Philip K. Dick (1928-1982)

Philip K. Dick, Hugo-winning SF author, died March 2 near San Francisco, where he had been hospitalized following a stroke on Feb. 18. Dick won the 1962 Hugo for his novel The Man in the High Castle, about an alternative future in which Germany and Japan won World War 2 and then proceeded to conquer the United States as well. He also won the John W. Campbell Memorial Award for A Scanner Darkly. His novel Do Androids Dream of Electric Sheep? has been made into the movie Blade Runner, to be released later this year, and that development made it seem that Dick's career, always subject to more than even the usual ups and downs accorded to SF writers, was once again getting set to take off. Other Dick books, which featured his characteristic twist on the way reality is perceived, include Ubik, Dr. Bloodmoney, or How I Learned To Stop Worrying and Love the Bomb Martian Timeslip, and Our Friends from Frolix 8.
