
Overheard at the Midnight Vampire Panel: "The Crusades [were a] moral morass of messy nastiness.".

Attendance Tops 700

The semi-final registration report shows 554 pre-registrations, of whom 42 didn't check in. There were 140 more registrations at the door on Friday and another 47 on Saturday before the registration staff closed up shop. However, several additional people materialized even after that, so the final registration count will undoubtedly be even higher than the 741 derived from adding the above figures. Attendance was 699 plus those later arrivals.
