Philcon GoH Connie Willis's Handy-Dandy Writer's Guide to Subscribing to Locus

1. Write in pathetic isolation, knowing nothing and nobody for several years.

2. Join writer's workshop. Find out about *Locus*, which entire workshop tells you to subscribe to.

3. Ignore advice. (Do you know what postage for sending out stories costs these days, to say nothing of Xeroxing?) Buy single newsstand issue of *Locus* instead.

4. Read issue. Find out all kinds of neat stuff – markets you've never heard of, convention dates, news of magazines going under, etc. Realize you have been submitting stories to no-longer-publishing magazine for two years. Decide to buy next month's issue.

20. In March issue read that writer who wrote terrible review of your book just sold new novel for \$1 billion. Decide not to read People & Publishing section anymore.


21. Continue to read *Locus*. Win Nebula, Hugo, Bram Stoker Award, World Fantasy Award, and Pulitzer Prize.




