Lake Tahoe, the most beautiful alpine lake in the world, is just around the corner. Well, a forty mile corner. Probably the best thing about Reno is the natural beauty that's all around you. There's world class fishing in the area near the convention hotels & if you enjoy floating on water, the Truckee river is a wonderful way to spend an afternoon... as long as you've got sunscreen.

If you're looking for something cultural to do, you need look no further than Reno's fantastic museums. One of the best museums you'll ever find is the National Automobile Museum. It lets you get up close & personal with cars ranging from the 1890s to modern racers. Explore everything from T'ang Dynasty pottery to Nevada ranch life at The Wilbur D. May Center in Rancho San Rafael Regional Park. The Nevada Museum of Art, also located in Reno, features a collection including works by Stuart Davis, Robert Motherwell & Robert Rauschenberg. There are others, like the Reno Discovery Museum & the Reno County Museum.

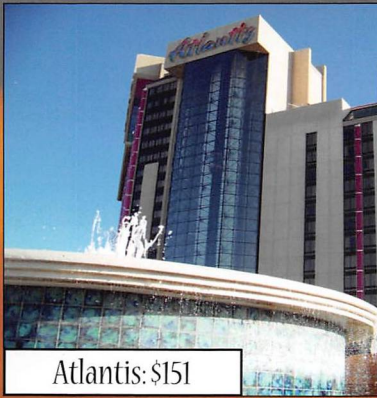
