PROGRESS REPORT ONE.

As announced at Novacon 5, the Guest of Honour this year will be Dave Kyle who is known to almost everyone, but if you don't happen to be in that category let me enlighten you a little. He is an American member of First Fandom who has been living in England since the early seventies. Tall and dignified in appearance, he has a ready wit and a wealth of fannish anecdotes. Dave was co-founder of Gnome Press and his book 'The Pictorial History of SF', which will be published in May, is a must for all fen. We are very pleased that Dave has agreed to be our GoH.

We have again decided to hold Novacon at the Royal Angus Hotel this year, as the few complaints received by last year's committee, (chiefly concerning a lack of heating in some parts of the hotel, which the management assure us will not occur this time) were far outweighed by the many favourable comments.

For those who did not attend Novacon 5, The Royal Angus is a modern hotel only six years old. It can accommodate 222 guests, with each bedroom having bathroom, shower, radio & TV. The hotel has its own car park and is situated on the inner ring road, which can be reached from the M 6 by a direct expressway. For those travelling by rail it is easily reached by Centrebus, (only 2p) from New Street Station. A map and directions will be included with the final progress report.

Room rates show a slight increase on last year which we naturally regret, a single room will be £5.75 a night and a double or twin room £4.90 per person. These rates include continental breakfast, VAT and service charge. Full English breakfast will be available for an extra 75p. These rates are the lowest we could negotiate with the management in the face of current inflation, but they are definitely fixed and will not increase between now and Novacon. Booking forms will be dispatched in August.

Novacon will be held over the first weekend in November, i.e. 5th, 6th & 7th beginning Friday evening with a film. We are already in the process of selecting films in order to secure their booking, with the almost certain knowledge that the BBC will show one of them two weeks before the Con. Please bear with us as this is now traditional.

The programme, need I say, is two stages prior to embryonic at present, but there are nine months to go, (as I write this) and hopefully it will have developed somewhat by Progress Report 2.

May I appeal to you as faithful conventioners not to throw out anything remotely SF in the coming months, no matter how childish or inept you consider it, (remember, one person's meat.....) and place all such items in a box labeled 'Novacon 6 Auction' and bring it with you to the con. Thank you.
