Nothing much happening around here at the moment except covention planning which I will mention more fully later on. Bert Chandler dropped in to see us recently at the club. He told us he has three books on the way from ACE. Jack Vance was in contact with Bert when he was recently in Sydney. His visit was disrupted unfortunately by the illness of his wife and I believe his daughter and they were unable to make it to Melbourne. Incidently we are endeavouring to induce some over seas authors to attend the Convention but nothing definite yet. Bert we hope will be here but it depends where his ship is at the time and whether he can get away.

The science fiction movie situation has been pretty grim. The only thing worth seeing and that purely for the spectacular effects was CRACK IN THE WORLD. Worth seeing but dont expect too much.

As yet we have not seen Day of the Triffids in Melbourne . I would be interested to know if it has been shown in any other states.

By now I think the World Conwention in London will be well over but as yet I have recieved no reports on it. The main thing of interest to us will be what has won the Hugo for this year. It will be interesting to see if the fact that the Covention is being held in London has any effect on the voting.

Definite plans for the Melcon next Easter are not yet decided upon but you will recieve full reports when available. We have close on 50 members now but most are from interstate, country and over overseas. What about it you Melbournians? Dont leadwe it till the last minute, join now!

It would appear that DENNIS DOBSON Publishers are slowly taking over from Gollance as the top SF publisher . They have quite an impressive list for the nest few months . The Carnell anthologies NEW WRITINS in SF are now out to number 5 and 6 and 7 have been announced. A complete list will be found of all the titles from Dobson . Gollance, Faber and Jenkins in the McGills list on page three.

The British publishers have realised the great popularity of Robert Heinlein. From Four Square paperbacks we have had STRANGER in AsTRANGE LAND and GLORY ROAD the last two months. Also from Panther we have had ORPHANS of the Sky and from Dobsons is coming soon FARNHAM'S FREEHOLD. Glory Road is without a doubt the best since Starship Troopers. Straiger freated quite a lot of argument but Farnhams Freehold would be one of the worst novels he has written. Not that it is not better than the average of books being written now but it is not up to Heinleins own standards.

Far and above all the novels published this year is
The Prophet of Dune which to date has not arrived in book form , being
published in two separate serials in Analog.

A full list of all the new books due out over the next few months from most of the British publishers will be included in the McGills list. The outstanding title though is the non-fiction BEYOND THE SOLAR SYSTEM by Willey Ley and Chesley Bonestell. This time the team have gone a little further than their previous flights Conquest of Space, Accross the Space Frontier etcetera and Bomstell has given vivid pictormal representation of Ley's descriptions of habitable and non-habitable planets of far away suns. It is due for publication in England in October. Cost approximately 52/6.
