Guests of Honor

POUL ANDERSON is a multiple award-winning author of science fiction, fantasy, and historical novels. His writing runs the gamut from high fantasy to hard science fiction, from verse and song to farce and space opera. He is a co-founder of the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA), and a past Worldcon Guest of Honor. Poul's first story was published in 1947. He continues to be a thought-provoking and entertaining master of science fiction. Among his works are "Queen of Air and Darkness" (Hugo & Nebula awards, 1972), THE HIGH CRUSADE, BRAIN WAVE, THE BROKEN SWORD, "Call Me Joe", the Hoka stories (with Gordon Dickson), the Flandry stories, OPERATION CHAOS, ORION SHALL RISE, THREE HEARTS AND THREE LIONS, TAU ZERO, the Polesotechnic stories, and many, many more. He has won a total of seven Hugos and three Nebulas. His most recent publications include the KING OF YS series, written with his wife, Karen Anderson.

WALT WILLIS' fannish career is legendary. From Slant in 1948 to Hyphen 37 in 1987, he has been one of the finest, most innovative writers to appear in the fan field. Among other things, he is the man responsible for the Enchanted Duplicator, "The Harp That Once Or Twice", and many many puns. Walt is best known for his fanzines humor criticism fiction everything. His column on fandom appeared for over a decade in the professional magazine, NEBULA. A 614 page collection of his writing was published as a special, hardbound issue of Warhoon in 1978. Walt was the linchpin of Irish Fandom and the Belfast-Savannah Axis. This is a rare opportunity to meet one of Ireland's finest contributions to the field.

- Take Las Olas Bivd. east to Seabreeze Bivd. (one block before A1A and the beach).
- Turn right on Seabreeze and go south about one block to the Fort Lauderdale Surf Hotel & Marina.

From Fort Lauderdale International Airport:

- 1. Take U.S. 1 north to Broward Blvd.
- 2. Turn right and go east on Broward Blvd to SE 3rd Ave.
