If you think some of the above sounds evasive with just a dash of flippancy, I am only trying to emulate progress reports of other Cons., whilst desperately awaiting replies to letters.

With any luck we should be able to give the full programme in the August PR with plenty of time for last minute panic-stricken alterations.
