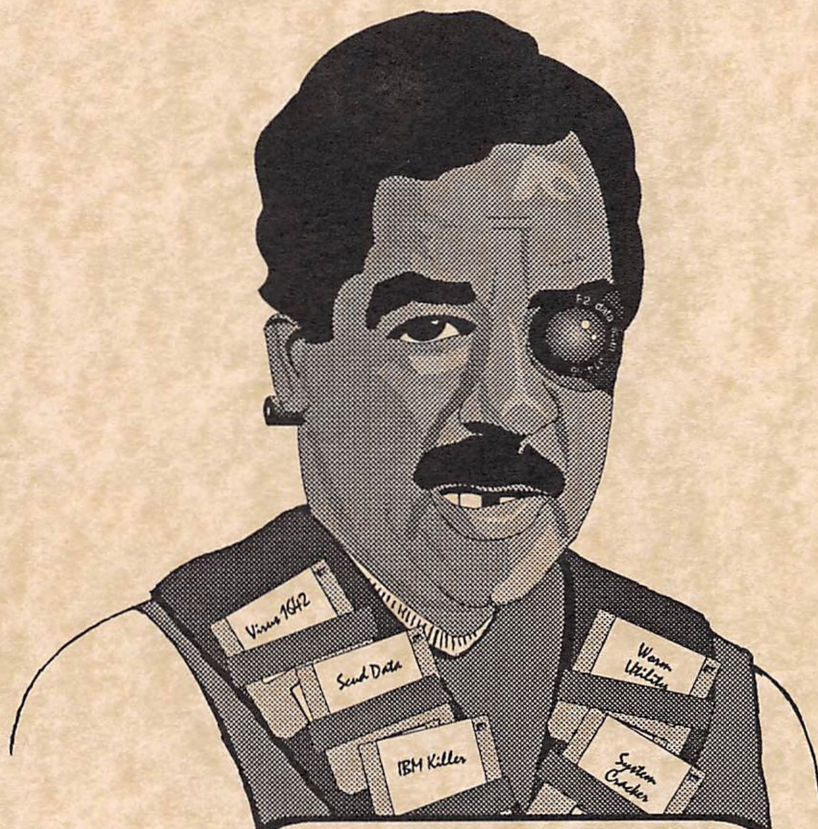

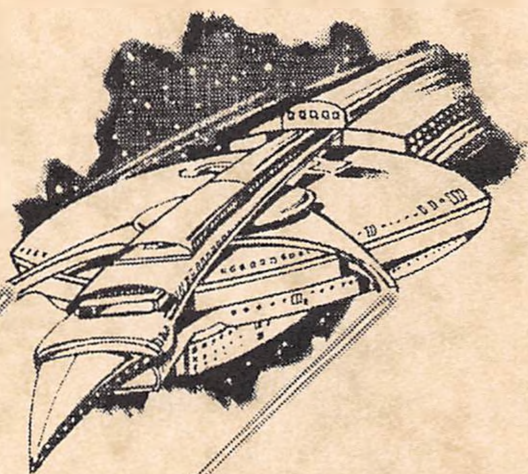

ABOUT OUR DISTINGUISHED GUESTS

LARRY NIVEN is one of the leading authors of hard science fiction in the world today. He is the creator of the justly-famous world of Known Space, which includes some of the most memorable aliens (including Kzinti and Puppeteers) and most carefully constructed space architecture (including the Ringworld itself) ever invented. Niven's skill goes far beyond hard science, though. He has written fantasy, near-future extrapolation, thrillers, humor and philosophical stories, just to name some of his exploits. He has won numerous Hugo and Nebula awards. His name is a regular-enough feature of best-seller lists to make it familiar to publishing-watchers who know almost nothing about science fiction.

Although he writes a great deal on his own, he also writes frequently in collaboration. His best known collaborator is Jerry Pournelle, but he has also written novels with Steve Barnes and with Michael Flynn, thus giving lesser-known writers a leg up in their careers. Recently, he has opened up Known Space for the work of selected fellow authors, creating the very popular Man-Kzin Wars series.

Mr. Niven has also been a long-time science fiction fan. He is a familiar face at Westercons and Worldcons, among other conventions, as well as an active member and attendee of the Los Angeles Science Fantasy Society. His tens of thousands of fans all know why he's a good choice for a Worldcon honored guest ... if you had to read this description of him, now is the time to go buy one of his books. Next week, you'll buy the rest.



For well over twenty years, ALICIA AUSTIN has been one of the most highly-skilled, and most popular, artists displaying work at science fiction conventions. In those years, she has done a particularly memorable thing: she has managed to maintain a recognizable style (so that you can pick out a painting or an art show panel from yards away as "unmistakable Austin work") and yet she has continued to grow and change and expand her creative horizons.

She has illustrated many childrens' books (including one written by Ursula K. Le Guin), and published prints, cards, stationery, and portfolios. The beautiful volume devoted to her work, *Alicia Austin's Book of Dreams*, was published by

Donald M. Grant. At least one piece of her work, original or print, hangs in almost every fannish home.

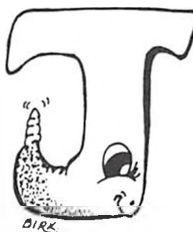
Ms. Austin's subjects tend more towards fantasy than science fiction. She has worked with the styles of several cultures, including some especially notable work relying for inspiration on Turkish, Middle Eastern and American Indian sources. By 1993, she will certainly have branched out into new directions, and will grace ConFrancisco with more art work that is both unmistakably Austin and excitingly original.



It may, perhaps, sound like left-handed praise to describe TOM DIGBY as "the funniest man in Los Angeles." Not in Los Angeles fandom, though ... in Los Angeles. Including all of those TV comedians and Hollywood screenwriters.

If you doubt this description, find a friend with copies of *Apa-L* from the 1970s. Convince that friend to dig the copies out of closet or basement. Flip through all the long-since forgotten gossip and chatter to the old dittoed pages, purple ink on yellow paper, entitled "Probably Something, but not ..." Just read the words that follow "not" (which are different for every issue of the *apazine*). But don't razorblade the Digby zines out and then return the apas. It's not nice.

If it's easier, buy a copy of *N-Space* or *Convergent Series* by Larry Niven, and read "What Can You Say About Chocolate-Covered Manhole Covers?" The hero is Tom Digby, not-too-thinly disguised. Could you pass up the chance to have such a character as your fan guest of honor? ConFrancisco couldn't.



TAN HOWARD FINDER has been a fixture of U.S. and Australian fandom for many years. Whether he is promoting relations across the Pacific, giving backrubs, or appearing in a masquerade as the Jedi wimp, jan (or "wombat") is known far and wide through fandom as a mover and shaker, a person who gets things done, and a regular convention party animal.

His many accomplishments and his unflagging dedication to fannish life and fannish causes earn him a place in the roster of ConFrancisco guests.



OUR GUESTS (continued)



GUY GAVRIEL KAY is one of the finest rising fantasists in the Western Hemisphere. He came onto the scene with *The Fionavar Tapestry*, fantasy that is truly in the style of Tolkien without being derivative or plagiaristic. His most recent work is *Tigana*, a grand-scale fantasy which begins a new series.

Mr. Kay is one of the most popular toastmasters in Canadian fandom - ConFrancisco will provide a chance for the U.S. to sample his raconteurial style.

DEALERS' ROOM

The ConFrancisco Dealers' Room will feature at least 200 tables, with dealers limited to a maximum of three tables. Memberships are to be purchased separately. While the lay-out of the hall and the prices of the tables have not yet been finalized, we expect this information to be available no later than April 1992.

We are currently accepting deposits from those with serious interest in purchasing Dealers' Tables. A refundable \$50 deposit, which may be applied to the total cost of the tables at the time of purchase, will guarantee the dealer an opportunity to purchase tables when a firm price has been established.

HOTEL STUFF



here are three items of import to tell. First of all, on the slight chance that it's not mentioned elsewhere, we are in negotiations with the Hotel Nikko to add it to our list of flagship hotels, along with the Parc Fifty Five and the Le Meridien. The Nikko will provide additional hotel rooms and function space for nighttime activities. This hotel is located on Mason Street, across the street from both the Parc and the San Francisco Hilton (with another major room block).

Second of all, one of our other hotels, Le Meridien, will be changing its name to the ANA Hotel San Francisco on January 1, 1992. This is not a change of ownership. ANA Enterprises -- a subsidiary of All Nippon Airways -- has owned this property since September 1988. There should be no significant change in staff or management, and our existing contracts and negotiations will continue as before. The ANA Hotel will also be launching a renovation program for all of its guest rooms and function space for the greater comfort of its patrons. Along with new carpeting, draperies and similar amenities, guest rooms will be outfitted with such features as separate telephone lines for computer modems and voice mail. This renovation project is to be completed by January 1993.

Third, but not least, construction on the Moscone Convention Center proceeds on schedule. The Esplanade Ballroom, planned home for the Hugos, Masquerade and other extravaganzas, has already been opened to the public. The Moscone's underground expansion area recently had its roof installed, and construction of the facility is now 71% complete. The scheduled opening for this new space is in May 1992.

Checks for ad placement should be made out to ConFrancisco and must accompany the ad unless prior billing arrangements are made.

"Fan Rate" is intended to support and encourage fan clubs, conventions and other fan activities. Any ad submitted under this rate must be from such an organization and must be promoting or offering information about itself and/or its activities.

Membership rates, information and/or fund raising activities can be promoted in the ad.

"Pro Rate" applies to ads from all other individuals, businesses and organizations. This includes the big publishers and the little comic book stores as well as fans selling off their personal collections. 

