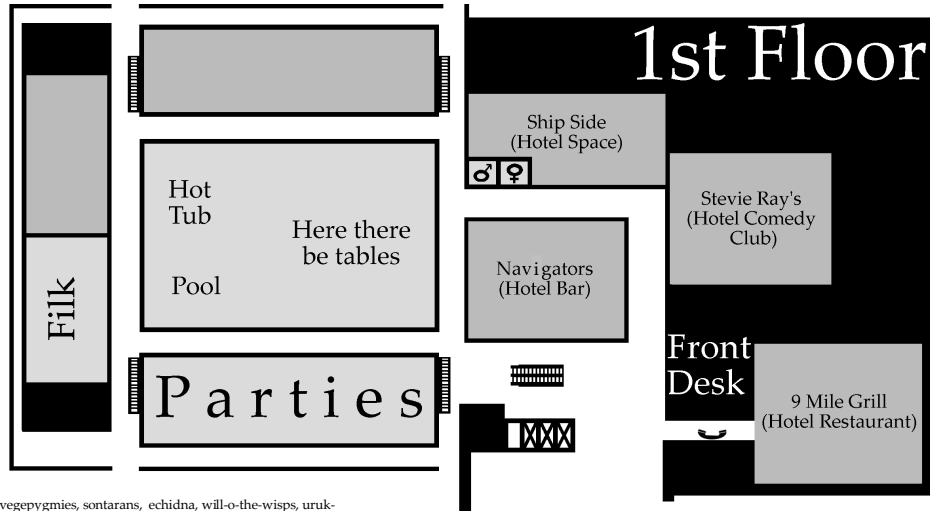
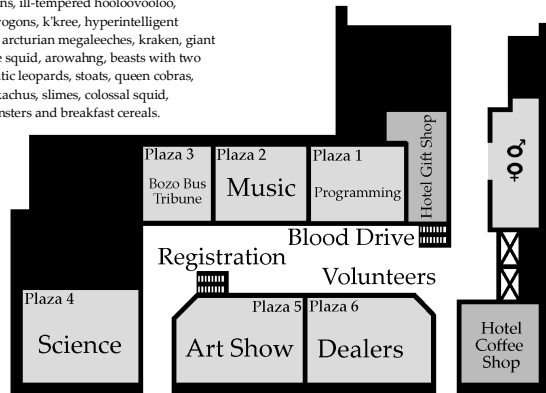


Here there be dragons.

### About Minn-Stf\*

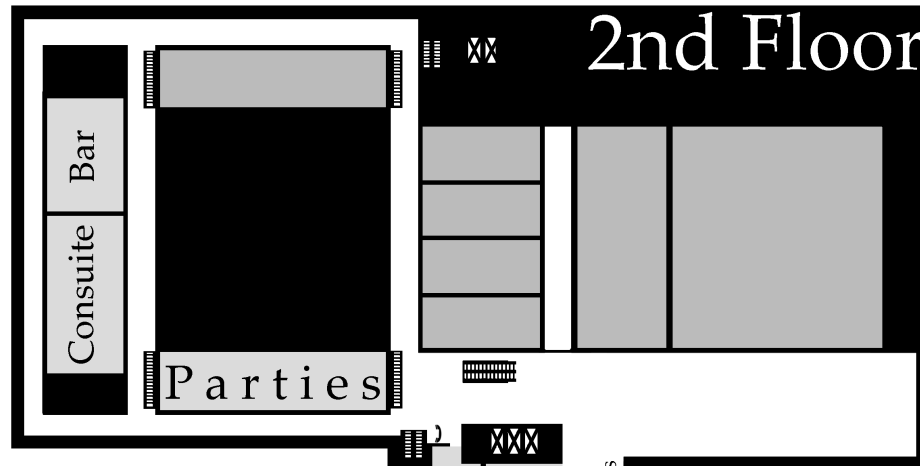
