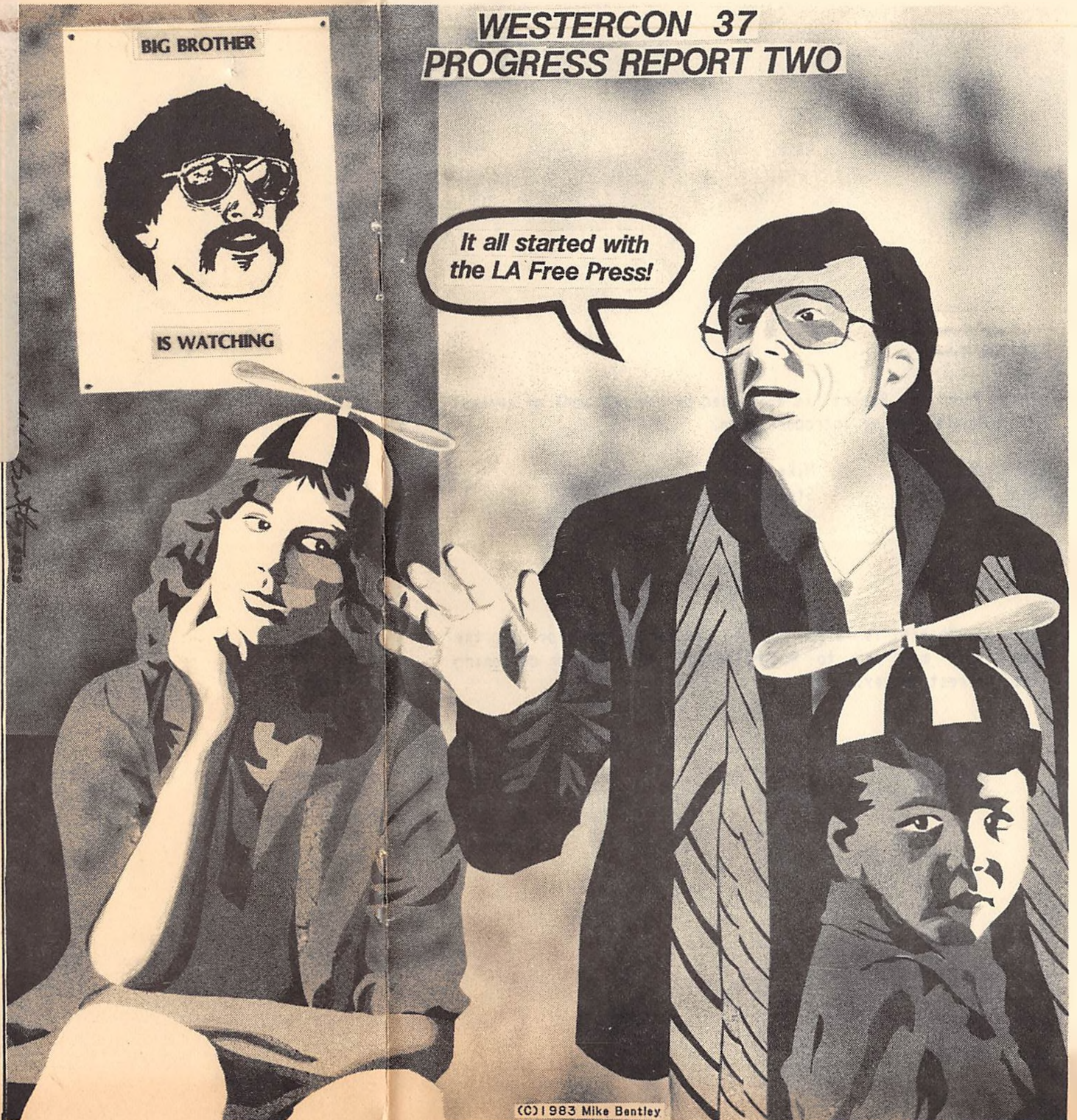

DEALER'S ROOM PULP-FILLED

The dealer's room was completely sold out in mid-July. This is the earliest sellout for any Westercon, despite the fact that we have 20 more tables than the average. If you missed getting a table, our waitlist is still short. Anyone returning a completed dealer reservation form will be placed on the waitlist. Do not send payment. We will request payment if space becomes available. If you need a dealer reservation form, write or call me directly. Once the waitlist contains enough dealers to replace any dealers who cancel, the waitlist will be closed.

