

the Hotel

The FRANCISCO TORRES is unlike any convention hotel ever -- for one thing, it's not a hotel at all! Built only two years ago, adjacent to the University of California at Santa Barbara, the Torres is a co-ed student residence complex. During the summer, the student population drops about 75%, and the Torres is opened up to conventions and conferences.

We will have all of one of the twin residence towers, and can utilize some of the other tower if necessary. ALL of the Francisco Torres' convention and conference facilities will be available to use as we see fit, a full twenty-four hours a day!

The staff of the Francisco Torres is largely made up of young college-age people, who are friendly, and courteous, and smile a lot; a groovy crew, totally unlike the boiled owls which are standard in most hotels.

The Torres is air-conditioned, has a high-volume ice-maker in each tower, and small refrigerators available for additional ice storage. For parties, there are even some sound-proof music rooms for intimate filk-singing sessions.


The pool is full Olympic-sized, going from 3 to 13 feet in depth, and will be open for the entire conference. The management has assured us that free - style Chaos games are okay, and they say we're welcome to try to fill the pool with beach balls. The pool is adjacent to the meeting room area, and the ample pool deck may be utilized for the fashion show and costume ball.

ROOM ARRANGEMENTS

Each room contains two single beds, double desk - dressers, two full closets, and a sink with mirror.

As shown, the tub-shower and commode facilities are shared by a similar room, next-door.

For purposes of interpreting the room rate schedule, note that we are talking about the occupancy of the room; a single room, then, is one two-bed room occupied by one person. The phrase double room means a two-bed room which is occupied by two persons... of course!



Innovation will be a keynote for Westercon 23; not just change for the sake of change. We are going to bring you new ideas in the program, along with a few items from years back which we were sorry to see fall away.

One innovation; a package plan arranged for Westercon. An old idea from professional and business conferences, this is the first time it has been applied to a science fiction conference.

The Westercon will have exclusive use of <u>all</u> conference facilities at the Francisco Torres from 6 p.m., July 2, through 7 p.m., on July 5, 1970. The rates quoted are for that time period, and the meals include scheduled meals in the hotel cafeteria on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Prices given are per person for the entire length of the conference.

At these low rates, the hotel cafeteria can not plan to accommodate those who take either plan E or F; they will have to eat in the coffee shop or out of the hotel.


