

The Edgewater is many miles from the nearest fan haven where you might ordinarily save hotel fees by sleeping on the couch. Unless, of course, you don't mind spending your contime driving back and forth instead of drinking and filk-singing at late, late far parties at the hotel.

The hotel has 200 sleeping rooms, approximately half of which have been put on reserve in a block for the Westercon. But these rooms will not be held on reserve longer than June 1, 1965, because this is prime tourist season for any beach town hotel.

FRITZ LEIBER TO SPEAK

At 2pm on Saturday, July 3, immediately following the Opening Ceremonies of the Westercon XVIII, Fritz Leiber will speak on "Swords Against Blasters."

On this subject, Fritz comments, "People expecting to hear a gun-club discussion along the lines of '.25 Beretta vs. Walther PPK, or Did James Bond Get Rooked By the Armorer?' will be disappointed. Likewise those looking forward to a thrust-by-thrust description of all of John Carter's sword and radium gun conflicts on Mars. No, I shall attempt to throw light on such questions as:

- 1. Why is Damon Knight thumbs down (and a-stompin' with his little boots, too) on H. P. Lovecraft?
 - 2. Is atomic doom worse than a plague of vampires?
- 3. Is hard science fiction soft-headed about humanity's chances in the cosmos?
- 4. Can anyone read Clark Ashton Smith and not become a pessimist?
- 5. Does the hero always run away from the problem in horror stories?
- 6. Will Kimball Kinnison ever ride the Nova Ex-Press? Zwilniks vs. Beatniks? (and how did Doc know about "niks" a quarter century ago?) [I suppose it's just an old Russian or Yiddish suffix].

Well if I write any more questions, I'll give away the whole talk. Maybe I already have. But I'll hope to have a surprise or two up my sleeve come Westercon." RELAXATION is the word for Westercon XVIII, and this includes the committee! We've tried to keep the program from interfering with the fan-gab [the prime reason for attending a con] while providing enough events to entertain everyone. There will be plenty of time to visit the bar, the art show, take a quick dip in the pool or head for the beach, and still make most of the program items.

Quality instead of quantity will be the keynote! RAY BRADBURY will speak on Sunday afternoon, just prior to the Meet the Author Social. LEN MOFFATT & WALT DAUGHERTY will hold several auctions. KATYA HULAN will wear her Yellow Dress and raffle off art for the Institute for Specialized Literature. BJO TRIMBLE will direct the West Coast artists' display of Project art Show.

To further committee relaxation, we have asked Anthony Boucher to be Parliamentarian and conduct the Business Meeting, which should gurantee a well-run session.

There will be movies, displays, and other items for your pleasure and interest.




THE COSTUME BALL