I will complete the actual table layout within the next few weeks. While I will try to give everyone the location they requested, assignments will be made according to date of table purchase. Since wall space and electricity are limited, if you bought the 75th table and requested both, you may be disappointed. You should receive a complete layout of the room with your table assignment before October 1st.

If you have purchased a table and for some reason will be unable to attend Westercon 37, let me know in writing immediately. Your table cost is fully refundable and you will make someone on the waitlist very happy. (If for some reason we are unable to replace you from the waitlist, no refund will be issued.)

Judging from which dealers bought tables, this will be the best Westercon for books in nearly a decade. About half the tables were sold to book sellers, with the rest evenly distributed amongst jewelry, art and ephemera dealers. Since I have been attending conventions for over a dozen years, I remember the days when a hucksters' room wasn't a hucksters' room unless you were overwhelmed by the smell of disintegrating pulp paper when you walked in... At any rate I am pleased with the decidedly literate emphasis of this year's dealer's room.

PROGRAMMING SURVEYS INTERESTS

So far most of you who have joined have done so at or through the two previous WesterCons. So, I don't need to tell you about the kind of programming and activities that usually occur at these conventions and will occur at WesterCon 37. I would like to comment on some of the less usual events we hope to sponsor or arrange.

One of the charming points of the Portland Marriott is the flexibility of the space and the large numbers of meeting rooms freed by using the Exhibit Hall for the Dealer's and Art Show. What shall we do with all that space? Among other things, we hope to have more demonstrations and more small, special interest meetings. Rooms may also be scheduled for unusually long time-periods for on-going projects, workshops, or displays.

Our task in the Programming Department is to arrange for these things and to co-ordinate the timing and space requirements at the convention. We are not omniscient, however, and we genuinely welcome your input in this process. Feel free to send us your ideas for programming, or your special areas of expertise that might be shared.

At the center of this Progress Report you will find an interest survey for possible "extracurricular" activities ranging from flights over Mt. St. Helens to a Portland Pub Crawl. Some of these might be scheduled during the con, while others would be arranged to happen just before or after the convention (official dates are June 29 - July 3, 1984.) Please respond now to this questionnaire so that we may make proper arrangements in advance--some "touristy" types of activities do get booked up early.

Since our theme is "1984--a look at utopias and dystopias," we would like to hear from writers, politician, academicians and others with ideas or knowledge on the subject. Please send a note to me at our P.O. Box. We are also compiling a "1984 File" of newspaper clippings, magazine articles and the like and we would be glad to accept your contributions.

NOTES FROM OPERATIONS

WEAPONS POLICY

It is impossible to please everyone when it comes to the issue of weapons policy. We have given much thought to the reasons for such policies and hope to approach the issue in an equitable manner.

1. Peace ties are voluntary as a symbol of respect to the house entered, not mandatory.

2. Security will be focusing their attention on inappropriate behaviour whether it involves weapons or not. This includes, but is not limited to:

- a) Running anywhere in the hotel complex
- b) Brandishing of a weapon in a public area other than the masquerade and weapons display areas. See masquerade rules for specifics.
- c) Any behavior that obstructs traffic flow such as elevator parties, locking off elevators, punching unnecessary elevator buttons, blocking stairs or escalators, etc.
- d) Altercations/fighting of either a physical or verbal nature
- e) Damaging property belonging to the hotel, the convention or another individual
- f) Behavior contrary to hotel policy or civil law

3. No projectiles, including lasers, incendiary devices, or unsheathed blades will be allowed whatsoever.

Security exists for the few who have yet to learn basic social etiquette. Hopefully, by redirecting emphasis to the problem areas, responsible fans will be able to better enjoy the convention.

A note to responsible fans: peer pressure can be a very effective deterrent to irresponsible behaviors.

HOTEL FACILITIES

Progress Report #3 will include hotel reservation card for the Marriott. It will include a party/non-party section that we would appreciate your remembering to mark. Partying in designated areas will be as sacrosanct as possible but outside the party block--you're on your own.

All suites are reserved through the hotel liason. Large suites are tentative as to availability but the hotel has 24 parlor suites for as little as \$60 per night.

The Marriott rates well for handicap accessibility. It would help us though, to know your special needs so we can better accomodate you.

