

Hello, Potential Program Participant:

This year's WisCon, our 20th, is going to be held over the Memorial Day weekend, May 24-27 1996. It'll start Friday around 6 pm and end with a late-afternoon barbecue on Monday. We're attracting a lot of interest this year: the Fifth Tiptree Award will be presented at WisCon 20, we're featuring Ursula K. Le Guin as our Guest of Honor, and we've invited all our past guests to return as well. To celebrate with us, a large number of interesting and prominent personages from feminist and SF professional, academic, and fannish circles are also going to attend [see back page].

You're getting this flier because we're interested in you participating in the programming process. We want to give you some idea of what we're up to, and we'd like your ideas and feedback.

We have some very specific goals this year. We want to avoid putting people on the same old panels. We want participants to be enthusiastic about the program, not bored with it. We also want to broaden the scope of our program, to take advantage of the wealth of perspective we'll have at WisCon 20.

At last year's WisCon 19, we experimented with single-person program events. We wanted people to be able to share their passions, so we ran everything from slide shows to lectures to demonstrations to book discussions alongside the traditional panels. They all worked out great, which encourages us to fiddle with programming formats some more. This year we want to try two- or three-person conversations, academic papers, and mixed-format presentations.

We're trying to open up a lot of room within which you can find something comfortable to do as part of the WisCon program. If you're obsessed with something these days, let us know, and we'll make room for you to talk about it. If you've got a friend (or friendly foe) or two with whom you're having a fun and interesting ongoing discussion, we want to help you have part of it in public. If you'd like to do a reading, present a paper, lead a book discussion, or help stage some other kind of special event, let us know about that, too.

Of course, we're also interested in your panel ideas. We could easily have twice as many people at this year's WisCon as we had last year. Since we value smaller panels within which conversation can develop, we'd prefer to expand the number of panels instead of their sizes. That means we need more ideas than ever, and we need your help coming up with them.

We're looking for ideas that are both practically and theoretically interesting. Some of the areas we're specially interested in are:
