IMPORTANT NOTICE

Welcome to Norwescon 12! What follows in your pocket program gives you very important information on rules and services provided to you by Norwescon and the Sheraton Hotel. We suggest you read these <u>before</u> you start your weekend. This way we can all have an even more enjoyable time. See ya around. Don't forget to come up to Room 503 and join the team by volunteering for a shift or two! Thanks.

DRINKING

You have no doubt heard all the talk in the news media about drinking and driving. We hope that this public awareness has reached the members of SF fan conventions. If you plan to drink, PLEASE, PLEASE, do not drive. If you must drive, please let your fellow fen know. This way we can all help you stay away from the bubbly (whatever for it takes).


There is another topic under the heading of responsible drinking which is a sometimes touchy subject...persons under 21 indulging in alcohol and other drugs. We, the NWC Con Committee, are realistic enough to know that if a young adult is deter-



mined to drink, we will not always be able to stop them. Responsible imbibing (not getting falling down drunk - becoming a menace to yourself and everyone else in the hotel and on the highways) will not be noticed as much, and the heavy hand of the hotel detective and/or our Site Services head will not be felt. The ID required rule at NWC Hospitality Room will be strictly enforced. We have a Washington State Banquet License and this is to protect us from legal hassles. We want all of our members to have a good time at NWC, and we want you all to return home safely.

PARTIES

Room and Hall parties are a very important part of Fan Conventions. A few things to know to help make them more enjoyable and safe for everyone: *Persons planning a room party must register said party with the Convention Services office in room 503*. You must also list who the host/hostess is. Any open party not registered can be closed. Room and Hall parties are restricted to the party floors. (No alcohol is allowed beyond these wings as well). If you are planning to have a room party, request lodging in one of *the party floors*. If you do not want to be anywhere near the parties, request quiet floors. A warning to room part hosts: We suggest you keep watch on who is grabbing a drink off the table or a beer from the tub. The laws in Washington State say that if you were the supplier of alcohol to minors or to someone who is already drunk and they in turn go and hurt themselves or others, YOU TOO are responsible for THEIR actions. You can also be fined for contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

SMOKING

Please observe the designated smoking and nonsmoking areas in the hotel. These areas will be clearly marked. Your cooperation will be appreciated.

WEE HOURS ROOM

For those fans who just can't get enough we have late night room(s) set up with you in mind. Talking, filking, gaming... it's up to you. If you want to gather with other fans the Wee Hours Room is the place to do it. Late night activities are located in the South Center room(s) (a.k.a. Hospitality) after the end of programming. (This room will close from 7am-9am for cleaning and reset.) *These rooms are not for sleeping*.

INFORMATION

An easily accessible clearing house of up to date information on schedule changes, eateries, places to shop, (this info in also included in your program packet) plus an area to display and collect flyers for various organization and cons. If you have any questions after the information table closes you can go to the convention Office in 503.

OFFICE

The nerve center of the convention is the Office. The main office is located in Room 503, Volunteer Lounge is in 502, Security is in 505. One of these offices is open 24 hours a day to help iron out any wrinkles you may encounter.

FIRST AID

A limited supply of first aid equipment is available in the Office. If you need a band aid or an aspirin we can supply that to you. None of our staff can administer medication. If you have a genuine medical emergency you can call 911 or go to one of the Tacoma area Hospital emergency rooms.

SLEEPING IN HALLS AND STAIRWAYS

One word to say on this subject... Don't.

PEACEBONDING

A list of the Peacebonding rule for Norwescon will be available at the Peacebonding Table in the main lobby of the Hotel. <u>All</u> weapons must be peacebonded. Remember, if its drawn its gone. Ignorance is no excuse.

HOTEL ROOM MINI-BARS

A new service established by the Sheraton Hotel is the Mini-Bar. This a small refrigerator containing various drinks and snacks. <u>These are not free</u>. The person(s) who is the registered room guest is responsible for paying for any item you consume from these Mini-Bars. A price list should be posted with each Mini-Bar. You will be billed by the Hotel at the end of your stay for items removed.

YOUNG AND FUTURE FANS

Norwescon welcomes its young and future fans. We will have programming throughout the convention geared for different age groups. Also, for a nominal fee, we will have daytime programming for children under 12 in our KidKon Room for those times Mom and Dad want to go off on their own. Norwescon will also provide a quiet room for the purpose of feeding, changing or resting a child.

Children 12 and under must be accompanied by a parent or adult guardian at all times, unless in the KidKon Room; children 10 and under are not allowed in any after-midnight programming or Hospitality. Children found unattended in public areas of the hotel will be taken to KidKon until picked up by their parents, who will be charged for the time KidKon has watched their children for them.

Teens 13 to 17 years of age must have an adult or adult guardian who is a Norwescon 12 member; said guardian must be on the premises at all times, and parents must sign a permission slip for minor to attend the convention. Permission slips can be obtained at the Registration tables.

<u>Remember, parents are responsible for the safety</u> <u>and actions of their children at all times</u>. These programs are here to foster enjoyment for all Norwescon members, but primarily for the safety and well-being of the children. Young fans are welcome at Norwescon but are expected to behave or be cared for in a responsible manner.

If parents believe that their convention activities will be constrained by these responsibilities, then Norwescon encourages that children be left at home under proper care.

KIDKON

KidKon will once again be open for children from three to twelve years of age. The younger ones must be potty-trained and have had pre-school or nursery school experience (your child needs to know how to play with others and be able to separate from you with a minimum of shrieking). This facility is a place where you can leave your children (for a fee) and go off and enjoy the convention.


Because of the large number of small children we serve, we have to close occasionally to revive the staff and to clean up the room. Therefore, it is expected that you will return every two to four hours, pick up your children, and feed them something nutritious.

We have several tracks of programming that run constantly in these rooms, including video programming for separate age groups, crafts, special projects, and visits by our Guests of Honor. We hope to have a magician or storyteller to entertain our small guests, and have our annual costume parade and dance.

Once again, parents who participate will receive care at a lesser cost than parents who don't participate. If you provide goods or service to our group, it will cost less to leave your children with us.

KIDKON CIRCUS

On Saturday, from 1-4 p.m. in the Pavilion, KidKon will feature a circus for all fans age 17 and under. The fun will include a midway with games, a magician, a clown and jugglers. Parents are encouraged to come and help their children enjoy the fun.

QUIET ROOM

Since there are so many new babies and toddlers in our group this year, we are opening an <u>unsupervised room, near Child Care, where you must stay</u> <u>with your child</u>. This room can be used for changing, napping, get-away-from-the-crowd room and is located across the hall from KidKon. Their is also a limited supply of baby food, diapers and accessories available for a fee through KidKon. This year the daycare staff will NOT be finding baby-sitters for children that do not meet our age requirements. There are just too few of us to help you out. If at all possible, find a sitter for that wee one, and leave him or her at home. You will <u>both</u> be happier.

RESTAURANTS

There are two restaurants within the hotel. The coffee shop is open from 6:00 a.m. to Midnight, during the convention except Sunday. The Rose Garden hours are Mon-Sat; lunch 11:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., Dinner 6:00 to 10:00 p.m. Elliot's Bar has a soup and sandwich buffet 11:30 - 2:00 p.m. Warning: There is a dress code for the Rose Garden. Costumes are not allowed. There will be a qwuick service food bar provided in the Bicentennial Pavilion Rotunda. The Sheraton will now be providing PIZZA via Room Service that can be delivered to any location within the hotel. The Pizza hours will be posted at the information table and in each sleeping room in the Sheraton.

Available at Elliot's and the Winter Garden this year will be Pan Galactic Gargle Blasters served in a Norwescon 12 special edition drink cup. Buy the drink and keep the cup. The PGGB will be available in alcoholic and non-alcoholic versions.





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MASQUERADE

There have been modifications to last year's rules and procedures; even if you participated at Norwescon 11's Masquerade, please read the following information. ALSO, PLEASE GET A COPY OF FULL RULES. COPIES ARE AVAILABLE AT THE INFORMATION TABLE AND AT THE MASQUERADE MEETINGS. The meeting locations and times are listed below. Thank you.

1) There will be two mandatory Masquerade Informational Meetings. You MUST attend one OR the other. (They will be relatively short.) The first one will be on Friday at 2pm, the Second one will be on Saturday at 10am. These meetings will be held in the Dressing rooms behind the Stage in the Pavilion. (The dressing rooms are in between room "D" and the back door of the Pavilion.) This will be a general information meeting. REGISTRA-TION FORMS MUST BE TURNED IN AT THIS TIME. (You can get forms at either this meeting or at the information table in the hotel lobby.) Children (age 12 and under) who will enter the main Masquerade (and not the KidKon Masquerade), will need to attend one of these meetings with a responsible adult. (A note of warning to parents: Children, (age 12 and under), may enter either Masquerade. If a Child enters the main Masquerade they will be judged in the "Junior's" division and may and may NÓT win.)

2) There will be a "RUN-THROUGH" at 3pm. All contestants must be present. This will be the REHEARSAL and will be the time to walk across the stage, turn in your cassette tapes (if any), test your sound/music cues, turn in your lighting cues, test your lighting cues, work on blocking (position of people and any props on the stage), etc. This meeting will be held at the Masquerade stage in the Pavilion; BUT FIRST GATHER AT THE DRESSING ROOMS. 3) Though costumes are optional for the "Run-Through", it is advisable that shoes, alien feet, walking sticks, and anything else that might be cumbersome or hinder your vision be worn to test the stairs, vision, etc.

4) So, no one will be registered after NOON on Saturday. Please note that dancing until 2 AM and partying until dawnare not valid excuses for missing the "Run-Through". Many of Masquerade volunteers will also be dancing until 2am and either working and/or partying until dawn, too.

PARKING & SHUTTLES

As you probably already know, parking at this hotel is quite a problem. For those of you staying at the other convention hotels we have arranged for a shuttle service from these to the Sheraton. See schedule times below. In the meantime, park only in designated parking places. Check for a flyer in your program packet for any updates. There are several pay parking lots within a few blocks of the Sheraton. Anyone found double parking or blocking fire lanes will be subject to towing without notice.

The Shuttle service from the remote hotels is free to members of Norwescon. Not only will the shuttles stop at the Best Western Executive Inn in Fife and the La Quinta but also at the Denny's in Fife. Within 2 or 3 blocks of Dennys there are a number of fast food outlets. Check the map provided in your program packet. During its regularly scheduled runs the shuttle will make stops every 20 to 30 minutes. We encourage you to leave your cars at your hotel and make use of this service.


