# **Gunny Watch**

Karen Pender-Gunn and Ian Gunn wrote "The reason you have not heard from us for a while was a vast invasion of my family. Firstly, my sister and her fiance (my sister is pregnant so the Pender clan will continue) then my father and stepmother (a very unusual women). Dad picked Ian up from hospital as he has had 4 units of blood overnight, it was their first meeting ever and went well. When my father left my mother arrived and had some time with my sister. Then my sister went home to Airlie Beach in Queensland and my mother stayed till last night. She made us new coach covers, did all our ironing and made new curtains for the bathroom, got the stove fixed, helped me mow the lawns, and generally was all round great and spent lots of money on us.

Ian had chemotherapy on Friday though the day surgery. He has mostly slept since then and has not eaten solid food yet but we are keeping a sharp eye on the kidney functioning as we don't want a repeat of what happened after the last chemo. He is back on the pump again. We have had two nights of the Living with Cancer course being run through the hospital and there are many more people worse off than Ian (including some in fandom) who are also fighting to give themselves the best of life."

Karen continues with a following weekend:

"Thursday: Ian went in to have the dressing on the Hickman's catheter checked and have a blood test. Blood test came back saying kidney function down again and his Worfrin level (the drug he takes to thin the blood so the catheter doesn't clog) was sky high. So into hospital over night.

Friday: Ian in hospital, was given platelets and plasma. He had his first reaction with platelet transfusion which was the shakes something fierce, so they gave his pethadine and off he went to sleep. I came home and managed to fall in the driveway on one of the stupid nut things that fall from the tree out there and damaged my knee. Friday night they let Ian come home as he had something to do.

Saturday: back into the hospital again, another blood test and waiting around till doctors and such. Ian came home Saturday night.

Sunday: Back to the hospital again. Blood test again. He had another infusion of platelets, this time with a pre-med, still had a reaction so pethadine again and out he went like a light. I went grocery shopping - never again will I shop on a Sunday.

Sunday night: Ian was allowed home again. He washed the cat food tins and put out the recycling. My sister rang from Queensland. There was this cry from outside and Ian comes in with a bleeding face. He had fallen out the front of the house (in almost the same place I fell on Friday). Laid him down, bathed his face. He has grazes on his chin, under his nose, on the bridge of the nose and forehead. Rang the hospital as he had only just come out. Yes please, they said, please come back for us to check you out. Back to the emergency department. He was fine but it was midnight before we got back home. No hot water due to the troubles with the gas in Victoria. Went to bed.

Monday: Back to the hospital for a blood test. Hay hoo! After only 3 hours we could come home. Back home, sleep the nap of the just.

So, friends, you can say that life is not unexciting for the Gunn's."

Details are now available on the dealers room for the convention

Applications and the reservation of tables for the Aussiecon Three Dealers' Room are now available. All dealers must have an attending membership for Aussiecon Three before an application will be considered for acceptance. Aussiecon Three reserves the right to reject any dealers' room application it deems inappropriate to the purposes of the World Science Fiction Convention and its governing body, the World Science Fiction Society.

The Aussiecon Three Dealers' Room will be situated in either of the Bellarine 6 or Bellarine 7 rooms of the Melbourne Convention Centre. The eventual choice of room depends on the number of bookings for the Dealers' Room.

The size of each table is 2100mm x 750mm (82.5" x 29.5"). Each table will be supplied with two chairs. Each dealer may book up to five tables. If bookings outweigh the available space, dealers who book four or five tables may have the number of their tables reduced to three or four tables. Aussiecon Three will endeavour to make space available for all reservations so that the diversity of offerings to members is as large as possible. A waiting list will be put in place only if absolutely necessary. If you book three or more tables, this entitles the dealer to one "staff" membership to assist on the tables. This membership entitles the holder access to only the dealers' room. Provisions will be made for access to meal and bathroom areas.

A \$A50.00 per table deposit, to a maximum of five tables, is due upon booking. The anticipated final price is \$A100.00 per table.
