The New Navigation

Finding your way around Minicon 30...

Three weeks before the convention started, just as we were wrapping up details (putting the ribbon on Minicon, as it were), the Radisson notified us that the Bloomington fire marshal just set an occupancy limit of 200 people on the newly-remodeled 22ND floor. *How many people do you think are in the Minicon consuite at peak times?* Our guesstimates varied by several hundred, but even the lowest guess – about 300 or 350 – convinced us that we needed a new location.

That's why you'll find the Minicon 30 consuite on the 1ST and 2ND floors at the far end of the pool. Each room has a patio, and is accessible from the patio side or the back hall. On Sunday, during Easter Brunch, please enter the consuite from the back hall only. The patios outside downstairs consuite rooms will also be closed during that time...

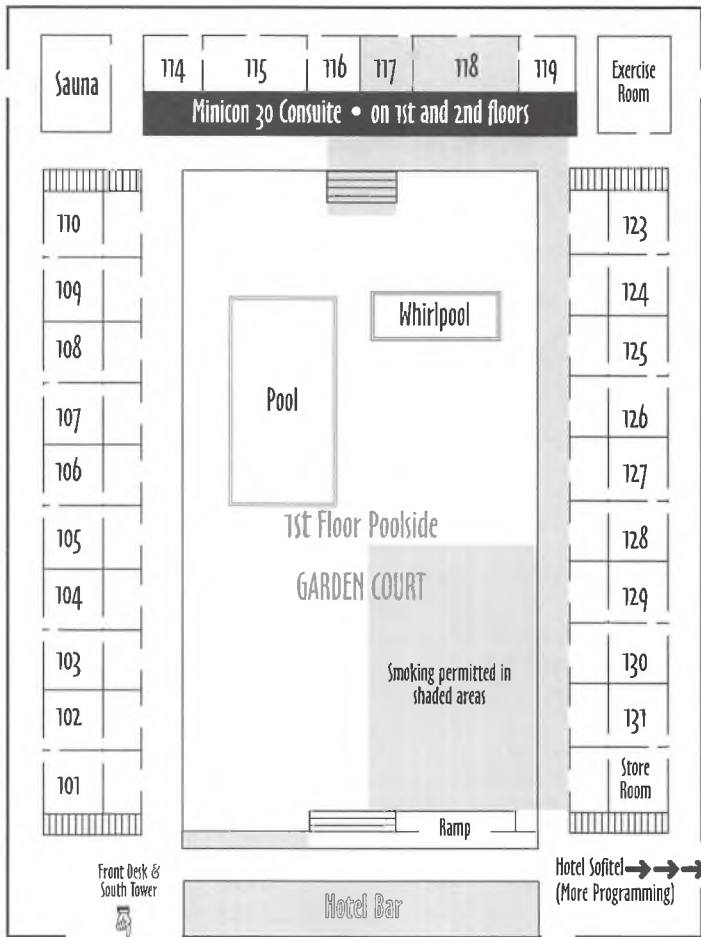
The maps on the following pages show the locations of other Minicon functions, including *two rooms of programming in the Hotel Sofitel*. (And you thought a "minicon" was a small convention!) Several literary and science program items are scheduled for the Sofitel. Also, the shaded areas on the maps show where smoking is permitted under the Minicon 30 Clean Indoor Air project.

Access to the 22ND floor may be limited at peak times, but we hope to keep this to a minimum. There will be an express elevator, so it should be comparatively easy to get to parties (or your sleeping room) on high floors. We expect both staircases to open on all sleeping floors this year for better traffic – check first and climb safely!
