#### Wiscon MOVES dOWNTOWN

Just in case you haven't heard yet, Wiscon 17 will once again be held downtown at the Concourse Hotel. The Concourse is just one block off the capitol square, in the downtown shopping district. It's only a 15 minute drive from Dane County Regional Airport, and about the same distance from I-90/94. There is an undergroung parking ramp which is free for guests of the hotel, and a public parking ramp a half block away with 500 additional spaces. The Concourse does not allow pets. Room rates are \$63 single/\$73 dou-

# Wiscon Hosts Second James Tiptree Jr. Award, March 5-7, 1993

The James Tiptree Jr. Award was conceived by Karen Joy Fowler and Wiscon 15 GoH Pat Murphy, who used her GoH speech at Wiscon 15 to announce the creation of the award. It is named for the late Alice Sheldon (who wrote under the pseudonym of James Tiptree Jr.), and goes to the best science fiction or fantasy work which deals with gender roles.

Wiscon 16 was the host for the first ceremony, which was attended by approximately 200 people. This year we will be hosting a dessert banquet in conjunction with the second annual award ceremony. Seating will be open after the banquet, but those attending the banquet will get the best seats.

#### GUESTS

Kristine Kathryn Rusch was nominated for two Hugo awards in 1992, Best Editor, and Best Novella ("The Gallery of His Dreams"). Her first convention was a Wiscon, and she worked at WORT radio here in Madison. She co-founded Pulphouse, the hardback magazine, with Dean Wesley Smith, and succeeded Edward Ferman as the editor of The Magazine of Fantasy and Science Fic-

Lois McMaster Bujold is the Hugo award-winning author of the 'Miles Vorkosigan' series. The Vor Game won the Hugo for Best Novel in 1991, and Barrayar has won the Hugo for Best Novel for 1992.

We are also expecting Pat Murphy (who is getting to be a regular), and Eleanor Arnason (one of the winners of last year's James Tiptree Jr. Award), along with many others.
