

Chicon IV, the fortieth World Science Fiction Convention, will be held in Chicago on Labor Day Weekend, 1982, at the Hyatt Regency Chicago.

Art Show and Auction

Chicon IV will have an art show. We will charge a hanging fee, and sales commission, but the rates have not been set. To receive this information when it becomes available, write Elizabeth Pearse, c/o Chicon IV.

Too many art auctions become endurance contests that drag on into the early morning hours. Chicon IV will avoid this problem by spreading the auction over several days and nights. Every item in the art show will be marked to indicate which auction it will be sold in. Pieces will be returned to the art show after the auction for everyone's viewing until pick-up time.

Hotel

The Hyatt Regency Chicago is a first-class hotel and convention center located near the Loop, Lake Michigan, and Chicago's "Magnificent Mile," North Michigan Avenue. It offers two levels of convention and function space that provide ample room for programming, hucksters, meetings, and other fannish activities. The Hyatt Regency's penthouse-level Monarch Suite will be the Con Suite. The Monarch is divided into two large areas, with fireplaces and serving bars. It will be open throughout the convention about 20 hours a day.

Restaurants

The Hyatt has restaurants ranging from moderately-priced to very expensive. But if you prefer to explore, the selection is almost limitless. The Hyatt's excellent location near Chicago's fashionable North Michigan Avenue puts it close to a tremendous number and variety of restaurants, from fast food to some of the top French restaurants in the country. Hotel Reservations

Hotel reservation cards will go out in Progress Report *3. New members joining after P.R. *3 is published will receive their cards with their membership acknowledgements. The Hyatt has promised 1900 rooms, but they will go quickly, so reserve early. The rates are:
