We've got lots to keep you busy and we've laid it all out for you, hour by hour. But while you peruse these pages, don't forget these ongoing activities, which follow a longer schedule:

Scavenger Hunts—Look or scavenger hunt sheets by registration/info desk. Turn in a completed sheet to the Info Desk to get a Detcon1 ribbon.

Paint & Take Minis, run by Dean and Linda Martelle, will be held on a drop-in basis in 42North. Event Pricing is 1 free plastic mini per person per day; metal miniatures are \$6 each. Hours for Paint & Take Minis are: Th 4pm-8pm, Fri 12noon-5pm, Sat 12noon-5pm and Sun 11am-2pm.

The TCIF3/Detcon1 Film Festival runs during most hours that Detcon1 is open; you can find them on the 1st floor retail area. Short summaries are included in the pocket program; for more detail, consult the printed list at the Info Desk or the Film Festival room.

Gaming—Also on the 1st floor retail area is the Gaming Room, run by U-Con Gaming Convention. Open gaming hours are Th 3pm-2am, Fri 10am-2am, Sat 10am-2am, and Sun 10am-2pm. For scheduled games and demos, check the online schedule, printed gaming schedules, and posted updates.

Birds of a Feather—We have one roundtable (seats 10) available for Birds of a Feather programming. Want to host a discussion? Sign up your topic for a timeslot in the BoF book at the Info Desk. Want to join a BoF discussion? Sign up for a seat at the table in the BoF book at the Info Desk (or show up and see if there's room). Want of find out about a BoF? Watch the newsletter and our social media for announcements. #detcon1bof (NOTE: ALL BoF topics proposed must be public events that we may advertise on social media and/or in the newsletter. Private groups should find private spaces.)

Getting Around

The Renaissance Center is an architectural marvel, but can be a little tricky to navigate. Please see the maps on page 28-29 for a visual overview of the space.

Navigating To Detcon1 Function Spaces

We are using the 3rd and 5th floors of the Marriott for programming, and the 1st floor of the Renaissance Center. Within the Marriott you can move between levels using the main elevator bank or the side escalators. All 12 elevators go to the function space floors, but sleeping room access is divided between a high bank and a low bank. Use the high bank to access the Consuite and Party floors. If you are moving between 3 and 5, we recommend using the escalators whenever possible to reserve the elevators for those who cannot.



follow signs to Beaubien Parking.

Food Court

• If you can navigate 3 steps & escalators: Take the main elevator bank to the 1st floor. On one end of the axis of the elevator bank, you will see the Marriott Motor Lobby—proceed in that direction. Before you reach the lobby, turn right at the brick paved "Inner Circle". Turn right and walk around the circle. You will reach three steps which will lead you to an escalator to Level A. The food court is at the bottom of the escalator.

If you cannot navigate stairs & escalators: Take the main elevator bank to the 1st floor. Follow signs to Level 200 Elevator. Take it to Level A and follow signs to Food Court.

People Mover & Skywalk to Millender Center/ Courtyard

• The People Mover is located on Level 2 of Tower 200.

If you can navigate 3 steps & escalators: Take the main elevator bank to the 1st floor. On one end of the axis of the elevator bank, you will see the Marriott Motor Lobby—proceed in that direction. Before you reach the lobby, turn right at the brick paved "Inner Circle". Turn right and walk around the circle. You will reach three steps which will lead you to an escalator to Level 2. Follow signs to People Mover or Skywalk.

If you cannot navigate stairs & escalators: Take the main elevator bank to the 1st floor. Follow signs to Level 200 Elevator. Take it to Level 2 and follow signs to People Mover.






