
# ORYCON SWEET SIXTEEN November 11-13, 1994

If this information is not correct or has changed, please let us know. Mailing us a post card is the best way, but if you must call, please spell out the changes so that we can put them into the computer correctly.

If the name on your label starts with "T/" or "G/", then your membership is associated with a table or was purchased as a guest of someone else and no other name has been given to us. We encourage you to let us know in advance the name of the person using the membership, so that we can have a correct badge ready.

Memberships and tables are transferable. Please let us know in advance so that we can have the correct badge ready at the convention. A signed note from the original member is all we need to accept the transfer. Please remember that we will not make any transfers at the convention without a note from the original owner.

### **OUR HOTEL**

Patty Wells (with additional material from the editor)

We are pleased to be returning to the Red Lion Inn/Columbia River for Orycon 16 (our 8th straight year—they must be doing something right). The sales manager has indicated the hotel's best wishes for another successful Orycon.

Room rates for this year's convention will be \$68 (tax is additional) for one to four persons. In recent years we have filled our room block. Continuing with last year's change, we have included the hotel reservation information and form in this progress report (it will appear again in Progress Report #2). There is no separate hotel card. You can make your reservation by cutting out (or photocopying it) and mailing the completed hotel form, or (even better) by calling the hotel directly at 503-283-2111. Just make sure that you tell the hotel that you're with OryCon to make sure that you get the proper rates. (The toll-free number will connect you with someone that knows nothing about OryCon, and probably won't get you the correct rates.)

The rate listed above is good no matter when you make your reservation—but remember, OryCon has sold out its entire block for several years in a row. As always, we recommend booking your room as soon as possible in order to get the type of room you prefer. Please remember to indicate whether you wish the party or the non-party wing, and to include a deposit or credit card number to guarantee your room if you are not planning on arriving before 6 pm. At this time, suites are not available during OryCon weekend. (And when you receive your confirmation, please check it carefully to make sure there are no errors.)

The Red Lion Inn/Columbia River is built using the standard Red Lion pattern: several low-lying (three-story) wings connected to the central core, where the meeting space is located, along with the coffee shop, better restaurant, "noisy" and Quiet Bar (that's its name). It is located on the Columbia River bank, has lots of parking and is next door to the Red Lion Hotel/Jantzen Beach with even more parking. A regional shopping center with a working carousel is a few blocks walk from the hotel. There's a very large Safeway (complete with sushi bar!) about ½-mile away that's open long hours. And there are several restaurants (from the golden arches to mongolian grill) within walking distance. The Pocket Program will have a Restaurant/Area Guide.

The hotel is adjacent to Interstate 5 (directions will be included in Progress Report #2, along with how to get here from the airport, and bus and train stations).

### **GUESTS OF HONOR**

Last year we had a flavour of the British Isles—this year it's the American Southwest. Beth Meacham and Tappan King currently live in Tucson, Real Musgrave is a Texan and Pat Cadigan is in Kansas.

### Beth Meacham

Beth Meacham is not only one of the science fiction/fantasy field's foremost editors (at Tor Books for the past ten years), but a great short story writer. As a book editor, she is perhaps not as visible as some of the magazine and anthology editors so this will be your opportunity to get to know her better. Look for some of her most recent fiction in such anthologies as Alternate Warriors, By Any Other Fame, and Dinosaur Fantastic. In between her editorial work for Tor (mostly conducted from home in Tucson—computers, modems and fax machines help make it possible) and fiction writing, Beth finds pleasure and relaxation in her equestrian pursuits (ask her about her Lippizaner Nada) and conversation with friends and colleagues on GEnie.

### Tappan King

"Novelist, editor, marketing maven, high class theoretician and spirit guide" is how Patrick Nielsen Hayden describes Tappan King, a grandson of Austin Tappan Wright. He is the co-author of Nightshade with Beth Meacham and of Down Town with Viido Polikarpus, and the editor of Rod Sterling's The Twilight Zone magazine. Tappan is currently promotions director of Tucson Lifestyle. If we ask nicely, perhaps we'll be able to hear some of his work in progress—"Cloudwrangler Ranch." We may have to wait, though, Tappan just bought a horse.

This summer (possibly even as you read this) Beth and Tappan are editors in residence at Clarion West.

### Pat Cadigan

Pat Cadigan is proof that inspired writing does come from Schenectady. Undoubtedly, her ten years as a writer and editor at Hallmark have helped create her distinctive voice. Why else would the London Guardian have hailed her as "Queen of Cyberpunk." It couldn't have had anything to do with her speaking last March at the London conference on artificial reality, "Seduced and Abandoned: The Body in the Virtual World." You'll just have to read her novels Mindplayers, Patterns and Synners and meet her at OryCon to find out.

### Real Musgrave

Back in those long-forgotten days B.H. (Before Homeownership) when we still had money burning holes in our pockets, Andrew and I began collecting a number of Real Musgrave's pocket dragons at the OryCon art shows. Then in April of 1985 we traveled to the Alti-Ego's convention in Denver, Colorado, and met Real and Muff Musgrave in person. Real and Muff are one of those all-too-rare husband/wife teams that really work as a team, with Muff handling all the gnarly business end of marketing, merchandising, keeping up on the galleries, museums, etc.—and doing it successfully enough that nowadays you can even get pocket dragon figurines if you are so inclined. Ever since then, we've always thought of Real-and-Muff as sort of an inseparable set (like Bogard and Bacall).

Of course in the ensuing poverty A.H. (After Homeownership), we have been forced to drastically cut back on out-of-town conventions and can no longer afford to enjoy the duel-to-the-debt of art show auctions. So as with other areas of our lives, we've decided that if we cannot travel to see Real and Muff, we'll just have to bring Real and Muff here to OryCon! If you're one of those who wonder where artists get their ideas, I'd recommend catching Real Musgrave's slide show and talk! You'll never see your friends, pets, and stuffed animals in quite the same way again!

### **ART SHOW**

This year, Ruth is taking a well-deserved break from the OryCon Art Show while she prepares for Westercon's next summer. But we're keeping the job in-house—I'll be running the show, after helping her for the last two years.

Other than that, very little has changed. You'll still find the Art Show in its familiar spot-the Willamette/Deschutes rooms on the lower level. There, you will find more than 1,000 pieces of artwork-paintings, drawings, prints, sculpture and jewelry. And, as usual, we plan to feature the artwork of the OryCon Artist GOH-this year, Real Musgrave.

The OryCon 16 Art Show welcomes artwork with science fiction, fantasy, comic or fannish themes. Display fees are \$7 for a 4' x 4' panel or 21/2' x 4' table space. (OryCon collects a 15% commission on all sales.) There is a \$2 fee for placing work in the Print Shop, which we are expanding this year to provide more display space.

Mail-in art work is welcome. The handling fee remains at \$15, with half being rebated if all your work is sold. In order to appropriately handle all of the artwork, there will be a maximum percentage of mail-in work accepted. Please make your space reservations as early as you can.

Last year, for the second year in row, we filled the show well before the convention. So make your reservations soon! If you wish to receive art show information and forms, contact us through the OryCon PO box (see elsewhere), or e-mail us at 74007,3342 (CompuServe) or J.LORENTZ (GEnie), or call (503) 283-0802. (Those artists and agents who are already on our list will be receiving this year's art show reservation mailing and don't need to make a new request.)

Each year, we've been working to improve the show with new forms, procedures and special lighting. We will continue in our attempt to make the art show function better and more professionally. Your help, comments and suggestions are very important to us and to the success of the Art Show.

By the way, many hands are needed during the convention for set-up/teardown, artist check-in/check-out, data entry, security, sales and more. Stop by and lend a hand-it will be a great opportunity to see the show!

It's Hospitality without the drinks and munchies, Gaming without the dice and cards, Filking without the guitars and songbooks, the Art Show without the art. It's faanish. What is "faanish"? Come in and find out.

The Fan Room is the center of fanzine activity at OryCon. That said, be aware that in practice the Fan Room has about as much to do with fanzines as science fiction fandom has to do with science fiction. If you know nothing about fanzines, don't worry—you're welcome anyway! Come in and browse, ask questions, chat. You might make some new friends.

The Fan Room will also be the location for several silly and laid-back programming items during the convention. There will also be "themed conversation hours"—a time and place for people to gather and chat about a pre-announced topic. More details as they emerge.

The Fan Room is a place for:

Conversation.

• Silly games, such as Charades or Twenty Questions.

• Reading fanzines.

• Making up strange new car names.

• Gathering material for fanzines.

• SMOFfing (a no-SMOFfing zone will be provided).

Plotting the overthrow of the civilized world.

General silliness.

- Sleeping.

The Fan Room will be located in the Santiam room (by the Office). The hours are: on Friday 4 to 6 pm and 8 to 11 pm; on Saturday 11 am to 6 pm and 9 to 11 pm; and, on Sunday 11 am to 4 pm.

### **MASQUERADE INFORMATION**

Patrick & Peggy Kennedy

Orycon 16 will have a formal Masquerade on Saturday evening complete with M/C, Divisions, and Judges. In general, the Masquerade will operate under the guidelines suggested by the International Costumers Guild.

Registration will open Friday evening and will close at 6 PM on Saturday. The registration form will ask for information on dominant colors and general type of costume This information will be used solely to arrange entries in the best order by separating similar colors, themes or effects. The order of entry will be determined by the Masquerade Staff. If you have a valid reason for going on at a particular time (i.e., your costume has a five-minute supply of oxygen) consult with the Director.

The Masquerade will be held starting at 8:30 pm in the Main Program Room, on a platform of risers forming a stage, with the Judges' table left-center, as you face the audience. This is the same stage which will serve as a dais for speakers, and so will be available for blocking presentations when no programming is scheduled. In practice, this means late Friday and early Saturday. Because the stage is fairly small, large groups will have problems and we suggest you plan with that in mind.

### **DIVISIONS**

The skills/experience Divisions System was developed as a means of promoting fairness in Masquerade competitions. The System serves to deter costumers with long-developed skills and many "wins" to their credit from competing directly with those having less experience and whose skills are less finely honed. The ORYCON 16 Masquerade will use the Divisions of Young Fan, Novice, Journeyman, and Craftsman, as defined below:

YOUNG FAN: A contestant who is less than 13 years of age at the time of the convention competes as a Young Fan. For award purposes, Young Fan costumes will be further divided as to those made by the contestant (with minor help from an adult), and those made by adults for the contestant.

NOVICE: A contestant who has not yet won an award at <u>any</u> Fantasy/ Science Fiction Convention Masquerade may compete as a Novice (or, at his/her discretion, may compete as a Journeyman or Craftsman).

JOURNEYMAN: A contestant who has won at least one but fewer than three awards at any F/SF Convention Masquerade <u>must</u> compete as a Journeyman (or, at her/his discretion, may compete as a Craftsman).

CRAFTSMAN: A contestant who has won three (3) or more major awards for three (or more) different costumes at <u>any</u> Con Masquerades <u>must</u> compete as a Craftsman. Contestants at this level <u>must compete</u> as Masters.

### **OUT-OF-COMPETITION:**

Any costumer, including those not meeting the eligibility requirements (see below) may enter out-of-competition. Only nudity and stage restrictions will apply.

### **ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARDS**

- 1) No costume may be entered in competition which has won an award in any Worldcon or CostumeCon. However, we welcome the out-of-competition display of award-winning costumes. If you have a Worldcon winner you would like to show again, bring it and wear it. We will be delighted to see it.
- 2) Professionally made (purchased or rented) costumes may not be entered in competition.
- Agreeing with Bill Rotsler that No Costume is no costume, total nudity is prohibited.
- 4) Since there will be separate Hall Costume Awards at ORYCON 16, hall costumes will not be eligible to compete in the Masquerade. However, Hall Costume award winners will be given the opportunity to display their costumes on stage during the Judging Intermission. Then, if time permits, all others who are in costume will be encouraged to display their costumes.

### **STAGE RESTRICTIONS**

# These rules will be strictly enforced. Violations may result in ejection from the Masquerade!

- 1) No dangerous or potentially dangerous props are permitted. This includes open flames, sharp or projectile weapons, working lasers, martial arts nasties, and anything else which, in the opinion of the Director, embodies physical danger to contestants or audience. If in doubt, consult with the Director BEFORE the Masquerade.
- 2) Nothing shall be allowed which presents a real possibility of damage to the clothing or well-being of other contestants or of the audience. If it drips, smells, or rubs off, don't use it!

- 3) Time limits: there will be a per-presentation limit of 60 seconds. With very few exceptions, less is usually better. If you think you have to run longer, clear it with the Director.
- 4) No microphones will be available to contestants. We will have a cassette player hooked into the sound system, and you can bring a pre-recorded cassette with narration, music, and/or dialogue (for lip-synching). Please cue up your tapes; that is, wind the tape to start 2 seconds BEFORE your music or narration begins. We will attempt to provide time for contestants to consult with our sound engineer before the Masquerade.
- 5) Lighting: We will attempt to provide contestants with a selection of lighting setups and with an opportunity to consult with our lighting engineer before the Masquerade. Because of time and budget constraints, lighting selections will be quite limited (compared to even amateur theatre), so costumes and effects should be planned accordingly.

#### **VOLUNTEERS:**

Not planning to compete in the Masquerade but want to be involved anyhow? We need helpers. Volunteer, and store up credit in Costumer's Heaven!

### **ORYCON POLICIES**

### Weapons

In line with the Standard Practice at most major conventions, including recent World conventions, the carrying and wearing of weapons will not be permitted, except as part of a Masquerade contestant's costume, or as part of other designated events, and then only during the event, or in transit to and from the event. The use of a weapon as part of the Masquerade must be approved by the Masquerade Director prior to the event. Failure to do so are grounds for immediate expulsion from the convention.

The Convention committee defines as weapons any object designed to cause bodily harm, or any replica of such an object and any other object the Committee determines to be dangerous. However the committee reserves the right to amend this definition of a weapon, and the right to impound weapons for the duration of the convention.

Any weapons purchased in the Dealer's Room must be securely wrapped.

The committee realizes that most people who would like to carry and wear weapons are sensible and careful individuals. However, because of the present liability laws, the risk of weapons causing accident or distress, and to preserve relationships with convention hotels, we have had to adopt this policy. The safety of convention members has to be our overriding consideration.

### **Smoking**

Yes, we are making a change in the OryCon smoking policy. This year smoking will only be permitted in the Hospitality Smoking Room. No smoking will be permitted in the hallways or any of the other convention space. Thank you for helping clear the air for our convention membership.
