






Lust World: where exotic belly dancers taunt and beguile you with the mysteries of the flesh. My ghod!? How did s/he engineer that?!


There are many ways to get there:

There's the way of the Sufi: but that's secret.



There's the scenic route: i.e., you're starting from south Minneapolis, you have several weeks with nothing better to do (it's January in Minnesota) and you decide to set out early and visit every fan you know on the continent\*, carefully timing your journey to arrive in Bloomington by March 28-30.

Then there is the "normal" way: follow this map, consult TruFan for the names of ride supplicants, load up your car, and drive to the con.