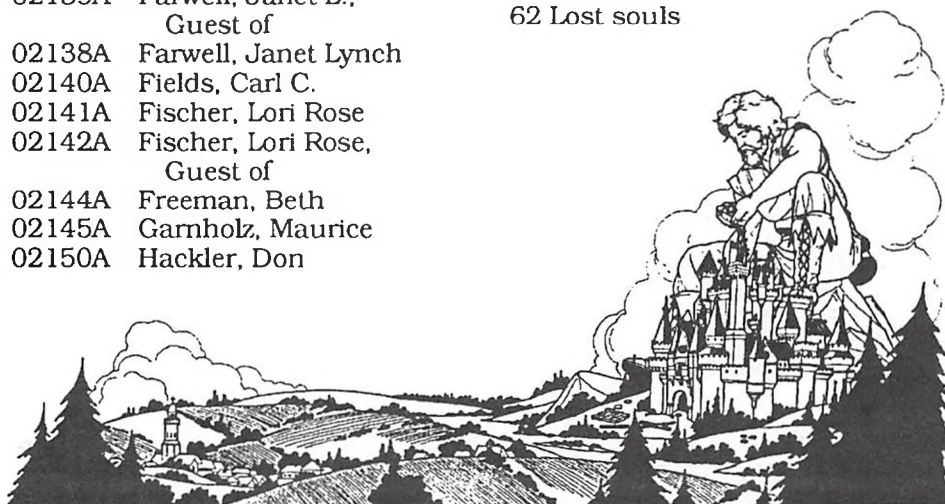

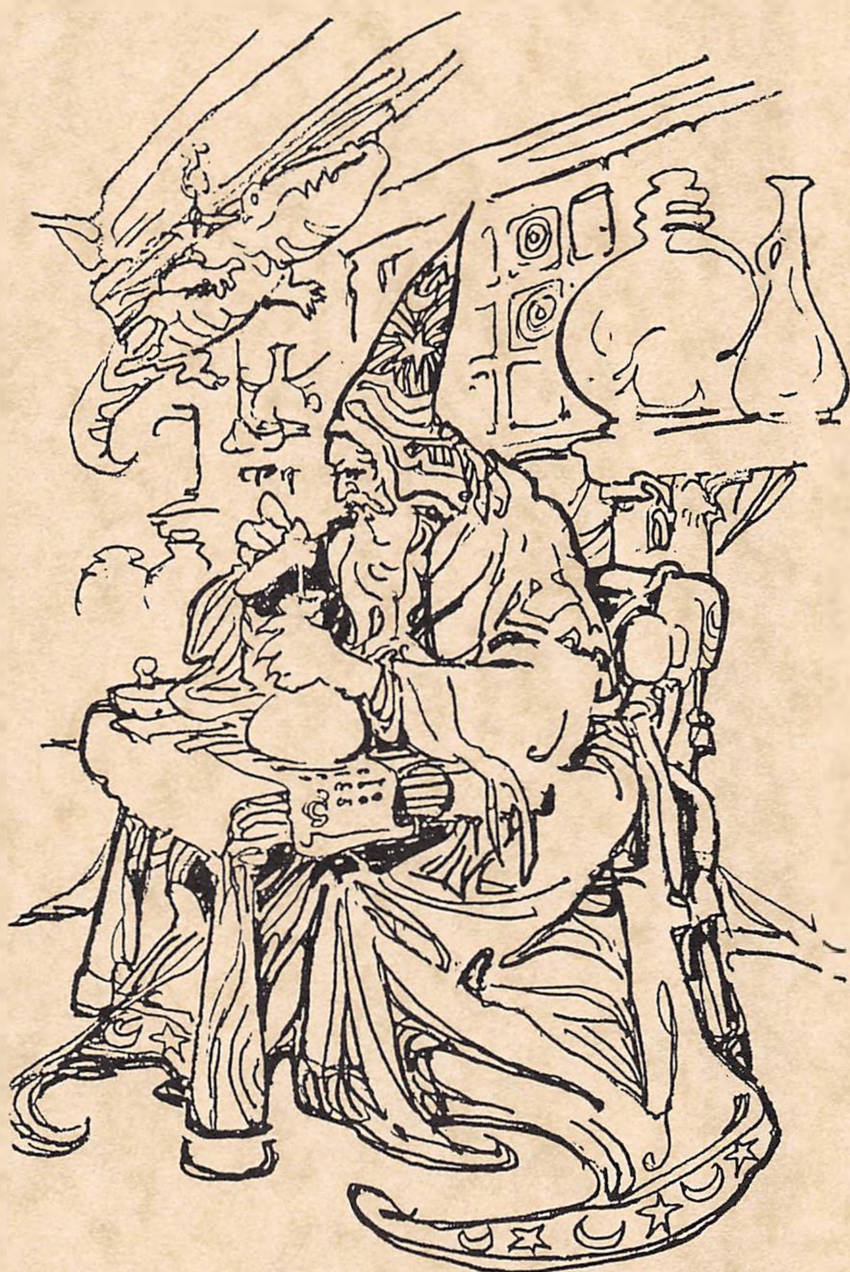
