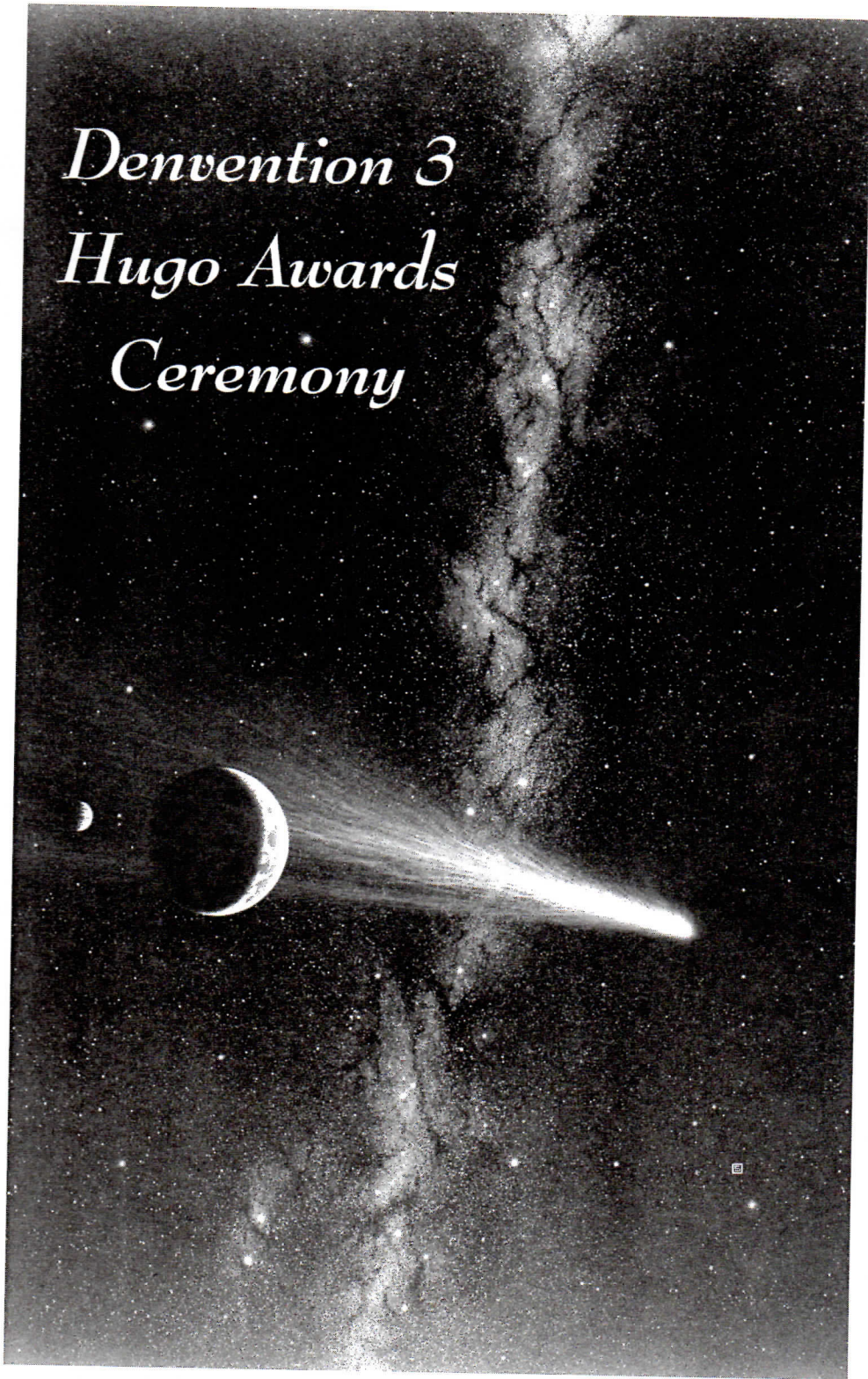

Hugo Awards

The Science Fiction Achievement Award, also known as the Hugo Award®, is given annually by World Science Fiction Society® (WSFS®). Worldcon members have awarded Hugos every year since 1953 except for 1954. For more information about the Hugo Awards, see <http://www.thehugoawards.org/>.

John W. Campbell Award for Best New Writer

The John W. Campbell Award is given to the best new science fiction or fantasy writer whose first work of science fiction or fantasy was published in a professional publication in the previous two years. Forrest J Ackerman Big Heart Award

The Big Heart Award was created by two prominent fans, Forrest J Ackerman and Walter Daugherty. They did so in the name of that era's special fan and pro E. Everett Evans who, in passing, personified the remarkable spirit of science fiction fandom. There are some special fans who are known for their selfless deeds—each one of whom has a spirit of big-heartedness, specially singled out once a year for The Big Heart Award. In 2006, this award was renamed in honor of one its founders, Forrest J Ackerman.