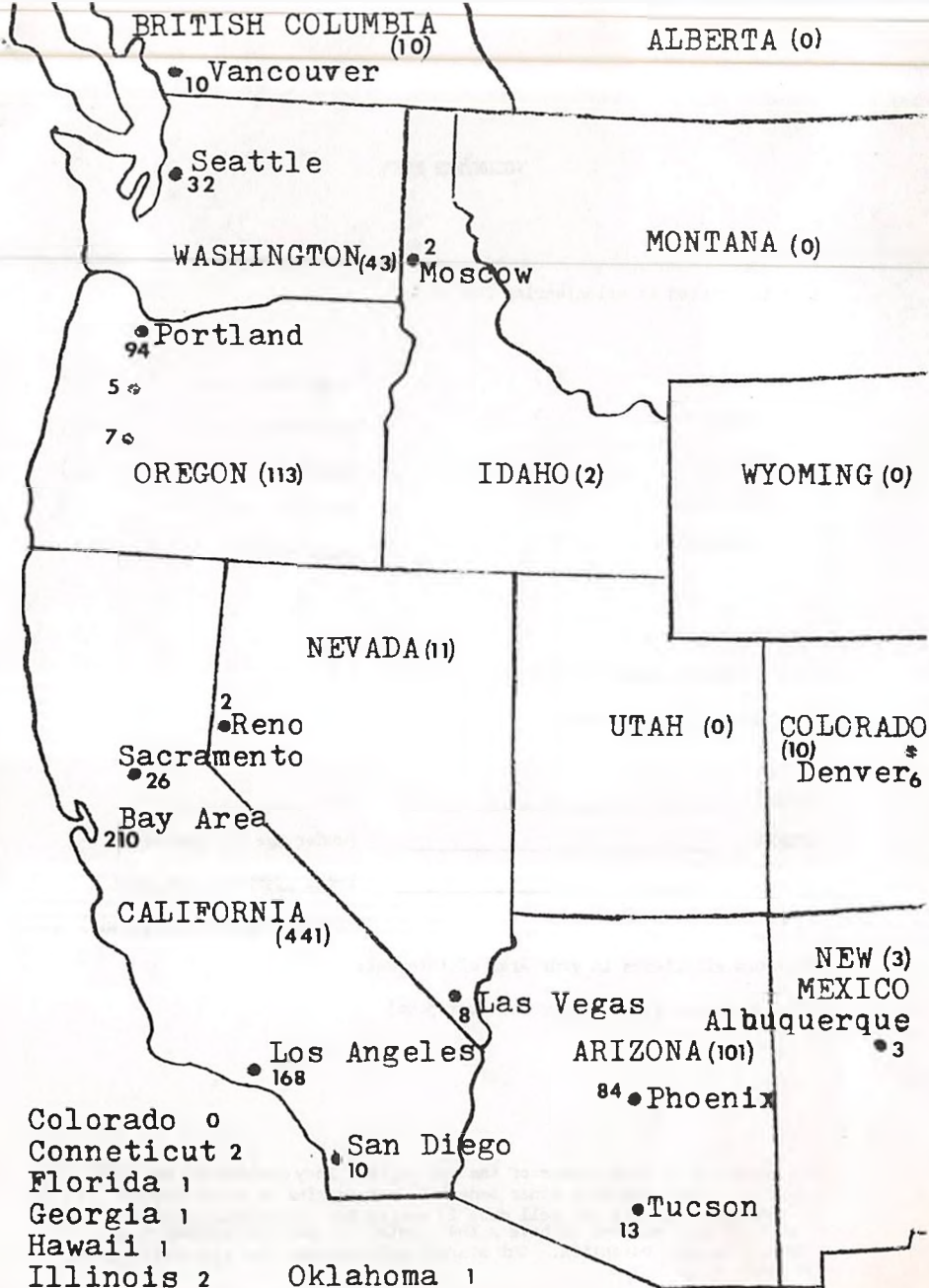

HUGE AREA FOR ART SHOW

The 1984 Portland WesterCon Art Show may well be the largest art show ever seen on the West Coast. It will be held in what is normally the underground parking area in the Portland Marriott Hotel, although when we get through with it, it won't look anything like a parking area. The room available is positively HUGE; we'll have up to 12,000 square feet of space to set up in! Lighting is excellent and the aisles will be carpeted.

We will have 24-hour security throughout the convention. There are two doors leading to the art show area, but one of them will be locked during the Con. The other will have security people at it at all times and we plan to have roving security through the art show when it is open.

There will be a small space set aside for people to sit, talk and relax with other art fans and artists. Plans are being made for an artist's reception, however, at this time, it is not certain whether this will take place in the art show room or in conjunction with the author's reception.

