

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PHILCON'S FANNISH DRINK RECIPES

Some years back, Charlie Brown brought to NY City College at Christmas time a concoction he called Mog. At the same time, Burt Rosenburg brought in from his lab the usual Christmas drink. After Charlie told us all about the fannish aspects of the drink, I started to modify. The eventual recipe is as follows:

In a 12-gallon jug or other container, 1 to 2 pints of 190° proof alcohol 1 to 2 cans of Hawaiian Punch 1 can pineapple juice ginger ale close to top orange or other fruit soda to taste finish off with 190° to top

You may also add fruit punch, sliced bananas, oranges and lemons, etc. However, these must be added first, for they sop up the alcohol.

And don't forget ice. Everything which is added should be cold.

Tom Hadley of the Buffalo Book Company introduced Bob Pavlat and Chick Derry to this drink at the 1947 WorldCon in Philadelphia, and from there it passed into fannish legend.

Pavlat and Derry popularized the drink in WSFA, and introduced it to others the following year at the CinVention.

Variations include using vodka instead of gin, the result being a Nuclear Fuse; and using vodka and gin, thus making a Nuclear Fuzz.

Where in Eat

There are several eating places within a block or two of the hotel, ranging from the moderate food and moderate prices of Horn & Hardart to the cheap, tolerable food of Dewey's or the bus station. Any member of the committee will be happy to direct you to one of them. In addition, Philadelphia has a number of fine restaurants, and PhilCon's own galloping gourmet, Yale Eidekin, will be available with recommendations, and directions for those who need them.

One restaurant deserves special mention, however. The MAY FLOWER, 220 N. Tenth St. (near Race St.), features Mandarin, Szechuan and Cantonese food. It is a small, unassuming-in-appearance and inexpensive restaurant, with a large variety of superb Chinese food. As a charter member of the Great Wall Society, I am familiar with Chinese restaurants in most of the cities of the East (US, that is), including such popular food meccas as The Dynasty in New York and Boston's House of Roy. The May Flower, over all, is the finest Chinese restaurant I've ever eaten in. A list of especially recommended dishes would encompass most of the menu, but of particular note are: lichee duck, wine sauce fish, five-flavored beef, moo shu pork, sauteed szechuan shrimp and (for those who like hot food) spicy triple delight. As the restaurant is tiny, you may have to stand in line for up to an hour before getting seated, but the service is good thereafter and the food is well worth an hour in line.
