Bruce Sterling is a prolific writer and true "Renaissance man" within his chosen art. His many works include the 1992 non-fiction work Hacker Crackdown and the novels Islands in the Net, Involution Ocean, and Schismatrix. With William Gibson, he co-authored The Difference Engine in 1990. Besides writing a regular column for Science Fiction Eye, he has published multiple short stories in magazines like Omni and Isaac Asimov's SF. His journalism efforts have appeared in *Details*, Wired, and Interzone 16. In Austin, Texas, where he resides with his wife and two daughters, he has been an active board member of the Electronic Frontier Foundation, an electronic civil liberties group.


Bruce Jensen's professional art is rivaled by few. From the coveted Galactic Empires collectable cards to the cover art for such notable works as William Gibson's Neuromancer and Philip K. Dick's <u>Do Androids</u> Dream of Electric Sheep? to presiding as art director with CBS for the weekend edition of the Evening News. Not to mention his work on Marvel Comics' Spiderman and Incredible Hulk titles, cover art for such novels as The Rising of the Moon by Flynn Connolly and Snowcrash and Diamond Age by Neil Stephenson. The Indianapolis native still, remarkably, finds time to spend with his wife Yoshie Odaka and the many birds that live with them in their New York home.

Tom Savini is one of the best-known Hollywood stars you've probably never heard of. Make-up artists are perhaps among the film and television industry's most unsung heroes. He has films like Man of a Thousand Faces, Dawn of the Dead, Creepshow, Friday the 13th, and From Dusk Till Dawn tucked under his belt. Every one of these films, and many more, wouldn't be half as memorable without his magic touch.

Walter Jon Williams began writing in his late twenties, dabbling in science fiction for several years. With the advent of cyberpunk, his work proliferated, and he quickly became one of the movement's foremost authors. Recent novels to his credit include City on Fire, Rock of Ages, and 1995's Metropolitan, which was nominated for the Nebula Award. His 1985 book Knight Moves, was nominated for the Philip K. Dick Award.

Programming

There will be our usual array of varied programming, plus separate tracks of film, anime, live Internet access, and much, much more. Planned program topics include the following, randomly-selected: Death as a Career Move, Can Human Beings Levitate?, Vampire Fiction as Soap Opera, Crimes of the Future, How To Pick Up Aliens, and We Love Dinosaurs But We Wouldn't Want to Meet One in A Dark Alley–just to name a few.



Workshops

Philcon traditionally sponsors workshops for writers and artists. These programs run during the day on Saturday and are open to anyone interested in the subject. These workshops are run by professionals or highly regarded competitors in these fields.

Registration

Philcon '98 adult memberships are \$30 until September 15th, 1998, \$35 until October 24th, and \$40 thereafter. No pre-reg postmarked after November 1st will be accepted. 
Remember that pre-registering allows you to avoid lines at the registration desk.

Baby-sitting

Baby-sitting will again be offered this year to all members of the conference. Parents and children must be preregistered by October 15th. Baby-sitting is for children ages three months to six years old. The fee is \$40 per child, and includes the cost of a regular child's membership; parents must spend two hours per child helping out in baby-sitting. Hours are; Friday: 3:00pm till 5:00pm, 6:00pm till midnight; Saturday: 9:00am till 5:00pm, 6:00pm till midnight; Sunday: 9:00am till 3:00pm. You must pick up your child for the dinner hour on Friday and Saturday and you must feed your children all other meals. Juice and crackers will be available for snacks. Philcon reserves the right to refuse to provide baby-sitting services or end services to any child when we feel it is appropriate.

Filk Song Contest

Philcon is sponsoring its 11th Annual Filk Song Contest, open to filksongs hitherto unpublished or first published after October 1, 1997. Lyrics must be original and score may be original, but arrangements (someone else's words to someone else's music) are not eligible. Entries set to original music must include an audio tape and should include a written score. Entries set to obscure music should include an audio tape. (Remember, something you have known for years may not be known to the judges.) Original lyric entries may include audio tapes as well as the required printed, or typed, lyric sheets for all entries. Entry judging will not be based upon the quality of the performance on the submitted tapes. Winners will be announced at Masquerade half-time. All entries must be postmarked by October 15, 1998. Weapons Policy

No weapons: guns, gun replicas, swords, knives, lasers, model lasers, or anything that could be perceived as a weapon by the public, will be permitted at Philcon. The Philcon Committee has the final say as to what constitutes a weapon. Unfortunately, we must reserve the right to revoke the membership of anyone who refuses to comply with this policy. The only exception is for registered participants in the Masquerade who may wear a weapon, excepting guns and operational lasers, from one-half hour before to one-half hour after the Masquerade. All Masquerade weapons must be affixed to the costume. Participants in the Costumers' Workshop may also wear weapons, with the same restrictions, while in the workshop.

Volunteers

Attending science fiction conventions is fun but actually working at one can make it even more enjoyable. Just sign up at the volunteer table, nothing is mandatory, you can work when you like, at what you like. As a reward, we will give a free membership to anyone working over 10 total hours before, during, and after the convention. We also hold raffles for prizes donated by dealers that can only be claimed by volunteers.

How to Get to Philcon

The Hotel

The Adam's Mark Hotel is located on the corner of City Avenue (US-1) and Monument Road, just south of the Schuylkill Expressway (I-76). Parking is available for \$2, Room reservations include free parking.

From City Ave., US-1 South

Upon exit from I-76 to City Ave., US-1 south, the hotel is on the left. Get into left lane as soon as possible and turn left at the 3rd traffic light, Monument Rd. Look for the large red "Adam's Mark" symbol on the side of the hotel.

From the South

Take I-95 north. Near the Philadelphia Airport take the exit marked: To 76 west, Rt. 291, Central Philadelphia. Follow the signs for I-76 west. Do not exit onto Island Ave. You will soon cross the Schuylkill River, get in the left lane and turn left at the traffic light at the end of the bridge. This street exits directly onto I-76 west. Take I-76 west to exit #33: US-1 south, City Ave. You must be in the extreme left lane to exit.


From the West

Take the PA Turnpike to the Valley Forge exit, exit #24. From the toll booth proceed directly onto the Schuylkill Expy. (I-76 east). Take exit #33: US-1 south, City Ave.

From the North

Take the New Jersey Turnpike to PA Turnpike, exit #6. Take exit #28, then take US-1 south. After 1 mile the road divides, enter the left (inner) lanes. After 15 miles you will cross the Schuylkill River, get in the right lane and at the end of the bridge, exit right for I-76 west, US-1 south, Valley Forge. Move to the left lane and take the next exit, exit #33: US-1 south, City Ave.

Public Transportation

Take the 44 or 38 bus from 16th & J.F.K. Blvd. Amtrak passengers take a free shuttle train to Suburban Station and go upstairs to the bus. Airport travellers can take a limousine to the hotel or a train to Suburban Station and the bus. (The 1, 65, 85, and 121 busses also go the the Adam's Mark.)
