between downtowns Minneapolis and St. Paul. Taxi service is available. You can also take a #16A MTC bus east on University Ave. to downtown St. Paul. The bus costs 60¢, or 75¢ during rush hours (no change given). The Twin City International Airport has bus, limousine and taxi service. There is a limousine that goes directly to the hotel from the airport. A Greyhound Bus Depot is located at 9th and St. Peter streets in St. Paul (see map).

ART SHOW

Will be open Friday through Sunday, with auctions on Saturday night at 11 p.m. and Sunday at 12 noon. The room is large and well-lighted, with pegboard for hanging pieces. WEAPONS POLICY

- 3. Lasers are permitted if they belong to Class one or Class two as defined by the Bureau of Radio-logical Health.
- 4. In order to avoid disturbing our cetacean members, no Nukes!!!

Peace-bonding, as practiced by the Society for Creative Anachronists, is recommended for edged weapons. It is the practice of tying a blade into the sheath with twine or a ribbon. This prevents others from drawing your blade and reduces the temptation to draw it yourself in locations and situations where it is not appropriate.
