


Orycon 86 Regress Report

Memberships in OryCon '87 will be available at the following rates:

\$14 through May 31 \$17 through October 31 \$20 thereafter and at the door

Children ages 6-11: half price. Children age 5 and under: free.

Children must be accompanied by an adult.

Dealers' tables: (not many are left!)

\$50 through May 31 \$60 thereafter (if any remain)

Limit 3 tables per dealer, each table includes one membership. Rates are for full tables only; no half tables will be sold this year.

OryCon '87 – The Hotel

The upcoming OryCon will be held at the Red Lion–Columbia River, located near the Jantzen Beach shopping center (Northbound from Portland, it's on your left just before you cross the Columbia River).

We know that the Red Lion–Lloyd Center was a good hotel for OryCon '86. Those of us on the Committee liked the site as much as you did. However, one week following the con, the hotel's Sales Manager explained that room rates for a 1987 convention would be \$108 per night for a double. They had another group willing to take the weekend at that price, so they were not willing to negotiate. We were fairly sure that our attendees would rather go to a new hotel than see room rates double in one year.

The Red Lion–Columbia River has some advantages over the Lloyd Center property. The room rate will be a flat \$55.00 per night—no increase over 1986. Since we are taking up all the hotel's meeting space, we will not have to deal with mundane groups. The layout of this hotel makes it easier to block party/non-party areas. The Hospitality Suite is actually more sumptuous than the one at Lloyd Center.

The meeting space is comparable in size to that at the other Red Lion. The only real difference is that the Dealer's Room will have 4000 square feet of space rather than the too-cramped 3300 square feet we had for 1986. The only drawback we have found thus far is that the handicapped access to the meeting rooms is poor. Access exists to all areas, but involves using a service elevator. The hotel is undergoing remodeling in the Spring, which may solve the problem. If it does not, the hotel staff and the convention committee will do everything possible to make access as convenient as possible.

On the whole, we're pleased with the hotel and hope that you'll join us there for OryCon '87.

OryCon '87 Guest of Honor -Tim Powers

Tim Powers, our Guest of Honor for OryCon '87, is a two-time winner of the Philip K. Dick Memorial Award. Born in New York, he graduated from California State University at Fullerton, and now lives in Santa Ana, California, with his wife Serena. He has worked as a janitor, a bartender, a pizza cook, a caricaturist, and a tobacconist, but now works full time as a writer. He first started writing in 1965 in answer to editorials in *Fantasy and Science Fiction* on story writing. His stories were rejected until 1976 when his first novel, *The Skies Discrowned*, sold to Roger Elwood and Laser Books. According to Tim Powers, only about eight people own this book.

Actually, Tim is a wonderful speaker and just a neat guy to be around, and this rather dry biography doesn't do him justice. We'll be telling you more about him in future Progress Reports, but in the meantime you can read a fascinating interview with Tim and his friend James P. Blaylock, conducted by Andy Watson and J.B. Reynolds, in *Science Fiction Review* number 59 (Summer 1986).
