Where in DC?

The Marriott Wardman Park has enough function space for a full Worldcon Program, Main Events, Dealers Room, Art Show, and all the exhibits that make Worldcon special, plus a block of 1,100 sleeping rooms at \$165/night single – quad (includes over 100 suites). It has great social spaces — soft seating in every corner to talk with friends. When night falls you can visit one of the Marriott's bars or restaurants or hop in an elevator to one of the party suites or your own room. Additional arrangements will be made with other nearby hotels as needed.

The Marriott Wardman Park is surrounded by the best of what a city like Washington, DC can offer. You can walk to a vibrant strip of restaurants and shops along Connecticut Avenue and the nearby Adams Morgan and Dupont Circle neighborhoods. Beyond them are Rock Creek National Park and the Smithsonian National Zoo. Just across Calvert Street is the 832-room Omni Shoreham hotel. The Woodley Park-Zoo/Adams Morgan Metro Station is on the corner, which you can use to travel to many more restaurants, shops, historical sites, the National Mall, and Smithsonian museums.

Getting Here

Three major airports (DCA, IAD, and BWI) serve the city, with 45 airlines flying to 166 airports in 40 countries. Or, if you prefer to travel by land, Union Station serves as a hub on Amtrak's network, Interstate 95 runs the length of the U.S. East Coast, and bus lines serve DC. Plus, commuter rail lines from Maryland and Virginia connect to the WMATA Metro transportation system. The Metrorail Silver Line Dulles Airport station is scheduled to open by the end of 2020.

Getting around DC is just as easy, thanks to the accessible Metro rail and bus system, Circulator buses, cabs, and Capital Bikeshare service — all of which have stops outside our proposed hotel.


Worldcon Site Selection

The site of the 2021 Worldcon will be decided by members of the 2019 Worldcon. Voting will start in the spring of 2019. Here's how it works:

- 1. Become a supporting or attending member of the 2019 Worldcon;
 - 2. Pay the Advance Supporting Membership Fee;
- 3. Fill out your ballot and send it in. Voting is preferential, so vote for all sites in order of your preference with DC in 2021 in the #1 position;

You are automatically a Supporting member of the winning Worldcon bid and may nominate and vote for the Hugo Awards and vote for the 2023 Worldcon site. You will also have an opportunity to upgrade to an Attending membership at the lowest rate and attend the 79th Worldcon in 2021!





What is DC in 2021?

Washington, DC fandom has played host to many science fiction and fantasy conventions, including Disclave, Capclave, and two Worldcons — Discon I (1963) and Discon II (1974). A new generation of DC area fans are bidding to bring the World Science Fiction Convention (Worldcon) to DC for a third time in August 2021 at the Marriott Wardman Park in the Woodley Park neighborhood of Northwest Washington.


