Guest of Honor . . .

WisCon is pleased to present Melissa Scott as our Guest of Honor for this year's convention. She is the author of *Trouble and Her Friends* and *Sbadow Man*, which both won the Lambda Literary Award for Gay/Lesbian Science Fiction. *Trouble and Her Friends* was also on the Tiptree short list. Her most recent works are *Night Sky Mine* and, with Lisa A. Barnett, *Point of Hopes*. Her earlier novels include *Dreamships*, *Mighty Good Road*, *Burning Bright*, *Five-Twelfths of Heaven*, *Silence in Solitude* and (also with Lisa A. Barnett) *The Armor of Light*. She won the John W. Campbell Award for Best New Writer in 1986).

Scott is an ideal WisCon guest of honor because her works focus on gender, sexuality, class, and social and personal change. They're wonderful entertainment, and they'll generate lots of discussion and great convention programming. If you haven't read her books, buy them and do so. Then come to WisCon and let's talk.

Programming...

WisCon's programming will focus on feminism and gender issues in science fiction and fantasy, and will be the centerpiece of the convention. To provide the opportunity for intimate discussions within a large convention, several items will be scheduled simultaneously during Saturday and Sunday afternoons, including complete tracks of readings, academic papers, single-person presentations, and discussions. We're just beginning to collect ideas and would like to hear yours.

Evenings, we like to play. There may be drumming and filking parties, human pyramids, or a group reading of fannish works. Of course, there will be open parties each night. Contact program coordinators Jeanne Gomoll or Debbie Notkin if you have ideas for programming or if you're interested in hosting or participating in any of these events.

Film programming... The WisCon video program will focus on woman-centered themes. We also invite participants for panel discussions about the films and suggestions of films we should include.

Kids programming. . . The kid-oriented programming will be aimed at ages 6-12, and will include fantasy games, arts and crafts, musical activities, discussions with authors and of favorite books, and other items developed by and for kids.

Special Events. . . In addition to opening ceremonies on Friday evening, there will also be a guest of honor speech. And, because Monday is Memorial Day, we're planning a relaxing, outdoor "dead dog" party (weather permitting).

The James Tiptree, Jr. Award will not be presented at WisCon 21. Instead, it will be presented at the International Conference on the Fantastic, which will be held March 19-23, 1997, in Fort Lauderdale, FL. We do plan, though, to have a Tiptree auction and bake sale and Tiptree-related programming.

Finally, if you're interested in throwing an open party in the hotel, please contact the WisCon staff about the free party parlors, which will be assigned to publishers, bid committees, and fan groups.

Hotel... The Concourse Hotel is located at 1 West Dayton Street, Madison. W1 53703; phone 800-356-8293. Room rates are \$80 per night for up to four people. We expect a large attendance at this year's con, so please book your rooms early, and mention "WisCon 1997" when you call.

The Concourse is a handicapped-accessible hotel: call for specific information about accessibility. Smoke-free rooms are available upon request. The hotel is located in the heart of Madison, so there are plenty of restaurants, shops, and interesting people and places within easy walking. The Saturday Farmers' Market on the Capitol Square is a popular choice for breakfast browsing.

Deciers Room... Tables are \$25 for one table, \$30 for the second, and \$35 for the third. All dealers must be WisCon members, and convention registration is not included in the table fee. Please contact Hank Luttrell (608-251-6226) during business hours for information about reserving dealers space, equipment availability, and other details.

Child Care . . . WisCon 21 will hire professional child-care providers and offer daytime child care for attendees with child care memberships, which are available at the same cost as regular adult attending memberships. Please note: Your child *must* have a child-care membership to use child care, and child-care memberships *must* be purchased in advance.

Volunteers . . . You can save \$20 by working for six hours or more at the convention. Register at the regular rate, and a refund will be mailed to you after the convention. Consider helping with setting or cleaning up, security, the con suite, or other areas. The volunteer coordinator will contact you to set up your schedule.

WisCon Art Show . . . We hope to have a limited art show this year, focusing on the convention's themes and showing feminist science fiction work, work by women artists, and work by Wisconsin and Midwestern artists. Plans are still in the works, so write for information or to volunteer.

Special bonus... On the weekend immediately following WisCon, the American Booksellers Association convention will be held in Chicago. In case you want to attend both, the Concourse will offer the WisCon convention room rates through Thursday, May 28. Consider staying in Madison for the extra days, and then heading for Chicago and the ABA.
