



# **Artist Guest of Honor: Eric Flint**

Eric Flint's writing career began with the novel Mother of Demons, published in 1997. With David Drake, he has collaborated on the six novels in the Belisarius series (An Oblique Approach, In the Heart of Darkness, Destiny's Shield, Fortune's Stroke, The Tide of Victory and The Dance of Time), as well as a novel entitled The Tyrant. His alternate history novel 1632 was published in 2000, followed by many sequels, several of which made the New York Times extended bestselling list.

Flint has also co-authored SF adventure novels with the South African writer Dave Freer: Rats, Bats & Vats, The Rats, the Bats, and the Ugly, and Pyramid Scheme. His comic fantasy novels The Philosophical Strangler and Forward the Mage came out in May of 2001 and March of 2002. He



is also working on a major fantasy series with Mercedes Lackey and Dave Freer, the first volume of which (*The Shadow of the Lion*) came out in March 2002 and the second volume (*This Rough Magic*) appeared in December 2003.

Flint is also working on several other ongoing projects:

—With David Weber on a series of novels set in Weber's Honor Harrington universe. The first two of those, *Crown of Slaves* and *Torch of Freedom*, have already appeared and he is currently working on the next book in the series.

—A new alternate history series taking place in Jacksonian America, the first two volumes of which have already appeared: 1812: The Rivers of War and 1824: The Arkansas War.

—Further volumes in the Joe's World series, which began with *The Philosophical Strangler* and *Forward the Mage*.

—A new SF adventure series with Ryk Spoor, the first two volume of which have been published. (*Boundary* and *Threshold*) The sequel, *Portal*, is being worked on right now.


—Several SF adventure volumes with K.D. Wentworth, beginning with *The Course of Empire* and *The Crucible of Empire*.

In addition to his own writing, Flint is the editor of several series reissuing the works of past SF authors. These include James H. Schmitz, Keith Laumer, Christopher Anvil, Murray Leinster, Randall Garrett, Tom Godwin and Howard L. Myers. He was also the editor of the online science fiction and fantasy magazine, *Jim Baen's Universe*.

Flint graduated Phi Beta Kappa from the University of California at Los Angeles in 1968, majoring in history (with honors), and later received a masters degree in African history from the same university. Despite his academic credentials, Flint spent most of his adult life as an activist in the American trade union movement, working as a long-shoreman, truck driver, auto worker, steel worker, oil worker, meatpacker, glassblower and machinist. He has lived at various times in California, Michigan, West Virginia, Alabama, Ohio, and Illinois. He lives in northwest Indiana with his wife Lucille.

# **Artist Guest of Honor: Brent Chumley**

Brent is a professional illustrator, graphic designer, and photographer. He has been producing art of many varied sorts for companies both large and small and private clients as well since the age of 14. Brent has also worked as an illustrator and graphic designer in the role-playing and collectible card game industry for over 10 years creating work for such companies as: Wizards of the Coast (Dungeons & Dragons core and Eberron settings). # Costumer Guest of Honor: Joanne Kirley

As a child I had been costuming for years, I just didn't know it. Mom bought patterns but she also brought home a display book and began building from what she saw. She gave me her pretty bathrobe to play in (she had to, I kept taking it.) and I altered it into a princess' gown and wore it to tatters.

Making stuff out of scraps led my direction, making hats and costumes for antique photo parlors up and down the west coast brought in my first clients. Working at local fabric stores and doing occasional custom work and theater jobs led to making rental stock for Halloween and a business license. A friend brought me to my first science fiction/fantasy convention; Rustycon 4 (Dameon Willich was the Artist Guest of Honor) and we en-



tered the Masquerade (Best of Show, shared with Betty Bigelow's group)

I was hooked, and immediately started planning for the next year. Rustycon was a wonderful experience for me, very family friendly and inspirational – I left with my head filled with so many new ideas and new friends. Rustycon has always been a haven to bring my children with me – they grew up in the hallways, the friends we met at Rustycon and Norwescon have filled our lives with beauty and love.

New projects came and went – working on shows, sewing for weddings, working at fabric stores, looking forward to making the next years Masquerade entry. And the Hall Costumes! They deserve their own special mention. What fun it has been making and seeing drop dead inside wearable all day costumes over the years. And of course the Dance costumes. In fact, packing for conventions meant realistically packing as many as three outfits per day. Bringing about a certain ingenuity in the designs over the years!

Eventually became the occasional Judge at Masquerades, always an honor. Real life opportunities began to include video work and web series work (JourneyQuest). # Parties at Rustycon

- Room parties shall be restricted to designated party suites, as designated by the hotel and rented by the party host.
- Party host must secure a banquet liquor license and display the original on the wall near your bar.
- No alcohol is permitted to leave party that it was served at yes people can buy alcohol
  and leave the bar but the bar cuts them off much earlier than our parties do.
- The party must conform to the rules set forth by the hotel.
- The host(s) must be 21 years of age or older. The host should be a non-drinker during the party.
- The host(s) shall be responsible for the conduct of those attending the party. S/he shall be certain that no one drinks and drives, and that no minors are served alcohol.
- The host(s) shall be responsible for the party and any incidents that occur there, or as a
  result of. Rustycon shall not be responsible for any damage to persons or property during the aforementioned party, or as a result of.
- All persons at the party must have legal ID. on their person at all times.
- We reserve the right to shut down any party for any reason.
- The host(s) must be present at the party during the entire time that the party is in progress.
- Music you can't bring in professional DJ equipment, we have been asked by the hotel
  to move the big loud parties to function space and only allow music that is from equipment like a boom box in the Party suites. Make sure your music can't be heard down
  the hall.
- Noise if your party is very noisy, with music, and many people we ask you to leave your windows closed and your door mostly closed.
- Drunks drunks are everybody's problem. How can you help mitigate the problem?
   Maybe donate some coffee to our hospitality that will be open very late? Got some non-drinkers for late night security volunteering? Any help you can provide is appreciated.
   We will be doing our part. At the very least CARD everyone and cut off anyone driving early.
- Remember KEEP WATCH ON WHO IS DRINKING. We require that all parties serving alcohol check ID and not leave alcohol where anyone can grab it. The laws in Washington State say that if you are the supplier of alcohol to minors or to someone who is already drunk and they hurt themselves or others, YOU TOO are responsible for THEIR actions. There are also heavy fines for contributing to the delinquency of a minor it you are found to have supplied them with alcohol.

# **Policies**

- 1) Behavior: Be polite. Be patient. Be pleasant. The most important rule after the previous 3 is HAVE FUN!
- 2) Foreign Language: When dealing with the aliens, frequently use these phrases—"please", "thank you", and "you're doing a wonderful job." At all times speak in a pleasant tone. Yelling or harsh tones are never constructive when trying to communicate, besides it can be had to scare the aliens, zombies or other wild fae creatures.
- 3) Neatness: Personal neatness the sign of an advanced lifeform. Picking up after one's self is a highly respected character trait. Throughout the station, the staff have thoughtfully provided trash cans -- use them! Brains must be consumed completely!
- 4) Native Taboos: Refrain from receiving firsthand experience dealing with Alien or Station law enforcement! Avoid having your con membership revoked. Always observe these native Jaboos!
  - a) Never approach an alien or staff member who is handling the local currency if you are wearing a mask or heavy costume facial makeup. (Particular locations you might encounter this taboo are at the hotel registration desk, the local merchant shops, and any place that serves food or drink.)
  - b) Never carry ANY weapons (or objects that could possibly be perceived as being weapons) into a native recreation center that serves alcohol. While on the hotel grounds the weapons policy "If It's Drawn You're Gone!" is ALWAYS in effect.
- 5) Problem Solving: Promptly report problems through the proper diplomatic channels. Contact Rustycon Convention Security immediately if you see anyone breaking rules, damaging Hotel property, creating a safety hazard, or doing anything that reflects badly on Rustycon.
- 6) Media: Direct all Press and Media to the office. You can alert someone in security to guide them to the office. Media and Press must have the proper press credentials. Members are not to act as Media Agents.
- 7) Minors: We welcome minors with parent or legal guardian permission. Minors under 13 must be accompanied by their parents or legal guardians and minors between the ages of 13-17 must have a responsible guardian on site at all times.
- 8) Refunds: No refunds of any kind will be given for memberships of any kind.


