4:00 - Science-Fiction Theater "Time Is Just A Place" - Don DeFore, Marie Windsor

4:30 - Superboy - Pilot episode for the hit TV series (1961)

5:00 - Camouflage - Walt Disney's contribution to the war effort (or possibly Warner Bros.; nobody's sure)

5:30 - The Wizard Of Oz -No, nobody sings "Over The Rainbow". In fact, nobody sings at all. This is the 1925 silent version with Larry Semon and Oliver Hardy

7:00 - Attack of the B-Movie Monster - See Brinke Stevens and Kenneth Tobey (among others) menaced by a monster that acts as if it's made out of clay. Contains scenes from every B movie you've ever seen!