ART SHOW RULES

1. Since this will be a Science Fiction/Fantasy convention, your art should reflect this.
2. Art in all media will be accepted, though if you intend to send or bring pieces of an unusually large or special nature, we will need to know in advance. All flat art should be ready to hang, matted or framed and with a hanging device attached. If it's not ready to hang, it WILL NOT get hung. Identification must be attached; this should include the artist's name and address and the name of the piece. Signed, numbered, and matted prints will be accepted, but only one of each design. Tables and lights will be provided for 3-D works.

3. There will NOT be a sketch table in the art show.

4. Space will be allocated by the art show director on a first come, first served basis. Artwork from out-of-town will be hung by the art show committee (See #6 for entry dates) and sufficient return postage must accompany your work. Out-of-town entrants must have at least a supporting membership to 1984 Oregon WesterCon.

5. Custom name badges will be hung in a special area, most likely in constant sight of security, and will not be included in the space or piece count of registered artists. (See #6) There will also be a table in the art show room for artists to do custom name badges. This will be publicized to the convention members. Any artist interested must be registered in the art show and must be scheduled for Friday and Saturday. This time will be posted in the art show. There will be no additional charge and all fees for badges will be retained by the artists. Artists will have to provide their own materials, however.

6. Fees -- All artists who wish to hang their work, whether for sale or not, must be registered. Please do this as soon as possible. The entry fee will be \$5.00 until June 15, 1984. This fee entitles the artist to hang no more than one 4'x4' panel or nine pieces, whichever is smaller, or, for three-dimensional pieces, 4'x2.5' of tablespace or nine pieces. If needed, extra space is available for an additional fee of \$5.00 for the second panel or table space and \$7.50 for the third, or 50 cents per piece. No more than three panels or 12'x2.5' tablespace will be sold to an individual artist. Fees will be doubled on June 15 and entries received after that date will be accepted only on a space-available basis. When you register, you will be sent a packet containing all the information you will need for entering the actual artwork.

7. Auctions -- The auctions will be fairly short; not more than 2 hours. Any piece with more than one bid on it will go to auction and auction lists will be available at least two hours before each auction. The convention commission will be 10%. Art buyers may pick up their purchases right after the last auction and artists two hours after that. Payment will

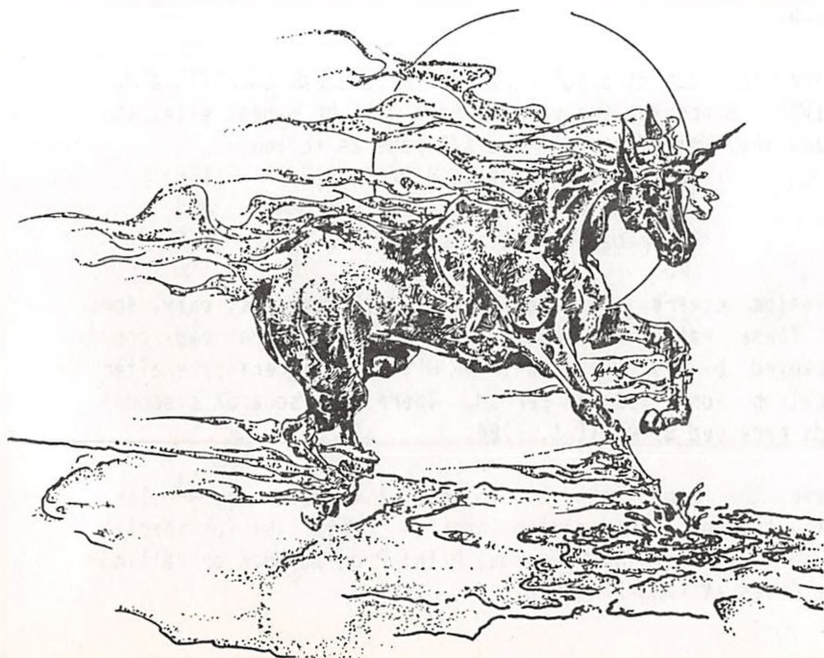

8. Awards -- There will be several awards given out during the show: Best Science Fiction, Best Fantasy, Best Three Dimensional, Best of Show (determined by artists' vote) and People's Choice. There also will be a special award for the Best 1984 Illustration.

9. We will have a "Quick Sale" procedure for interested artists; write for details.

10. Many of these rules have some flexibility built into them...but only on an individual basis and then only if you contact me well in advance of the convention with your problem. Be sure to write me if you have any questions, and if it seems to be an emergency, call me a 208-882-3672. Not collect, please.
