


Film programming will run from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM, break for dinner, recommence at 8:00 PM and run until approximately 3:00 AM daily.

The Garden Court

Banquet

Our banquet will be Saturday, July 7th at noon in the Garden Court of the Sheraton-Palace.

In lieu of rubber chicken, we have decided to simply have a private sitting of the traditional Garden Court buffet.

The buffet consists of:

- *Several kinds of salads
- *Fresh fruits
- *Cold sturgeon and salmon
- *Fresh baked croissants and breads
- *Eggs Florentine
- *Scrambled eggs
- *Crepes with cheese
- *Bacon and sausage
- *Hawaiian fish in sauce
- *Roast beef cut to order
- *Ham cut to order
- *The dessert table (Including chocolate, mint, lemon and strawberry Mousses and various cakes and English trifle with raspberry and chocolate sauces)

The banquet will start at noon, we're allowing an hour for eating, then we will have what awards and ceremony seem appropriate.

Cost of the banquet is \$12.50 per person, including tax and tip. Wine is *not* included in the above price, but is available.

Tickets are very limited, the room only seats 300 people for such a dinner. We recommend that you send for your banquet tickets as soon as you decide that you are interested. Tickets, if available, will be on sale at the convention until noon on Friday.

How To Get To The Hotel

From the Airport:

There are two inexpensive and easy ways from SFO to the hotel;

- 1) The Airporter bus service to downtown SF costs (as of this writing) \$1.75 and takes you to about 10 blocks from the hotel.
- 2) Limosine service straight to the hotel costs \$4.50 for adults, \$2.75 for kids (twelve and under).

Personally, I have to recommend the limo service, strictly for convenience sake. People at the airport will be able to tell you where to get these buses, we can't now, as where you pick the service up depends on just what airline you are using to come in.

By Car:

Follow 101 north. It then splits and the signs say Broadway around 15th St. and becomes 480/80. Continue on to the Main Street exit which deposits you at the intersection of Main and Mission. Go straight one block to Market Street, turn left. Hotel is on the corner of Montgomery and Market.

Bart:

The hotel is right on top of the Montgomery St. Bart Station.

Muni Railway:


Any Market St. bus or streetcar goes directly to the hotel.

Site Selection:

Along with this PR, you should have received a site selection ballot. If you are a member of Westercon 32 and wish to vote on the site of Westercon 34 (1981) and cannot attend the Westercon to vote, please fill out the site selection ballot and mail the ballot back to Westercon 32. The ballot *must* be accompanied by a check made out to Westercon 34 in the amount of \$5.00 (U.S.). If you are not a member of Westercon 32 and wish to vote by mail, you must join this Westercon in order to vote.

Huckster Room

Huckster tables are \$30.00 per table, with a maximum of six tables per dealer. Each of the first three tables includes one membership, (i.e., a maximum of three memberships even if you buy four tables).

Tables are now on sale and we do not expect to have tables for sale at the Westercon.

If you need special electrical outlets or any other kind of special aparatus, please let us know *immediately* (if not sooner).

If you are planning to sell records or tapes and wish to have them available to be listened to, you *must* have earphones. We are trying to discourage loud noises in the huckster room.

Parking

There is no parking available at the Sheraton-Palace hotel, none at all.

There is a drop-off zone near the New Montgomery side entrance to the hotel for passenger pick-up and luggage. There is a commercial entrance in the rear of the hotel for dealer needs.

The nearest inexpensive parking garages are (nearest) on Mission Street, between Fourth and Fifth Streets (the garage takes up the whole block) and (further) at Sutter and Stockton Streets. Both are city owned garages and are relatively cheap (35¢ per hour, \$2.50 per day — as of this writing). Both garages are far enough away that we recommend baggage drop-off, but both are within a couple of blocks of the hotel.
