Westercon 43 will be using two main hotels, the Red Lion Inn/Columbia River and the Red Lion Inn/Jantzen Beach. Rest assured that these hotels are closer together than distance from one end the other of either of them. They share a common parking lot with plenty of free parking space. Both are located on the Columbia River which should provide pleasant gathering spots on the decks. Of course, they both have outdoor pools and the Jantzen Beach has tennis courts. Yes, believe it or not, Oregon usually has dry weather in July!

Because of the exceptional fireworks display directly across the river, room availability will be very limited for the night of the 4th. Rooms for before the 5th and suites throughout the convention will have to be arranged through the committee. However, we have arranged to have rooms available at the Delta Inn on the 4th. There will also be rooms available throughout the convention at a rate that is considerably less than the Red Lions. The Delta Inn is 1.5 miles away by freeway. They have a 15 passenger van and will run it to the Red Lions hourly, 24 hours a day.

The tentative plan is to have some meeting space available for Wednesday evening so that early arrivals will have a place to gather and watch the fireworks. More information will be available as the time gets nearer.

The Columbia River will be the non-party hotel, while Jantzen Beach will be the party hotel. Programming will be distributed to both hotels with the art show in the Columbia River and the dealers' room in the Jantzen Beach.

WEAPONS POLICY

In line with the Standard Practice at most major conventions, including recent World conventions, the carrying and wearing of weapons will not be permitted, except as part of a Masquerade costume, or as part of other designated events, and then only during the event, or in transit to and from the event. The use of a weapon as part of the Masquerade must be discussed with the Masquerade Director prior to the event. Failure to do so are grounds for immediate expulsion from the convention.

The Convention Committee defines as weapons any object designed to cause bodily harm, or any replica of such an object and any other object the Committee determines to be dangerous. However the Committee reserves the right to amend this definition of a weapon, and the right to impound weapons for the duration of the convention.

Any weapons purchased in the Dealer's room must be securely wrapped.

The Committee realizes that most people who would like to carry and wear weapons are sensible and careful individuals. However because of the present liability laws, the risk of weapons causing accident or distress, and to preserve relationships with convention hotels, we have had to adopt this policy. The safety of convention members has to be our overriding consideration.

It is a condition of our contract with the Red Lion Inns that Westercon 43 be a weaponless convention.

FREE GIFT CERTIFICATE

Because inquiring minds want to know, all names of members who complete the enclosed questionnaire and return it by September 30 will go into a drawing for a \$20 gift certificate good at either Red Lion. The purpose is to determine if there is interest in special tours and events and to help us determine which ones will be most likely to succeed. Progress Reports mailed after September 30 will not contain the questionnaire.

Information on Westercon 43's Masquerade will be available later this year. Please let us know if you wish to be put on the mailing list.

Westercon 43 will have available some form of Child Care. Your input into how we can best provide it is requested.

With two hotels, we will have two Hospitality style suites. The one in the Jantzen Beach (party) will be similar to that at major West Coast conventions. The Club House in the Columbia River (non-party) will share a set of rooms with Fannish Programing and the Fanzine Room.

We hope to have two channels of video in both hotels. This will be available to all hotel guests in their rooms and will be also shown on large screen televisions viewable by all convention members.

Westercon 43 is sponsored by Oregon Science Fiction Conventions, Inc. (OSFCI), a non-profit, tax-exempt corporation.

Westercon is a service mark of LASFS.

SITE SELECTION

April 15, 1990 is the deadline for filing a bid for the 1992 Westercon. To be a valid bid, you must have (at least) a Chair, a Treasurer, and a letter of intent or signed contract from the facility. Send all this information to the Westercon 43 address.

For a site to be eligible, it must be located on the North American continent (or Hawaii), be west of the 104th Meridian, and in the Southern subregion (south of 37 degrees North--a line which extends along the northern border of Arizona to the Pacific Coast just north of Monterey). If no valid bid is filed by January 1, 1990, then both subregions (North as well as South) are eligible. (However, under no circumstances is a site within 75 miles of the Westercon 43 site eligible.)

The final ballots will be distributed with Progress Report #4, which will be mailed on or before May 10, 1990. All supporting and full attending members of Westercon 43 are eligible to vote.

Through July 25, 1989, no bids have been filed for 1992.
