# Greetings!

I've agreed to organize 1 of the panels for WisCon 11 (1987 Feb. 20-22 at the Concourse Hotel), and you have kindly agreed to be on it. WisCon and I thank you for your participation. The purpose of this letter is to let you know a little bit more about the panel in advance of the convention.

# A Brief Description

The description of the panel which will appear in the WisCon 11 program book will probably bear a strong resemblance to the following rough draft that I submitted to the PB editor (and, with any sort of luck, the panel will bear some sort of resemblance to the description):

Cheating the Reader. Moderator: Richard S. Russell; Panelists: Phil Davenport, Laura Spiess, Peter Winz; Time: 55 min.; handouts. The panelists will contend that readers have certain reasonable expectations when they pick up a new book, and that books which fail to meet those expectations have cheated the reader. Examples include conclusionless books, inadequately researched books, and remakes.

#### Ambience

I've found that panels, once they get rolling, tend to take on a life of their own, and nobody ever gets unduly concerned if they don't match the PB descriptions all that closely. It's more important to make the panel lively and interesting than to have it meet some pre-established expectation.

For whatever it's worth, I'm a strong believer in the value of audience participation, and the audiences at WisCon are usually more than happy to chime in at the least provocation.

#### Handouts

I'm planning on distributing the enclosed handouts at the panel. I thought you'd like to get an advance look at them.

You are certainly welcome to distribute materials which you deem appropriate to the panel, tho you must be personally responsible for acquiring and paying for them and transporting them to WisCon.

#### Green Room

WisCon has a "green room", a place set aside for panelists to gather in advance of their events, meet each other, compare notes, plan tactics (speaking order, length of presentations, etc.), relax, drink coffee, and draw a deep breath before going on. I encourage you to take advantage of the green room prior to our panel. I'll be there. (Check the Pocket Program, which you will receive upon your arrival at WisCon, for the location of the green room and the time of the panel.)
