## Program

While we wouldn't go so far as to say that the program is the most important part of a convention, it is a key component, and we would like the NorthAmericon program to be a memorable one. To that end, we are scheduling what we think is a balanced blend of talks, panels, readings, and the like devoted to the different types of SF and fantasy, and also to fandom itself. We're going to break with tradition just a bit by offering a few more single-speaker program items than is usual. The main reason for this is to enable both the speaker to get his own point across more effectively and the audience to give him (or her; we certainly don't intend to be sexist!) its undivided attention. Too often we've seen panel discussions with half a dozen participants, none of which really getting to say much. Maybe we can do something about that. Which is not to say we're

eliminating panels entirely. We will have some, especially in those areas where a difference of opinion can be quite illuminating to both sides.

The major program blocs (banquet, Belle cruise, and masquerade) are discussed elsewhere in this PR, but there's still plenty of activity going on.

We're planning the film program to be largely a night-time feature. Films will be shown in the Archibald Room from the time of the last program there in the evening until the audience and/or the projectionist tires out toward dawn. We have an alternative daytime program room which will show continuous video tapes and an occasional feature film to supplement the night-time films. Schedules for these will be posted around the hotel and will be published in the daily newsletter.

Our program of author readings is being planned by Gale Burnick, who has done so well with that at other conventions.

By the time our final progress report is sent out in July, we should be able to give you a tentative program schedule, complete with times, titles, and participants. It's still not too late to offer any suggestions you might have for NorthAmerican programming, though, and those ideas are always welcome.

## Masquerade

The NorthAmericon masquerade will be held Saturday evening, Sept. 1, at 7:30 in the Archibald Room of the Galt House. Seating will be on a first come, first served basis. Judges will be a select panel of costume- and character-knowledgeable pros and fans.

Information sheets and entry forms will be available at the Registration Desk at all hours. To be eligible for masquerade participation, you <u>must</u> turn in a completed entry form by 5:30 Saturday evening (No Exceptions!).

Maximum clearance height of doorways into the Archibald Room is 7' 10". If your costume is any taller than this, please make sure that it is removable/demountable so you can get into the room. Access to and egress from the stage will be by ramp...there will be no stairs to climb. A number of microphones and special lighting effects will be available. We look forward to a masquerade that will be innovative, imaginative, and fun!

#### Hotel

Our hotel, the Galt House, is Louisville's finest and most spacious convention facility. We think you'll like its combination of 19th Century charm and elegance and completely modern efficiency. All the convention space is concentrated on two floors, and there are four high-speed elevators to take you to your room and back. If you are bringing your car to NorthAmericon, you won't have to worry about parking it: a 1600-car underground garage adjoining the hotel offers free parking for Galt House guests.

Since we expect to fill all the hotel's 700-plus lavish rooms, we have arranged for a flat room rate of \$35.00 per night for either single or double occupancy. (If you choose to register for more than a double, the additional charge is \$5.00 per person per night.) The Galt House is now accepting reservations; cards have been sent to all pre-registered members. Or you may telephone the Galt House reservation desk at 502-589-5200. Before your room can be confirmed, however, the hotel does require one night's deposit.

## Art Show

These rules apply to <u>all</u> entries; please read them carefully before submitting any art. Due to limited space at the Galt House, persons wishing to submit art <u>must</u> reserve panel space in advance and payment in full must accompany reservation. At-the-door entries will be subject to space availability.

- 1. All entries must be original work of a science fiction, fantasy, or fannish theme.
- 2. Full name, address and phone number must be <u>printed</u> on <u>back</u> (or attached to 3-D work) of each piece submitted, including sketch table art. Do not use nicknames--these may not be recognized by Art Show Staff and artist may not get paid for art sales.
- 3. Entries do not have to be matted or framed; however, they must be neat, clean and ready for display. Glass is not required in frames. We reserve the right to remove sloppy work from the art show!
- 4. Art may be of any medium, including photography. Size must be limited to fit a 4'x8' panel. Because of space limitations, we will not accept any wall-sized art. This is an <u>art show--no art-oriented huckster</u> items will be allowed in the art show proper. (Items not allowed: T-shirts, posters, prints, mass-produced jewelry, etc.)
- 5. The art show staff reserves the right to reject any entries which do not comply with these rules or meet the standards of this show.
- 6. Postage and insurance, and copyrights are the <u>artist's</u> responsibility. Art will not be returned if return postage is not included. Unsold art which has not been picked up by the artist or an agent will be considered the property of the art show until such time as provisions have been made for its return.
- 7. Sketches and minor works may be sold from the sketch table. There is a \$2.00 entry fee for sketches. All sketches must comply will Rule #2. If sketches are not numbered and have no information on the back, the art show will not be held responsible for mistaken sales. An art show control sheet <u>must</u> be completed for any items placed in the art show.
- 8. The art show will collect a 15% commission on all sales, with 85% going to the artist.
- 9. Entries may be displayed NFS (not for sale).
- 10. Artists do not have to be fans, belong to an organization, or be members of the convention; the latter, however, is encouraged.
- 11. These rules and other art show information may be copied and given to other interested artists, reproduced for publication, and otherwise used to pass along information. Xerox or other copies of the art show forms are acceptable for entrance to the show.
- 12. All art must be checked out by authorized art show staff. No art may be removed from the art show prior to the close of the last art auction. If you will be unable to remain for this last auction, make arrangements for the pick-up of your art or be sure you have included return postage for the art to be mailed to you.

