DENVER WINS!!! Denver in '81 (Denvention II) won the 1981 World Con bid at Seacon.. The announced Pro GoHs are Clifford Simak and C.L. Moore. The Fan GoH will be Rusty Hevelin with Edward Bryant as MC. The headquarters will be the Denver Hilton. In other Worldcon business, the rotation change was beaten. Seacon's total registered membership was 5079 with 3199 attending, over half of them Americans.

BLOOD DRIVE: The NorthAmerican Blood Drive starts at 9:30 AM on Saturday; the Red Cross asks you to register with a pledge card which is available at the Con Registration desk. Plan on coming early and avoiding the rush. Remember, with only 16 tables, a long wait will result from a late rush.

NAME BADGES: Please wear your NorthAmerican name badges at all times when you are in the hotel. This is especially important if you want to enter either the Art Show or the Huckster Room. Door guards for these two rooms have been instructed not to admit anyone without a NorthAmerican Badge. Because of the International Heritage Festival on the Belvedere this weekend, the Galt House security staff is going to be particularly alert about non-hotel/non-convention members entering the hotel. Make sure you have either a room key or a NorthAmerican Badge with you when you leave the hotel.

By special arrangements with the hotel, the pool will be open with lifeguards on duty until 1 AM. Local law requires a lifeguard on duty at public pools, so NO SWIMMING AFTER 1 AM (sorry).

GENERAL: Almost all programming in MAYORS, GENERALS, COMMISSIONERS, QUEENS, KINGSHEAD, DORSET, CORNISLAND, and ANCHOR Rooms is "Special" Programming. These programs are primarily participant run; the convention provides little more than time and space.

DISCUSSION AND SIMILAR GROUPS: There will be a sign-up sheet posted on the wall between ANCHOR Room and the telephones. Simply put your name on the line and, if you volunteer it, your room number. Also put down the time you want. If the discussion is large enough, we will allocate a function room, if available. If you volunteer to lead the group, note that too--and if you do get in charge, please come by the ANCHOR and get a handout with hints on running discussion groups.

TAKE-A-PRO-OUT: We will continue taking requests to start new groups thru late Thursday night. If we get 4 written requests for any pro (orBNF) we will see if they are available and what their choice is -lunch, brunch, bar, snacks, whatever. Up to 10 fans can then "take out" their favorite pro, paying for their meal/snack/etc., as well as the pros meal. **FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED.** After the first ten requests, a waitlist will be started. Waitlisters should show up at the established cutoff time to see if an opening developed.

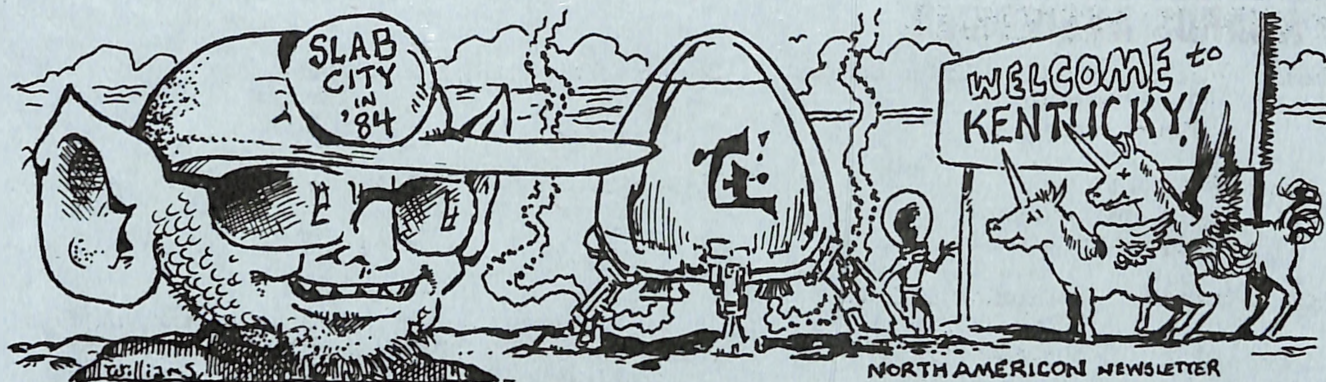
There are also convenient spaces on the top row of string boards in entrance to COCHRAN Room (artshow) for party announcements specifically.

