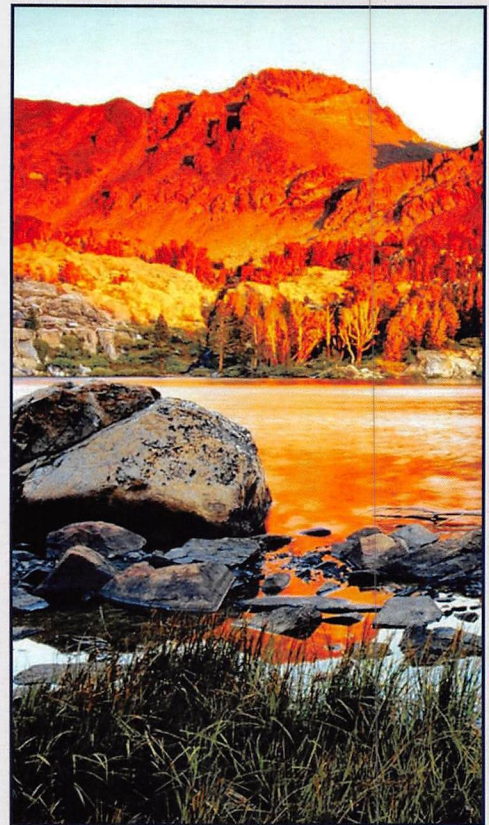
Join us in the Heart of the West ...

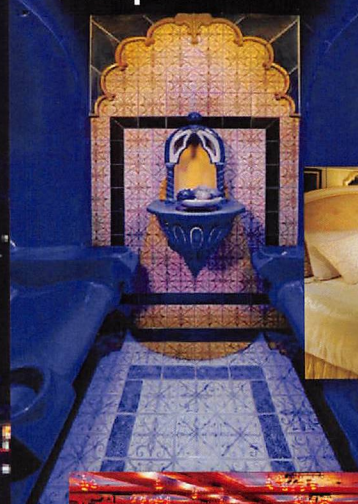


...and stay in Fannish Heaven.

Our main hotels in Reno are the Atlantis (www.atlantiscasino.com), which is directly connected to the Convention Center and will also be the party hotel, and the Peppermill (www.peppermillreno.com), which will host the Masquerade and Hugo Awards Ceremony. These are truly luxury resorts, with multiple swimming pools, spas and 20 restaurants between them – including 24 hour full service options at both locations. We also have a limited number of rooms at the Courtyard by Marriott - not a resort, but a comfortable, non-smoking environment with a very reasonable price tag.

All three of our hotels offer free parking and free personal Internet access. We will be opening hotel bookings in January 2011 – look out for full details in Progress Report 3.

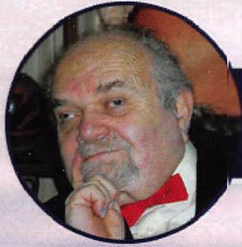

Ellen Asher's 34-year career as editor-in-chief of the Science Fiction Book Club earned her a World Fantasy Award for Life Achievement in 2009.



Charles N. Brown (1937-2009) was involved in the science fiction field from the late 1940s & was best known as the Publisher & Editor-in-Chief of 29-time Hugo winner Locus magazine which he founded in 1968.

Tim Powers has been writing since the early 1970s, using his love of history to imbue his fiction with a strong sense of time, place and the fantastic. His novels include *The Anubis Gates*, *On Stranger Tides* and *Declare*.



Boris Vallejo has been one of the field's leading artists for over 30 years. His mastery of oil painting is immediately clear to anyone who looks at his work, and his classic sense is as much homage to the old masters as it is to anyone working in the Fantasy genre.

Bill Willingham (Special Guest) is one of the most respected graphic novelists working today. He first gained attention with *Elementals* (1980s). He is however best known for the award-winning *Fables*, a unique series imagining that all of your favorite nursery rhyme, storybook and fable characters are real and living in New York City.



Tricky Pixie (Special Guests) are unique entertainers whose performances may call forth ships full of pirates, dancing satyrs, gypsies in the wood, and all the benefits of a good Beltane fire, rounding out the night with a spicy alligator tango.