13. Registration Fee: Panel Fees: \$5.00 per artist (fan or pro) \$5.00 per one (1) 4'x4' panel

\$15.00 per one (1) 4'x8' panel or two (2)

4'x4' panels.

Limit Two 4'x8' Panels Per Artist

Due to severe space limitations, we must restrict panel sales in this manner.

14. Deadline: Depending on panel sales, art brought to the convention on Thursday, August 30, 1979, will be entered as panel space is available.

15. Artwork may be mailed to the address indicated below. Do not mail artwork to a P.O. box number or to the Galt House. The art show will not be responsible for art that is undeliverable. If you mail or ship your work, be sure to allow for enough time to reach the indicated address. Art which is received after August 20 may not arrive in time to be entered in the art show. Mail all artwork to:

- 16. Every precaution will be taken to prevent loss or damage of any art show entry. However, we cannot assume responsibility for any damage caused in mailing or shipping. Wrap art securely and with sturdy cardboard to prevent bending. UPS is often better on packages than the U.S. Postal Service. Do Not Mail or Ship Glass.
- 17. At this time, we are not sure if there will be provisions for 3-D artwork. If you have this type of art, please make your own arrangements for the display of it. If your 3-D work is fairly large and sturdy, there will be tables available.

Important Note: Select your best work. Please do not send more art than the space you have reserved. There is no storage space available and the art show will not assume responsibility for overage. In order to give everyone a fair chance to have something in the art show, please be conservative and selective in your submissions.

#### ENTRY FORM REQUIREMENTS & OTHER INFORMATION

- 1. Send a large (9"x12") envelope, self-addressed and stamped, to receive entry forms, ID tags, and more copies of these rules, if desired. Due to postage increases, requests for forms, etc., not accompanied by return postage will not be honored. Please help us out on this; 30¢ is not going to break you.
- 2. Entry forms and ID tags may be Xeroxed or otherwise copied if extras are needed.
- 3. List <u>all</u> entries on one art control sheet until it is filled, then use a second sheet if necessary. This includes sketches; if you have both original art and sketches, use a separate sheet for each category. Do Not Write on Back of Art Control Sheet.
- 4. All entries must have a title of some kind. "Painting #9" can get confusing if four people have four "Paintings #9." To avoid mistakes in recording and eventually in paying, title each piece.

Please Be Neat. Type or print all information in ink. Sloppy, unreadable forms will be disqualified. This applies to all forms, ID tags, etc.
 On pricing your work: Be realistic. Choose the lowest sum you are willing to accept for a minimum bid; chances are it will be bid up at the auction.

Immediate Purchase Option: All bid sheets have a space for "Immediate Purchase Price." This option is left to the artist. This price should be higher than your minimun bid. If someone wishes to purchase your work for the "Immediate Purchase Price," they may do so at any time during the art show, unless there is a previous bid on the work. If a bid has been recorded, the piece must go to auction.

- 7. Auction times will posted at the convention.
- 8. Publication rights may or may not be sold with the art; this is up to the individual artist and must so be indicated on the back of each piece. The art show will not be responsible for mistaken sale of rights if indication on the back of each piece is not absolutely clear.
- 9. If work has already been published, is owned by someone else, or has been used in any way, this information <u>must</u> be indicated on the back of each entry.
- 10. Sketches must be titled and numbered and that information listed on an art show control sheet. If you wish to add sketches during the convention, this information must be recorded on your control sheet.
- 11. Bid sheets will be available at the convention. A bid sheet must be completed and attached to the bottom of each piece, including NFS items.
- 12. No one is allowed in the Art Show Room while the art is being hung except art show staff and artists/agents who are hanging their work. Please, no interested by standers until the art show officially opens.
- 13. The art show staff reserves the right to inspect attache cases, portfolios, open packages, large purses, etc. going in and out of the art show. Security guards will be posted at the entrances and will be roving about the room. Please help us out and leave the above items in your room.
- 14. Artists may not leave empty portfolios, packing materials, personal belongings and other paraphrenalia in the Art Show Room. We accept No Responsibility for items left on or near the check-in desk "just for a moment," or elsewhere in the room.
- 15. All photographers, please check with the art show staff before you photograph any work. Due to copyrights, many artists do not allow their work to be photographed. Please respect their wishes. You must obtain written permission from the individual artist authorizing you to photograph their work, or have them in attendance with you at the time.
- 16. A note to artists concerning the news media: News coverage of the convention and photography of the art show in connection with such news coverage is not an infraction of copyright. The news media will be allowed to take video coverage of the art show. If you do not wish your work to be filmed in any manner, you must be responsible for removing it from the show, or covering it with a hanging.