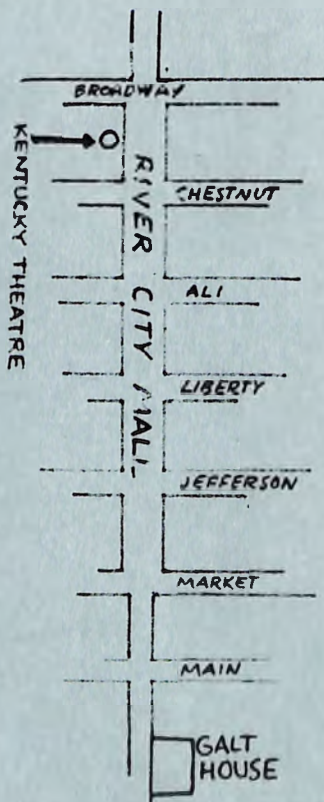

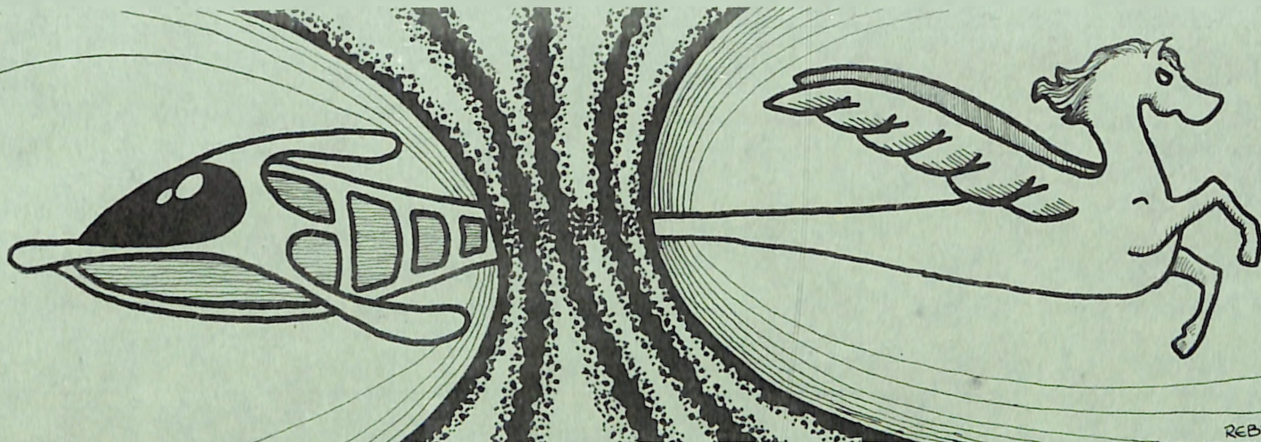

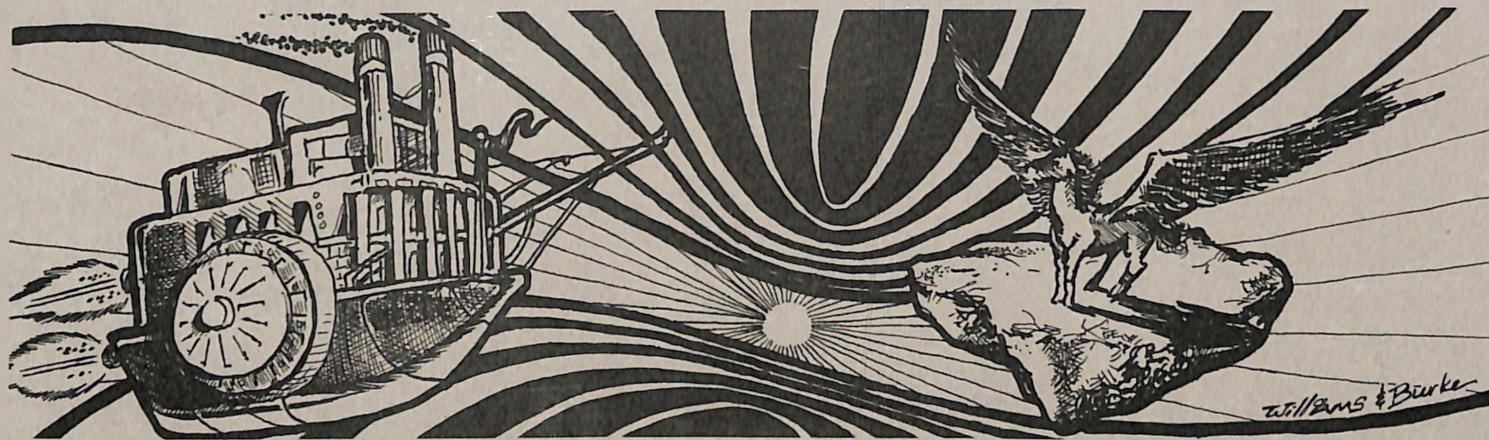

ART SHOW CLARIFICATION: The Art Show staff wish to clarify their position on checking bags at the door.

Many artists depend upon the money they receive at art shows, especially from auctions, for their livelihood. If a prized piece is stolen, the artist receives, at best, the minimum price. If the piece is not-for-sale, the artist may lose a cherished possession. We ask you to understand for security's sake, please check your bag, purse or package at the door. We will supply paper and pencil should you wish to bid, or you may use your own. We know that most of you are trustworthy, but, we must protect our artists' interest. If you really want to carry your bag or package with you, the professional guard or fannish guard will give a perfunctory search on your way out. Thank you for your cooperation.

The Seacon Business Meetings resulted in several items of interest to Worldcon attendees and fans who keep up with Worldcon matters. On items concerning membership cost and expenses, two proposals were ratified. (1) You cannot be required to pay anything above required voting costs, if you vote on site selection, to buy a supporting membership. (2) If you vote on site selection, you cannot be charged any more than the same amount as voting cost, added to that initial cost, to buy an attending membership, if you convert to attending within ninety days of voting. In other business, the rotation plan change was defeated by acclamation, and a motion to delete NASFIC from the Worldcon Constitution was defeated after much debate. (Marty Massoglia)

Seacon has also made site selection results public. Los Angeles received 130 votes; Seattle received 320 votes; and Denver received 453 votes, a majority. This accounts for 903 of the 975 ballots received; 55 were unpaid and 17 were marked no preference.
