Hello, Potential Program Participant:

This year's WisCon, our 21st, is going to be held over the Memorial Day weekend, May 23-26 1997. It'll start late in the afternoon on Friday and, if the skies are clear, will end with an afternoon outdoor dead dog party on Monday. The great word of mouth generated by the success of WisCon 20 will draw many of last year's participants to return. We're featuring Melissa Scott and Susanna Sturgis as our guests of honor. You're getting this flier because we're hoping you're interested in participating in the programming process. We want to give you some idea of what we're up to, and we'd like your ideas and feedback.

We have some very specific goals this year. We hope to have a high percentage of panels which are generated by the panelists' interest, rather than the programming committee's guesses. To that end, we're offering you the opportunity to "champion" a panel: you will choose the topic, gather a group of panelists, discuss the subject matter with them before the convention, and even write the program book blurb. If you would rather not champion a panel, we still hope you will suggest panel ideas and express your priorities for placement on the panels that are finally chosen. But most of all, we want participants to be enthusiastic about the program, not bored with it, which will help make attendees enthusiastic about the program. And we want to build upon the incredible breadth of the programs devised by WisCon 20's programming committee.

This year we will be responding to people's pleas for more generous time allotments for panel discussions and a little more breathing time. Programs will generally last 75 minutes with a 15 minute break between programs. There will be two meal breaks on Saturday and Sunday, during which no programming will be scheduled. You'll be able to go out to lunch without fearing that you will miss an important panel!

At WisCon 19 and 20, we experimented successfully with single-person events, two- or three-person conversations, academic papers, and mixed-format presentations. We wanted people to be able to share their passions, so we ran everything from slide shows to lectures to demonstrations to book discussions alongside the traditional panels. They all worked out great. We'll do that again this year. Please feel free to make suggestions.

We're trying to open up a lot of room within which you can find something comfortable to do as part of the WisCon program. If you're obsessed with something interesting these days, let us know, and we'll make room for you to talk about it. If you've got a friend (or friendly foe) or two with whom you're having a fun and interesting ongoing discussion, we want make it possible for WisCon attendees to hear it. If you'd like to do a reading, present a paper, lead a book discussion, or help stage some other kind of special event, let us know about that, too.

Of course, we're also interested in your panel ideas. We're looking for ideas that are both practically and theoretically interesting. Some of the areas we're specially interested in are:
