The Art Show

The Art Show will be held in the same large room as the hucketering area. Entries will be accepted starting March 18, 1970, and during the first day of the convention for the convenience of out-of-town entrants.

All entrants must assume responsibility for the delivery and pick-up of their own work. An entry fee of 50 cents per piece will be charged.

Four prizes will be awarded: Best of Show, plus two honorable mentions, to be awarded by the judges; and a prize for the Most Popular in Show, to be determined by ballot of the convention membership.

Any type of art -- painting, drawing, prints, or sculptures -- showing some relationship to science fiction or fantasy may be submitted. All work will be juried by the judges, and any work not accepted will be returned, together with the entry fee, after the show.
