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1. AMENDMENT DEPT.: Move to amend the FAPA Constitution by adding the following to both section 6.13 ("The Secretary-Treasurer) and section 6.14 (The Official Editor):

"He shall have his address of residence and his phone number published in the FANTASY AMATEUR each quarter."

The idea, of course, is to provide emergency access to the two Functional Officers (the one with the money and records, and the one with the mailings), which is not available when these officers live in P.O. Boxes, as does the late OE. Those running for the Functional Offices should do so in the knowledge they are open to Blitz if they malfunction, and that there will almost always be some member who needs to get either dues or a zine to them at an eleventh hour (and 59th minute). Special Delivery packages and telegrams to P.O. Boxes are very ineffective.

2. MILD COMPLAINT DEPT.: The FAN BIRTHDAY CALENDAR in the "February" mailing was to have gone into the May mailing. It even says that. I deliberately sent it to the OE a week after the deadline so that it would go in the May Mailing, but the lateness of the mailing overtook the smaller lateness of the submission. This particular time there is no problem, as my deadline is the May mailing, but if the deadline was the February mailing, and I was trying to set up credentials for the following membership year, I would be complaining much more loudly. One more reason for promptness in mailings -- and possibly for pre-reading zines by the OE? Well... .

3. STUPID IDEAS DEPT.: Just in case there is anyone in FAPA insane enough to be interested -- the announcement has been made through a few other APAs, and is being made generally -- I am attempting to set up an annual APA at the Worldcon. Name as yet undecided (I tend towards either Fanzine Editors of Worldcon or Worldcon Organization Of Faneditors), it will be assembled Friday night, under the auspices of the Society of Fanzine Writers, Artists & Editors. Contributions to be brought to the con by the editors and/or their agents, and copies of the Distribution/Mailing to be circulated via agents to non-attendees. (This way, no dues.) 300 copies to be provided for this first one, no limit on number of pages. I'll act as Official Collator for the first one, and see who I can stick with the next. I'll also act as agent for zines from non-attendees living in the LArea.

I suspect this idea will fall upon barren ground here in the Elephants' Graveyard of Tired Old Fans, but, as I said, it is made Just In Case... .

4. PLUGOLA DEPT.: Those of you who are members of Big MAC might consider voting for the 1978 Worldcon site on the basis of an Experienced Committee and a 1-Hotel convention -- both of which the Los Angeles bid has. You might also consider that the LA Bid Committee includes a fairly large number of FAPAns: Moffatts (Chair); Stevens (Program, Vice Chair); Pelz (Treasurer); Glycer (Publications). Your vote is hereby solicited... .
