Hotel

The Concourse Hotel is located at 1 W. Dayton St., Madison, WI 53703; phone 800-356-8293 or 608-257-6000. Room rates are \$85 per night for up to four people. WisCon 23 filled up the hotel last year, and we expect that rooms will sell out again for WisCon 24, so please book your rooms early and mention "WisCon 2000" when you call.

The Concourse is a handicapped-accessible hotel; call for specific information about accessibility. Smoke-free rooms are available upon request. The hotel is located in the heart of Madison, so there are plenty of restaurants, shops, and interesting people and places within easy walking distance. The Saturday Farmers' Market on the Capitol Square is a popular choice for breakfast browsing.

Volunteers

Getting to Madison

- ➡ On the Ground. Madison is located in south central Wisconsin, and the city is accessible via several major highways. Madison is
- ♦ 1 ½ hour drive from Milwaukee (via I-94)
- ♦ 2 ½ hour drive from Chicago (via I-90)
- 4 ½ hour drive from Minneapolis/St. Paul (via I-94)

From the North via Interstate 90/94 (Minneapolis, LaCrosse, Wausau, Stevens Point, Portage): take I-90 to the Hwy. 151 exit (southwest) going toward the State Capitol. You will then be on E. Washington Ave.

From the Northeast via Hwy. 151 (Green Bay, Fox River Valley): follow Hwy. 151 toward the State Capitol. You will then be on E. Washington Ave.

From the East via Interstate 94 (Milwaukee): as you approach the city, follow Hwy. 30 into Madison, Take the "State Capitol" exit off of Hwy. 30, and you will then be on E. Washington Ave.

From the Southeast via Interstate 90 (Chicago, Beloit, Janesville): take the Hwy. 12&18 (Beltline) exit to Madison. Exit at John Nolen Drive and follow that drive underneath the Frank Lloyd Wright Convention Center. Turn left at the second light onto E. Washington Ave.

From the Southwest via Hwys. 18 & 151 (Dubuque, Platteville, Dodgeville): take the John Nolan Dr. exit north and follow that drive underneath the Frank Lloyd Wright Convention Center. Turn left at the second light onto E. Washington Ave.

From E. Washington Ave. head toward the State Capitol. Two blocks before the Capitol turn right onto Webster St., after two blocks follow the traffic and turn left at the light onto Dayton St. (90° angle, don't take Hamilton). The Concourse is on the left after two blocks. Free parking is available under the hotel to all registered hotel guests. Additional parking is available in the public parking ramp a ½ block down Dayton at Dayton and Carroll St.

By Bus. Van Galder (1-800-747-0994) runs regular service from Chicago's O'Hare Airport and from the Chicago Amtrak Station to the Memorial Union in Madison, which is about 10 blocks from the Concourse. Tickets can be purchased from the driver.

Badger Coaches (1-608-255-6771) has service from the Milwaukee Airport to Madison, with a stop at the Memorial Union.

Once at the Memorial Union you may call the Concourse (257-6000) to catch a ride on the hotel's shuttle, walk about a mile up State Street, or take a cab from Union Cab (242-2000) or Badger Cab (256-5566).

By Train. If you make Madison your final destination, Amtrak (1-800-USA-RAIL) includes thruway motor coach service from Chicago in the ticket price (see by bus).

★ By Air. Dane County Regional Airport, located minutes from downtown Madison, offers more than 75 daily flights. Airlines that serve the Madison area include: American Eagle/American (800-433-7300), Chicago Express /ATA (800-435-9282), Comair/Delta (800-354-9822), Continental (800-525-0280), Midwest Express (800-452-2022), Northwest Airlines (800-225-2525), TWE (800-221-2000), and United (800-241-6522).

The Concourse runs a shuttle from 7 am to 11 pm for arriving guests, with a courtesy phone in the baggage claim area. Allow 15-20 minutes for it to arrive and meet it directly outside the baggage claim doors.

Creativity Track

Even if you didn't send in a manuscript or drawing for the critique groups, feel free to join us on Friday afternoon as the Creativity Track continues with open sessions for writers and artists of all skill levels.

Artists' Skills Workshops. On Friday afternoon, famed Wiscon artists Erin McKee and Jorjet Harper will lead a workshop on sketching live models wearing different kinds of clothing. This is strictly a BYOS event (Bring Your Own Sketchbook) -- everyone who walks in the door will be put right to work.

Writers' Skills Workshops Also on Friday afternoon, the incomparable Delia Sherman will lead a skills workshop for writers on characterization. This is strictly a BYON event (Bring Your Own Notebook) -- everyone who walks in the door will be put right to work.

Living Rooms On Saturday, Sunday, and Monday, the creativity track will sponsor living rooms of special interest to artists and writers. Writer and cancer survivor Kathleen M. Massie-Ferch will lead Writing When Everything Gets In The Way, artist Joyce DiBona will lead Doing Art Despite it All, agent Jennifer Jackson will be on hand for Please Don't Hand Me a Manuscript in the Bathroom, writers/editors Terri Windling, Midori Snyder, and Heinz Insu Fenkl will lead The Endicott Studio Living Room, and Ellen Kushner and Delia Sherman will reprise Ellen and Delia's Living Room. Living rooms are closed-door discussions limited to 15. Signups will be posted on the door to the sixth-floor party room where the living rooms will be held.
