


# BABYSITTERS, ANYONE?...

WESTERCON XVIII can supply 24-hour babysitters if there is any demand for them. Fans might then plan to bring their children for the trip and sightseeing and still have them out of the way during the con; or have them watched during the important functions, when children would be out of place.

Special rates—much lower than the standard hotel fee of over \$1 an hour—can be arranged, if sufficient interest is shown by the parents who might use this service. Having the children along can be lots of fun...and loads cheaper than local boarding fees (about \$35 for a 3-day weekend).

However, we <u>must</u> hear from interested parents before the babysitters will commit themselves for a holiday weekend. Drop us a card (which in no way obligates you), telling us when you might use a babysitting service (for the entire weekend?...some special hours?). Note how many children you'd be bringing, their ages & sex/es. Indicate whether it is certain that you'll be here, or that you are interested, just in case.

Further details on this in the third Progress Report, when we'll know for sure if there is enough interest to warrant following through with it. Even if there isn't sufficient interest, some reasonable babysitters may be hired for those who'll wish it; but they will still have to have their holiday time reserved early—so no matter what, let us know if you are interested at all!

THE EDGEWATER INN MARINA HOTEL has about 200 guest rooms, and they have set aside a sizeable block for the Westercon. However, July is the height of the Southern California tourist season, and we can almost guarantee that if you show up at the last minute expecting a room, you won't get one -- it can happen, as late arrivals at last year's Pacificon II found out! It's always more fun to stay at the convention hotel, and the best way to make sure that you do...is to reserve your room now!

Luxurious is the only word to describe the Edgewater Inn's huge rooms: each room has its own private balcony, with sliding glass doors. Most rooms feature dual washbasins (one in the bathroom and one in the adjoining dressing room), double-size beds, free coffee set ups, the ubiquitous TeeVee...and complete soundproofing.

Choices in accomodations range: Singles-- \$10.00, Doubles or Twins--\$14.00, and Suites from \$25.00 to \$45.00, depending on the number of persons. As with most hotels, each extra person in a room costs an additional \$3.00. These are the Edgewater Imm's winter rates; their summer rates (\$3 to \$5 higher) will be in effect in July for all except Westercon members.



THE BANQUET is scheduled for Sunday afternoon, July 4th, and features Roast Boneless Capon stuffed with Rice and Mushrooms and covered with White Bercy Sauce. (Entre and vegetable choices are not settled at this writing.) There will be a maximum of 175 Banquet Tickets, so be sure of getting yours now by sending in \$3.00 to reserve a ticket. 
