Children's Programming overlaps several other programming themes, including Art, Anime, and LEGO. It's designed for attendees ages six through twelve, but parts may appeal to older demographics (teens, adults) and younger ones (with parental assistance). In 2004, we featured some 20 activities, including: Bellydancing, Customize A Foam Visor, Drawing Dragons, Origami, Theme Song Singalong, and Squad Combat With LEGO Bricks -- and this year, who knows? Regardless of shape, it's all selected to encourage interest in SF/F.

Children's Programming is neither playground nor Babysitting[\*], but offers programs of appeal to children. Sometimes it's so much fun, in such compact space, that CRAZINESS! happens. Therefore, the 2005 Kids Room will operate a compromise schedule: three hours open, one closed; repeat. This will provide intermissions for parents and children to enjoy meals and exercise together, elsewhere in the venue. Depressurization is fun! And remember: Don't limit yourself to the Kids *Room*, because additional family-friendly programming can be found throughout

Parents are strongly urged to volunteer some of their time in the Kids Room. Activity ideas are also welcome.

Sci-Fi, Fantasy, and Historical entries are encouraged, but please remember that there is no open mike; music, dialogue, voice over, etc. must be on tape, or clearly written for the MC to read during the performance. Performance duration may be no longer than one (1) minute, unless special permission is obtained in advance from the Masquerade Director.

Philcon encourages the wearing of hall costumes (street legal and conforming to weapons policy, please!) and will have several roaming judges handing out award ribbons in the public areas of the conference. We will also feature costuming programming covering topics of interest for all levels of costumers, from Novice to Master.

Masquerade registration will be open on Friday from 6PM to 9PM, and on Saturday from 10AM to 4PM. All contestants must submit their registration forms by 4PM in order to participate. For more information, contact:

No Weapons: i.e. guns, gun replicas, swords, knives, lasers, model lasers or anything that could be perceived as a weapon by the public will be permitted at Philcon. The Philcon Committee has the final say on what constitutes a weapon. Unfortunately, we must reserve the right to revoke the membership, without refund, of anyone who refuses to comply with this policy. The only partial exception is for registered participants of the Masquerade, who may wear a weapon, excepting guns and operational lasers, from one-half hour before to one-half hour after the Masquerade. All Masquerade weapons must be affixed to the costume. Participants may use (draw, brandish, gesticulate with or otherwise waggle about) weapons as part of their performance onstage, but at no other time.

REGARDLESS OF ANYTHING ELSE, YOU MUST COMPLY WITH ALL LAWS.

Items that receive three written bids will be auctioned in the voice auction on Sunday afternoon. There is also a Print Shop for photoprints and multiple copy items.
