WHATS NEW!

The latest announcement from Digit pocket book publishers is E.E. Smith's THE SKYLARK OF SPACE. Dont ask me why but I think this will be very popular. From Corgi in August comes HIGH VACUUM by Maine and in October PILGRIMAGE TO EARTH by Robert Sheckley both probably 3/9. Due in this month from Panther is John Taine's SEEDS of LIFE and in August Alfred Bester's DEMOLISHED MAN. Another two titles of interest from UK are The RED PLANET by Charles Chiltern in Pan and from Panther THE MOUSE THAT ROARED by Leonard Wibberly.

Though I have nothing to add to the list of US or British hard covers mentioned in the last Newsletter, a few of those mentioned have now come to hand. A CASE OF CONSCIENCE by James Blish is the pick of the new arrivals. It was originally published as a novelet in IF magazine and ended where the main character the Jesuit, Father Ruiz Sanchez was leaving the alien planet after being given a present by one of the natives. The last third of the book deals with the complications the present presents when he gets it back to Earth. COUNTDOWN by the 'present' presents when he gets it back to Earth. COUNTDOWN by Charles Eric Maine is another of his quite readable stories and a little better than his previous title THE TIDE WENT OUT, but still lacking a little something which the top authors -in my own opinion- have.

Though perhaps not an original theme G.M.Glaskin's A CHANGE of MIND was a pleasent surprise. This author I belive lives in Perth West Australia .He has had two previous novels published but neither of these have been fantasy. Briefly the story deals with the change of personality or what have you, of two men and the complications it presents . It is a serious story, not humorous as Thorne Smith's TURNABOUT and really makes you wonder how you would react in a similar predicament.

More fuller reviews will appear of the above titles and NEXT of KIN by E.F.Russell, The SEED by Edmund Cooper and all the pocket books in an issue of ETHERLINE which we hope to produce about the end of August.

For those who like a little 'mysticism' in their reading dont forget the sequel to The THIRD EYE , DOCTOR FROM LHASA. ... How did that get in there? Its better than SF almost.

Though there have been a number of SF films on in Melbourne lately, I have been unable to catch up with them. They include X the UNKOWN (M.G.M. release?) The GIANT CLAW, MONSTER on the CAMPUS and the MONOLITH MONSTERS. I gathered from friends that I did not miss much. A film with a slight fantasy flavour, which I recommend to one and all, is BELL, BOOK and CANDLE which is about modern day witchs and warlocks. One of the best scenes in the film is whem HERMIONE GINGOLD is mixing JAMES STEWART a potion to break the spell which has been put on him by another witch KIM NOVAK. The film also stars JACK LEMMON the warlock who loves distinguishing the street lights merely with a gesture Though there have been a number of SF films on in Melbourne ELSA LANCHESTER another witch and . ERNIE KOVACS the writer who thought he knew a lot about witchs.

As usual quite a lot of films are being or are about to be made . Some of these include; The MYSTERIANS (an MGM release), NO BLADE of GRASS and the MIDWICH CUCKOOS (produced by MGM), The HFE of JULES VERNE, The DEMOLISHED MAN (was purchased by John Fayne for production next year), HAVE ROCKET -WILL TRAVEL (Starring the Three Stooges), and THE BLOB which is produced by Jack Harris who is working on another called The FOURTH DIMENSION MAN. Probably the most outstanding one is JOURNEY to the CENTRE of the EARTH, which I believe is starring Pat Boone and James Mason at 20th Century Fox. 
